There are a lot of changes to OneHand between v1.x versions (of which only v1.0 went into wide release) and v2.0, but most of the changes only involve how it runs and have nothing to do with compatibility of resources or files. The wide release version 1.0 functions in the same way as v2.0 with "Ply First" set and "Default to Top" turned off. Some of the other limited release versions implemented the other ply selection schemes as ways of testing them. There is, however, one compatibility problem: if you want to copy a custom keymap 'nkpm' resource from a previous version to v2.0, you need to make some changes. In the first ply, in the position corresponding to the "enter" key, you will need to substitute a backspace character (hexadecimal 08) in place of the null character that is currently there in the unshifted ply, and a delete character (hexadecimal 7F) in the shifted ply. This is to make sure that the "Ply After" setting works properly. Also, in all three plies, both shifted and unshifted, you may need to modify the keymap in order to get it to work with a Mac+ keypad (although v1.0 didn't work with that keypad). See the documentation and keymap for v2.0 to see where these modifications occur.
