

Academy Scotland travel fund for academic staff: call for applications

How to apply

This new initiative, launched by Academy Scotland, is aimed at encouraging the exchange and dissemination of good practices, at the discipline level, throughout the UK. It is specifically aimed at enabling academic staff in Scottish HEIs to engage with colleagues from other parts of the UK and to support their institution's priorities and developments in learning and teaching. The initiative supports the following strategic aims of the Higher Education Academy¹:

- Identify, develop and disseminate evidence-informed approaches
- Broker and encourage the sharing of effective practice
- Support universities and colleges in bringing about strategic change
- Raise the status of teaching.

The funding may be used to help colleagues attend Higher Education Academy (including Subject Centres) conferences, network meetings and special interest groups that are being run outwith Scotland. We are currently inviting applications from academic staff in Scotland's 20 HEIs and will fund up to 25 bursaries in each of two rounds during academic year 2008-09. The maximum value of each bursary will be £300.

Colleagues are invited to submit an application using the proforma provided. Please note that successful recipients of the bursaries will be asked to provide a short account of how they used the funds and the impact that it had in terms of helping to facilitate change within their institution. This account should be written within three months of using the bursary. Accounts may be published on the Academy's website or in a newsletter, with the permission of the recipient.

Please note that all applications must be approved by your Head of Department (or equivalent).

Applicants will be informed of the outcome of their application within two weeks of the closing date i.e. mid December and mid March for rounds 1 and 2, respectively.

Deadlines

For round 1, Friday 28th November. For round 2, Friday 27th February.

4. Notes

- 4.1 Proposers must work in a Scottish HE institution in an academic department on either a full time or part-time basis.
- 4.2 Proposals will be circulated to evaluators for review.
- 4.3 Final decisions on proposals to be funded will be made by the Academy Scotland team.
- 4.4 Late applications for round 1 will be eligible for consideration in round 2, assuming the event for which funding is being requested takes place after 27th February (see 4.7 below).
- 4.5 Unsuccessful round 1 applicants cannot re-submit the same bid for round 2 but may submit a new bid for round 2.
- 4.6 It is not possible to apply for retrospective funding i.e. events held before the closing date for applications.
- 4.7 Accounts may be published on the Academy's website or in a newsletter, with the permission of the recipient.
