
Student Focus Groups

Semi-structured interviews about tutor experience of small group teaching


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Practitioner Co-interpretation

Researchers as brokers

Embedded researchers can act as brokers between specific disciplines, educational researchers and information technologists



Practitioner interviews

- All tutors given personal attention
- Given opportunity to explain their experiences
- Interview situation enables further questioning on interesting issues

Departmental seminars

- The whole department is given an overview of research aims, methods, and findings
- New resources can be advertised
- All departmental members have opportunity to ask questions

Key issues workshop

- Evidence base summarised to a number of key issues
- Solutions to these issues discussed and recorded
- Workshop followed up with summary of discussion and future research plans


