The Centre for Bioscience is pleased to offer you the chance to submit your opinions and experiences in a media competition

The winning individual or group will receive a prize of £250 and runners-up a prize of £50, the winning, runner-up and shortlisted entries will be published on the Centre for Bioscience's website.

The competition is open to all UK higher education students (both undergraduate and postgraduate) in a pure or applied biological science. Entries are limited to one per student / group and must be the original work of the student(s).

Rules of the Competition

Submissions for the competition:

- can only be submitted by UK higher education students studying a pure or applied bioscience subject
- must address the competition title
- should be entertaining and informative
- should be of use to bioscience teaching staff and potential bioscience students
- should be an original piece of work
- must not use offensive language or images
- must be sensitive to personal, cultural and institutional contexts. For example, presentations should not expose, ridicule or embarrass particular individuals or openly criticise an individual department
- must be able to be viewed online
- must be accompanied by a short description
- can be submitted to no more than one Subject Centre
- must conform to basic standards of presentation, i.e. what is seen and / or heard is: intended to be seen and/or heard and, can be seen and/or heard

You must also ensure:

- If you are making a film, you have obtained the consent of all identifiable people within the film and that they have waived their rights to the film
- You have obtained copyright clearance for any third party material (for example music) used in your submission
- Copies of any clearance or waivers obtained for copyright material will be available on request to the Centre for Bioscience
- You have read and signed the copyright declaration form and a copy is sent with your submission

By submitting an entry you agree to it being published by the Centre for Bioscience in various electronic and hardcopy formats. All boxes on this application form must be completed.
