


What Is A Rescue Animal?


- ▶ *Stray animals*

- ▶ *A special friend in need of a special home*




Why are Animals Abandoned?

- ▶ Poor or deteriorating health.
 - ▶ Maintenance expenses
 - Veterinary Bills
 - Food
 - ▶ Change in lifestyle
 - ▶ Behavioral problems
 - ▶ Moving to a new location

- Built first shelter

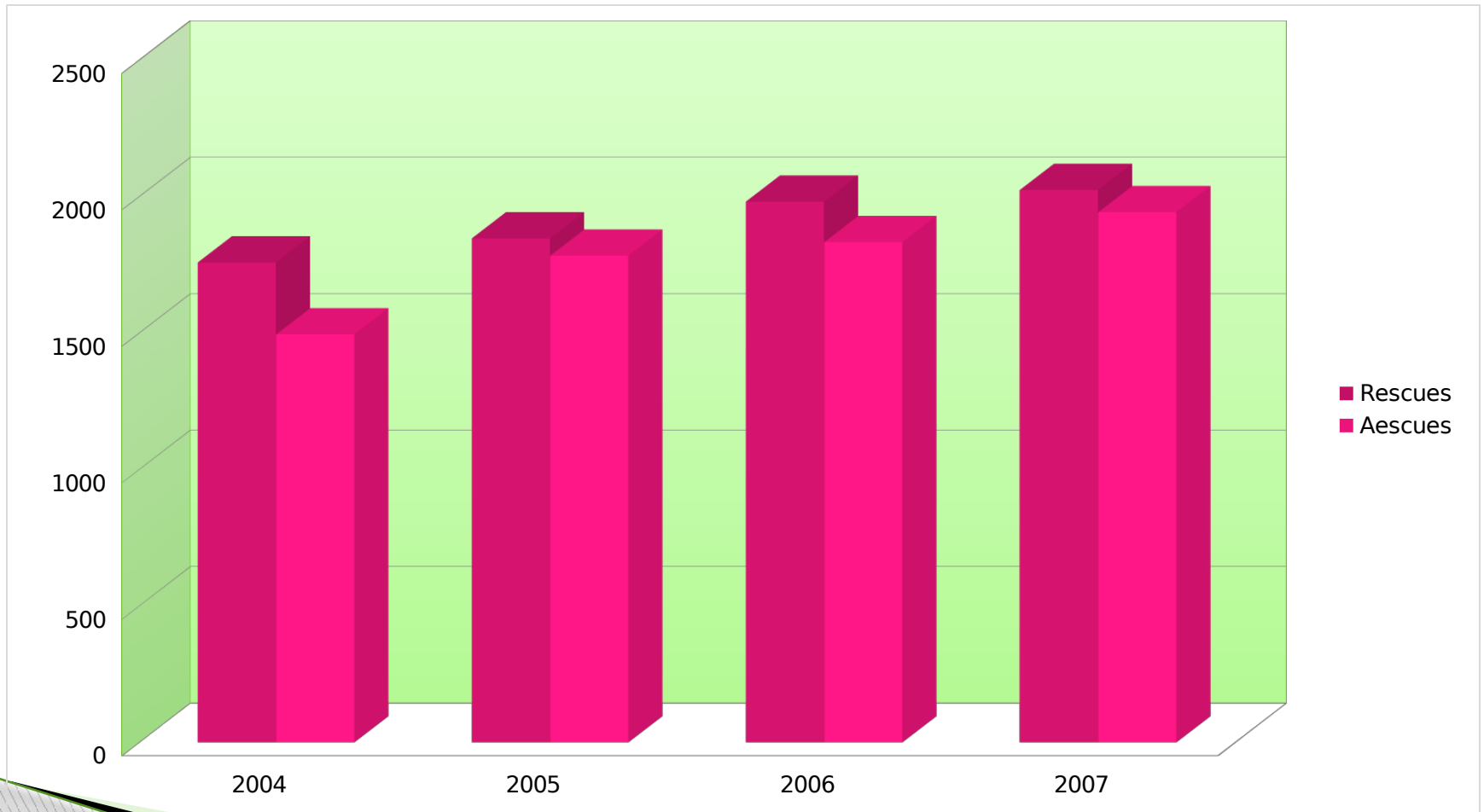
1992

- Began volunteer program

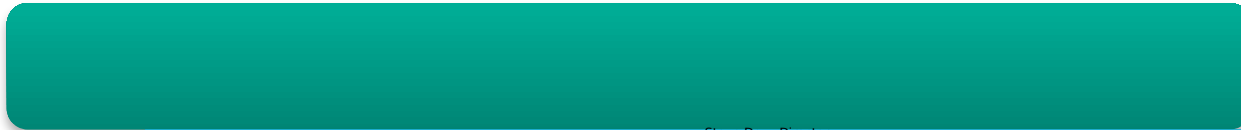
2000




Who are Animal Angels?

- ▶ *An all volunteer group*
- ▶ *Three ways to help*
 - Provide In-shelter support
 - Work as Adoption Angels
 - Serve as Foster Angels


In-shelter support

- ▶ *Evaluate incoming animals*
 - ▶ *Assist veterinarian*
 - ▶ *Interview potential adopters*
 - ▶ *Follow up on adoptions*


Adoption Angels

- ▶ Transport animals to adoption fairs
 - ▶ Provide Information at adoption fairs
 - Foundation Services
 - Adoption Fees
 - ▶ Interview potential parents
 - ▶ Follow up on adoptions
- 


Foundation Services

- ▶ *All animals are fully evaluated by a veterinarian*
 - ▶ *Animals are spayed or neutered before adoption*
 - ▶ *The animal's temperament is evaluated for needs*
 - ▶ *Experienced people are available for guidance after adoption*


Adoption Fees

- ▶ *Dogs \$75*
 - ▶ *Cats \$50*
 - ▶ *Guinea pigs \$10*
 - ▶ *Rabbits \$25*
 - ▶ *Ferrets \$60*
 - ▶ *All other animals call 555-1313 for rate*
- 

Foster Angels

- ▶ Provide a temporary home
 - What to expect
 - ▶ Evaluate special needs
 - Housebreaking
 - Obedience training
 - Socialization
 - ▶ Bring animal to adoption fairs
- 

What Should I Expect?

- ▶ *To be patient because the animal may not be housebroken or trained*
 - ▶ *To give them a lot of love*
 - ▶ *To get a lot of love in return*
