

**CAROLE ROSEN**

Vice President, Family Programming--Home Box Office

Carole Rosen was named vice president, family programming for Home Box Office in March 1993. She is responsible for developing original family programs for HBO.

From 1988 to 1993, Rosen served as director, family programming. In this position, she played an active role in the production of many of HBO's award winning programs, including: the critically acclaimed "Lifestories" series, "Shakespeare: The Animated Tales," "Babar," and "Cirque du Soleil." Her contributions have earned HBO numerous awards, including four Emmys and nine CableAces.

Rosen joined HBO in 1985 as assistant manager, family programming, responsible for screening and evaluating family acquisitions as well as developing family programming. One year later, she was promoted to manager, family programming.

Prior to HBO, she was a production associate on HBO's "Braingames" series and an associate producer of educational programs for WNET. Earlier, she served as an educational consultant and curriculum advisor for NYC's public and private schools and also served on the NYC Board of Education.

She holds a B.S. degree from Russell Sage college and an M.S. degree in Education from Hunter College.
