Although the San Francisco 49ers have won more Super Bowls than any other team (5), this record only goes back to when we started call them Super Bowls. The Green Bay Packers have won eleven league championships including Super Bowls I & II.

Version Numbering

Each version number contains the number of the most recent Super Bowl added to the file. For example, version 29.1 includes all Super Bowls up to and including Super Bowl XXIX.

If I make any corrections/additions before the next Super Bowl, the versions will be 29.2, 29.3, etc. And then of course the next time I add a Super Bowl will be version 30.1.

Helpful Hints

The Windows Help search utility allows you to easily answer questions like "How many Super Bowls have been played in Miami?" or "In which Super Bowls was Bart Starr named the MVP?"

To invoke the search utility, simply click on "Search" above and follow the instructions.

To Add Your Own Notes

Select "Annotate..." from the "Edit" menu, enter your notes, then click on "Save". This will add a small paper clip to the upper left corner of the topic. You can then click on the paper clip to see your notes.
