The year 1993 marked the first year of funding for Orange County, the official  
EMA. The

County's Board of Supervisors functions as the Chief Elected Official, and  
delegates responsibility

for disbursing and administering Ryan White funds to the Health Care  
Agency, the County's health

department. The HIV Advisory Committee was established in 1987, and  
became the HIV Planning

Council in 1992. Forty members currently sit on the Council.

Orange County is a large suburban county of 31 cities, covering 786 square  
miles between Los

Angeles and San Diego counties in southern California. Of the 2.5 million  
population, 62 percent

are White/Anglo; 25 percent Hispanic/Latino; 11 percent Asian Pacific  
Islander; 2 percent African

American; and less than 1 percent other ethnic groups.

As of December 1992, a total of 2,306 AIDS cases had been reported among  
Orange County

residents (expected increase in 1993, adjusted for revised reporting  
definition, was 75 percent). The

overall 1992 case rate was 18.2 per 100,000 population. One city, Laguna  
Beach, reported a

higher 1992 case rate (207.8) than was reported for any other U.S. city. The  
rate of infection

among Whites in Orange County is nearly double the U.S. rate. Male cases  
represent nearly 95

percent of all cases and most exposure is among men who have sex with  
men. As of March 31,

1993, it was estimated that 8,800 would be infected with HIV in the Orange  
County service area.

The Fulton County Government administers and disburses Title I Funds to HIV service providers in the Atlanta EMA. The counties of DeKalb and Fulton are the most densely populated in the EMA with a combined population of 1.2 million spanning 805 square miles. According to the 1990 Census, the Fulton County population was 51 percent African American, 46 percent White, and 3 percent Hispanic. The DeKalb County population was 51 percent White, 42 percent African American, and 5 percent Hispanic. Of the 9,366 AIDS cases reported in Georgia through September 1993, 5,936 of the State total were from DeKalb and Fulton counties. An intergovernmental agreement gives the Fulton County's CEO the responsibility for establishing the Metropolitan Atlanta HIV Health Services Planning Council. The planning council's 38 appointed members are diverse, representing community-based primary care providers; mental health and social services; State and local health departments; and individuals from the affected populations. Members are assigned staggered 1- and 2-year terms.

The Baltimore EMA, which became a Ryan White Title I grantee in 1992, includes Baltimore City and the surrounding counties of Anne Arundel, Baltimore, Carroll, Harford, Howard, and Queen Anne's. The Mayor of Baltimore appointed the Baltimore City Health Department to administer the Ryan White Title I grant. The HIV Health Services Planning Council has 33 members appointed by the Mayor, and works through seven standing committees. Any interested member of the public is permitted to participate in the Council's committee activities. AIDS was first reported in Baltimore in 1981. By 1989, it was the leading cause of death in Baltimore for men aged 25-44. During the past 13 years, the epidemic has shifted so that by 1988, and continuing through today, injection drug use is the major risk category for HIV infection. In 1992, 55 percent of all newly reported AIDS cases were among injecting drug users; 22 percent were reported among men who have sex with men. The EMA estimates that since 1990, four injection drug users a day have become infected with HIV. The shift of the epidemic to injection drug users has contributed to increasing prevalence of the disease in women.

By 1989, the seroprevalence rate among men and women was equal (that is, half of people newly diagnosed with HIV are women, and half are men). HIV infection also increased significantly among teenagers, rising to 2.1 percent of all cases in 1987-89.

The Mayor of Paterson is the Chief Elected Official who administers Title I Ryan White CARE Funding through the Department of Human Resources. The HIV Health Planning Council, appointed by the Mayor, was initially convened on November 4, 1993. The 31 council members are representative of the geographic and gender diversity of the EMA, including special populations affected by HIV/AIDS. The Council composition includes members of the two HIV Consortia in the EMA whose respective Directors were subsequently elected

as Chair and Vice  
Chair by the members. The Administrative unit, the Council and its five  
standing committees meet  
monthly. The counties of Passaic and Bergen comprise the EMA, which has a  
diverse population  
including many ethnic and cultural groups. Within the EMA it is estimated  
that: 6,586 people are  
living with HIV/AIDS; 48 percent were infected through injecting drug use, 28  
percent through  
gay/bisexual sex, 13 percent through heterosexual sex, 3 percent through  
blood transfusions, and 2  
percent undetermined. Passaic County ranks third in the State for reported  
AIDS cases and Bergen  
ranks sixth.  
Among women of childbearing age, AIDS-related conditions are the leading  
cause of death for  
African American women and the fifth leading cause for White females. The  
fastest growing  
category of HIV transmission is through heterosexual contact, to the extent  
that women have  
ranked as second in the State of all reported AIDS cases.

The Boston Department of Health and Hospitals (BDHH), on behalf of the Mayor of Boston, is responsible for disbursing funds and administering the Title I grant. The Public Health/AIDS Office at BDHH implements Title I funds, based on the priorities and fund allocations approved by the HIV Health Services Planning Council. The Planning Council was formed in December 1990 as a division of the Boston AIDS Consortium and has 31 members: 35.7 percent of the 28 seats filled are delegated to members who self-identify as HIV positive; and another 37.5 percent represent the EMA's ethnic diversity (19 percent African American, 13 percent Hispanic/Latino, and 3 percent Asian/Pacific Islander). In June 1993, the Boston EMA was redefined to include seven counties in Massachusetts: Bristol, Essex, Middlesex, Norfolk, Plymouth, Suffolk and Worcester. This expansion increased the EMA service area from 25 percent to approximately 60 percent of the State of Massachusetts. Also added were three counties in southern New Hampshire: Hillsborough, Rockingham and Stafford. As a result of this expansion, the overall population of the EMA increased by 23.5 percent, to a total of 5,455,403. A total of 24,247 persons in the EMA are estimated to be HIV positive or diagnosed with AIDS. As of December 1, 1993, 8,092 cumulative AIDS cases were reported to the Massachusetts Department of Public Health AIDS Surveillance Program. AIDS cases in the seven Massachusetts counties of the Boston EMA constitute more than 85 percent of the total AIDS cases in the State. The three southern New Hampshire counties in the Boston EMA reported 70 percent of the AIDS cases in New Hampshire. From July 1990 to October 1993, surveillance reports show that the

number of AIDS cases reported for Boston grew from 1,904 to 4,646 cases. The majority (86 percent) of persons reported with AIDS in the EMA have been male, with the primary transmission mode being unprotected sex with another man (56 percent), injection drug use (25 percent), or a combination of the two (5 percent). The gay male population has been hardest hit by the epidemic. Women and men of African, Latino, and Caribbean origin continue to be disproportionately affected: Latina and African American women represent 60 percent of the female AIDS cases, but only 10 percent of the female population. AIDS is now the leading cause of death among young men (25-44) and the fifth leading cause of death among young women (25-44) in Massachusetts.

Title I funds benefiting the Chicago EMA are administered by the Chicago Department of Health (CDOH). The Chicago EMA originally included the counties of Cook, DuPage, and McHenry. In the latter part of 1993 the EMA was expanded to include the counties of DeKalb, Grundy, Kane, Kendall, Lake, and Will. Their combined population is approximately 6.1 million over an area of 1,900 square miles. The EMA's population is 62 percent White, 22 percent African American, and 12 percent Hispanic. The EMA's first case of AIDS was reported to the CDOH in 1981. As of November 1993, 11,072 AIDS cases had been reported within the EMA. The majority of these cases have been White (47 percent) and African American (40 percent). Sixty-one percent of the cases are attributed to homosexual/bisexual contact and 21 percent to IV drug use. The results of

an analysis of 3,272 cases revealed that in the past 2 years the epidemic continues to shift towards women (10 percent), IV drug users (30 percent), and African Americans (40 percent). In February 1993, the Chicago and Cook County HIV Services Planning Council increased its membership from 33 to 55 with 19 percent of the 52 occupied seats held by persons with HIV. The Dallas County Department of Human Services (DCDHS) administers Title I for the Dallas

EMA. The DCDHS also is the administrative agency for Title II funds. The EMA includes the

counties of Collin, Dallas, Denton, Ellis, Henderson, Hunt, Kaufman, and Rockwall, which cover

over 4,000 square miles. Sixty-nine percent of the EMA's population and 93 percent of the

estimated cases of HIV reside within Dallas County. Care and support services are centered in the

city of Dallas with its extensive suburban region. The remainder of the EMA is mostly rural.

As of December 28, 1993, the Dallas EMA reported 6,182 cumulative cases of AIDS; current

estimates are that 2,638 individuals are living with HIV/AIDS. Of the reported AIDS cases, 95.5

percent are male and 4 percent are female. Dallas has experienced several AIDS epidemics; in

1981 AIDS occurred primarily among White gay men; in 1987-1989 the African American and

Hispanic populations were disproportionately affected with a significant increase among African

American women; the third epidemic is among young people. Planning Council members are

appointed to 3-year staggered terms and must represent ethnic diversity, persons living with AIDS,

and include other individuals from communities throughout the EMA.

Since 1987, the Agency for HIV/AIDS of the District of Columbia Department of Human Services, Commission of Public Health, has administered Ryan White CARE Act funds granted to the Washington, D EMA. The Metropolitan Washington Regional HIV Health Services Planning Council was established by the Mayor's office in 1990, and has a total of 45 members: nine people with HIV/AIDS, six gay men of color, seven gay white men, one Latino, 16 heterosexuals, two lesbians, two parents of people with HIV/AIDS, and two substance abusers in recovery. In addition to the City of Washington, the EMA includes 11 counties in Virginia (Arlington, Loudoun, Fairfax, Prince William, Stafford, King George, Spotsylvania, Culpeper, Fauquier, Warren and Clarke); two cities in Virginia (Arlington and Fredericksburg); five counties in suburban Maryland (Prince George's, Charles, Calvert, Frederick and Montgomery); and two counties in West Virginia (Berkeley and Jefferson). For purposes of administering grant funds, the EMA is currently divided into three major areas: the District, suburban Maryland and suburban Virginia. As of September 30, 1993, the EMA reported 9,285 cumulative AIDS cases \_ the fifth highest

number among major metropolitan areas in the U.S. The District of Columbia, the core area of the EMA, has the highest seroprevalence rate in the nation at 232 per 100,000, six times the national rate of 37.5. Fifty-seven percent of cumulative adult/adolescent AIDS cases are in the District, followed by suburban Maryland (25 percent) and suburban Virginia (18 percent). An estimated 38,576 people in the EMA are actually living with AIDS or HIV infection, of which 4,732 are living with full-blown AIDS. Of those living with HIV/AIDS, 57 percent are African American, 37.6 percent are white, and 4.3 percent are Latino/a. Furthermore, 54 percent are among gay/bisexual men; 22 percent are IDUs; 9.3 percent are heterosexuals; 6.3 percent are gay/bisexual IDUs; 12.6 are women; and 1.9 percent are children. With 25,000-30,000 IDUs, the area has one of the highest substance abuse rates in the nation, and an estimated 8,400 IDUs in the EMA are living with HIV/AIDS. A growing proportion of cases are among IDUs and women \_ 17 percent and 10 percent, respectively.

Denver's Mayor is the Chief Elected Official (CEO) responsible for administering Title I funding in the Denver EMA. The Office of HIV Resources Coordination was created by the Mayor to oversee disbursement of all funding under the Ryan White CARE Act. Convened by the Mayor in April 1993, the 30-member planning council is chaired by a member of the Mayor's office, has a vice-chair from the community, and meets monthly. Five counties, encompassing 3,760 square miles, comprise the EMA: Adams, Arapahoe, Denver, Douglas and Jefferson. Denver, with a population of 467,610, is almost 30 percent of the total EMA, and has more than 10 percent of the total number of cases in the EMA. According to the 1990 U.S. Census, the EMA's five counties had a total population of 1,622,980 with a racial/ethnic breakdown of Anglo (85.6 percent), African American (5.9 percent), Asian-American or Pacific Islander (2.3 percent), Native American (0.8 percent), and Other (5.4 percent) (a subcategory of Hispanic origin of any race totalled 13.0 percent). Based on current proportions of reported AIDS and HIV cases, 77 percent of AIDS and 86 percent of HIV cases reside in Denver with the remaining cases dispersed throughout the other four counties. The first case of AIDS in Colorado was reported in May 1982. Estimates of persons currently living with AIDS in the Denver EMA (based on the revised CDC definition) range from a low of 1,176 (reported by the Colorado Department of Health as of June 30, 1993), to a high of 1,996, which is the CDC estimate taking into account national rates of unreported cases and reporting delays. Estimates of persons currently living with HIV (not CDC-defined AIDS) range from 5,080 to 7,424. The range for the total population living with HIV infection in the Denver EMA, both those who are and are not AIDS-diagnosed, is 6,256-9,420. HIV/AIDS is overwhelmingly found in

the adult male Anglo and gay/bisexual populations (there are an estimated 60,000 gay/bisexual males in the Denver EMA, and 5,307 are estimated to be HIV positive). Women account for 7 percent of estimated HIV and AIDS cases and children less than 1 percent. Pediatric AIDS represents a small part of the epidemic. Unlike other major Title I EMAs, there has been no resurgence of tuberculosis in the Denver EMA.

As the Chief Elected Officer for the City of Detroit, the Mayor is grantee of Title I Ryan White funds and has delegated responsibility for administering the grant to the Detroit Health Department (DHD). The Southeastern Michigan HIV/AIDS Council, established in 1989, is also the HIV Planning Council for the Detroit EMA. The Council reflects the cultural diversity of the EMA and has representation from PLWH, affected communities, providers, and planning and public health agencies. The EMA includes the city of Detroit and the counties of Oakland, Wayne, Macomb, Lapeer, Monroe, and St. Claire (intergovernmental agreements are in place between the city of Detroit and Wayne and Oakland counties). Approximately 90 percent of DHD clientele is minority. The estimated prevalence of HIV infection in the EMA is 10,600 persons living with HIV (PLWH), of which the highest percentages reside in the City of Detroit (63 percent), Oakland County (15 percent), and Wayne County (14 percent). Transmission/risk categories include a 45 percent total of men who have sex with men, and 25 percent who are injection drug users. The transmission rate continues to be high among African American homosexuals and is on the rise (particularly among women), through heterosexual contact.

The Fort Lauderdale EMA is Broward County, which is governed by a seven-member elected Board of Commissioners. The Commissioners have delegated responsibility for Title I to the Human Services Department, Office of HIV/AIDS Support Services. This EMA has received Title I funds since 1991. The Broward County HIV Health Services Planning Council has 30 members appointed by the Board of County Commissioners. All meetings of the Council and its committees are open to the public, and are advertised in local newspapers. Broward County has the second largest number of reported AIDS cases in Florida. As of September 30, 1993, there were 5,107 cumulative adult cases of AIDS and 107 pediatric cases. However, the latter number does not reflect the pediatric HIV epidemic; 460 children are being cared for at the Children's Diagnostic and Treatment Center because of HIV-related conditions. Twenty to 25 new pediatric patients are referred monthly. Eighty two percent of the pediatric cases



are African American, 14 percent Anglo/White, and 4 percent Hispanic; 86 percent are under 5 years of age.

The numbers of children with HIV reflect a relatively high percentage of women with AIDS/HIV in the EMA. Of the adult cases of AIDS in 1993, 17.5 percent were women. This compares to 11 percent nationally. Risk categories for AIDS cases in Broward are also high for heterosexuals at 19 percent of cases. African Americans represent 15.5 percent of the population in Broward County, but account for 37 percent of the AIDS cases. Anglo/Whites account for 57 percent of the AIDS cases and Hispanic Americans represent about 6 percent of cases, a level which has remained constant since 1991.

Of particular concern in the county is the increasing number of homeless persons who are HIV positive, including runaway adolescents who are at high risk because of substance abuse and/or prostitution. Another concern is the increasing number of TB cases. Almost 30 percent of all TB cases are also HIV positive; and more than 10 percent of AIDS patients also have TB.

Houston was one of the original 16 cities funded in 1991 under Ryan White Title I. The grantee is the County Judge who, as the chief elected official, has delegated responsibility for administering the grant and disbursing funds to the Harris County Health Department, HIV Services Department.

The 30 members of the Houston Area HIV Health Services Planning Council were appointed by the County Judge.

The Houston EMA includes seven counties (Harris, Brazoria, Fort Bend, Liberty, Montgomery, Waller, and Chambers) covering about 10,000 square miles and with a total population of more than 3.5 million (1990 census). Almost all AIDS cases (95.3 percent of the EMA's total) are in Harris County. The EMA has estimated that a total of almost 30,000 are HIV

positive, or one in 90 people living in the EMA. Men who have sex with men remains the largest category (47.9 percent) of people living with AIDS, though rates are declining. The rate of HIV infection among African American and Hispanic/Latino women has increased significantly. Across all races and ethnic groups, transmission by male to male sex has decreased by 1 to 2 percent while transmission via IV drug use has increased by 3 to 5 percent, particularly in African American males and females.

Hudson County, New Jersey is a 46-square-mile peninsula, the smallest and most densely populated of all the State's counties. It includes 12 municipalities, each with a population of more than 550,000. The Chief Elected Official is the County Executive, who has delegated responsibility for administering Title I to the Director of the Hudson County Department of

Human Services. The Hudson County HIV/AIDS Services Planning Council has 45 voting members. The Jersey City EMA has received Title I funds since the first year of Ryan White grant awards. The HIV/AIDS epidemic in Hudson County is almost evenly divided among three population groups: White, African American, and Hispanic/Latino. By transmission category, the major cause of HIV/AIDS is injecting drug use. AIDS/HIV has been reported among nearly twice as many women (22 percent of all people living with HIV) and more than twice the percentage of male IV drug users (54 percent of the infected population) in Hudson County than in the Nation.

The Kansas City Health Department administers the Ryan White grant and disburses funds under the jurisdiction of the mayor, who serves as CEO. Since 1986, this has been coordinated with the Missouri Department of Health, Bureau of AIDS Prevention Coordination Program. The EMA of Kansas City includes seven counties in Missouri (Jackson, Clay, Platte, Cass, Clinton, Lafayette and Ray) and four counties in Kansas (Johnson, Wyandotte, Miami and Leavenworth), covering approximately 5,400 square miles with a total estimated population of 1,583,000.

The HIV Health Services Planning Council is the steering committee of the Ryan White Care Consortium. Nine of the 20 steering committee members have HIV/AIDS and membership reflects the minority population. Forty-five percent of the planning council are females, 20 percent African American and 5 percent Hispanic. Most HIV positive individuals and PLWAs reside in the Kansas City Metropolitan area. Overall,

the case rate per 100,000 in the EMA is 131.0. The highest percentage of HIV/AIDS cases is currently reported among the Caucasian population (71.8 percent). HIV/AIDS is found predominantly in the male population (93.24 percent). The preponderance of HIV transmission has been linked to male to male sexual activity (69.08 percent), and AIDS is the leading cause of death among white males aged 13-49. HIV infection among African American and Hispanic communities is increasing (African Americans represent only 18.2 percent of the population in the EMA, but comprise 33.3 percent of all HIV cases). Cases among African American females is growing: this population constitutes only 29.4 percent of the EMA, but 55.8 percent of all HIV-positive women. Injecting drug use represents 6.02 percent, and heterosexual transmission 4.37. percent. Adolescents and young adults (ages 13-29) comprise 34.8 percent of HIV/AIDS cases.

As one of the early epicenters of the HIV epidemic, Los Angeles has been receiving funds under Title I of the Ryan White CARE Act since the Act was implemented in 1991. Title I funds are administered by the Los Angeles County Department of Health Services (DHS), AIDS Programs. Los Angeles County has 88 cities, encompasses over 4,000 square miles, and has a population of over 8.9 million. Its population is racially, ethnically, and culturally diverse: 41 percent Caucasian, 37 percent Latino; 11 percent African American; 11 percent Asian/Pacific Islander, and 1 percent American and Alaskan Native. This diversity creates challenges in responding to local HIV-related needs, particularly as HIV increases in communities of color, among women,

and in previously low incidence areas. Language alone is a barrier, with over 90 languages spoken locally. Poverty and lack of medical insurance create additional service problems. The EMA reports that one of every seven residents received some form of public assistance in 1990; one out of six was on Medicaid, and one out of three people under age 65 had no health insurance at all. As of November 1993, the Los Angeles EMA reported almost 8,000 adults and 259 infants and children living with AIDS. The EMA estimates that 51,000 HIV positive people are living in the county (one in every 213 residents). AIDS cases are racially and ethnically distributed as follows: 49 percent Caucasian; 28 percent Latino; 20 percent African American; 2 percent Asian/Pacific Islander; and 1 percent American and Alaskan Native/Unknown. Comparing these data with previous years shows a growth of HIV infection in the African American and Latino communities in Los Angeles. Changes are also occurring in transmission, with HIV infection caused by injection drug use almost tripling from 3 percent of cases before 1988 to 8.5 percent diagnosed in 1992.

Receiving Title I funding since 1991, the Miami-Dade County EMA covers an area of 1,955 square miles, includes 28 municipalities, and has a population of nearly 2 million. Title I funds are administered and managed by the County's Audit and Management Services Department. The Metropolitan Dade HIV Health Services Planning Council, appointed by the County Commission, has 29 members.

About 30 percent of the EMA's residents cannot afford medical care, though of this number, about half are at some time either eligible for Medicaid or are insured. There is a large immigrant population (nearly half of the population is foreign born), many of whom come from high HIV-incidence nations.

As in other areas that were early epicenters of the epidemic, the Miami EMA reports that HIV is increasingly affecting women (and thus children) and people of color. Females account for 18.4 percent of cumulative AIDS cases, and African American women are particularly affected, making up 78.9 percent of females with AIDS. Though homosexual/bisexual men remain the predominant transmission category (37 percent of all cases), the heterosexual category has grown, and now accounts for 20.2 percent of all cases. Last year, one third of all new cases were reported from heterosexual transmission. By race, AIDS cases are 21 percent white; 25 percent Hispanic; and almost 50 percent African American.

The year 1993 was the first year of funding for this EMA under Title I of the  
Ryan White CARE  
Act. The Nassau-Suffolk Health Systems Agency administers the grant funds  
for the EMA, which  
includes two counties: Nassau and Suffolk, which are located on Long Island,  
a 100-mile long, 15-  
mile wide island. The area is geographically, economically, and racially



diverse and has about 2.6 million residents. The Nassau-Suffolk HIV Health Services Planning Council has 35 members. Transmission patterns of HIV in this area show an increase related to injection drug use, which accounts for 53 percent of cumulative diagnosed AIDS cases among women and 45 percent among men. Women account for about 20 percent of all AIDS cases and preliminary data from clinics and health centers indicate a continued increase of HIV infection among this population. People of color are disproportionately affected. African Americans and Hispanics make up 13 percent of the population, and 41 percent of the cumulative AIDS cases. Language differences pose a barrier to care, though efforts have been made to overcome these problems. The three Nassau County HIV clinics have staff that speak Spanish and Creole. In Suffolk county, all eight health centers have Spanish-speaking health care providers. Several centers also provide assistance with other languages including Creole, French, Filipino, Hindi, Urdu, Persian, Czech, Cantonese, and Korean.

Newark's mayor designated the Newark Department of Health and Human Services to administer

Title I funds. The Newark EMA includes four counties: Union, Essex, Morris, and Sussex; and three jurisdictions in Essex County: Newark, Irvington and East Orange. Funding priorities are established by the 28 members of the HIV Health Services Planning Council. Though there is great diversity among the counties and populations composing the Newark EMA, many of which are mirrored in the HIV epidemic, the primary cause of HIV has always been related to the substance abuse epidemic, specifically injection drug use. More than half the estimated 12,465 infected with HIV were infected through injection drug use and most of those infected are males who account for 68 percent of the intravenous drug users estimated to be infected with HIV. A concomitant epidemic exists in women who were infected by heterosexual contact, frequently with partners who were infected by injection drug use. Nearly 40 percent of the women estimated to have HIV were infected through heterosexual contact. The epidemic began, and continues to be concentrated in, low income men of color who are IV drug users, and has grown rapidly among women of color through heterosexual contact. Related to the high rate of infection among women is the projected need for care and placement of orphans. Already there are 2,400 AIDS orphans in the Newark EMA; this number will grow.

The City of New Haven is responsible for administering the Title I grant. As the Chief Elected

Official, the Mayor of New Haven administers the funding through the Ryan White Title I office.

The City's Controller is directly responsible for disbursing the grant funds. The New



Haven/Fairfield Counties HIV Health Services Planning Council is composed of 35 members reflecting the racial/ethnic diversity of the EMA, including 40 percent minorities and 43 percent from either HIV/AIDS affected or infected segments of the community. The council is co-chaired by two persons selected by the mayor, and meets monthly. The EMA consists of the counties of Fairfield and New Haven which contain 50 legally incorporated cities and towns. The EMA covers approximately 20 percent of Connecticut but includes more than 1.6 million residents, or approximately 50 percent of the State's population and has 61.5 percent of the State's AIDS cases. New Haven County is the epicenter of the HIV epidemic, with nearly 35 percent of the total AIDS cases reported in the State. By racial and ethnic classifications, the EMA is 85 percent Anglo; 10 percent African American, 1.7 percent Asian, 0.17 percent American Indian, and 3 percent other, and is 92.5 percent non-Hispanic and 7.5 percent Hispanic. Calculations of the HIV/AIDS population total more than 8,000. The majority of cases (74 percent) are male, 23 percent are female, and 3 percent are pediatric. Populations with the greatest numbers of HIV/AIDS cases include African American and Anglo men, and intravenous drug users. The State also reports a significant number of AIDS cases among women \_ 13 percent of the U.S. cumulative cases of AIDS are among women, while in Connecticut women comprise 22 percent of all cases, resulting in a high rate of children diagnosed with AIDS.

New Orleans became eligible for Title I funding in 1993. The City of New Orleans is the hub of this EMA which includes seven parishes (counties): Orleans, Jefferson, St. Bernard, Plaquemines, St. Tammany, St. Charles, and St. John the Baptist. About 1.2 million people live in the EMA, of which about 60 percent are White; 35 percent African American, 4 percent Hispanic, and 1 percent Asian/other. However, the racial/ethnic makeup of the city of New Orleans differs from the surrounding EMA, with a population 60 percent African American, 34 percent White, 3.5 percent Hispanic, and 2.5 percent Asian/other. The Mayor's Office manages the Title I grant funds. The New Orleans Ryan White Title I HIV Health Services Planning Council is made up of 34 members.

The first case of AIDS was reported in New Orleans in 1983. As of December 1993, more than 3,000 cases of AIDS had been reported in the area. The majority (92 percent) were male; 60 percent were White; 37 percent African American; 5 percent Hispanic. By transmission category, men who have sex with men represent the largest category, at 67.7 percent of cases. Women are the fastest growing segment of the HIV infected population but among females reported with AIDS, African American women form the largest segment at 77 percent of all cases. New Orleans has a higher percentage of AIDS cases among adolescents than the rest of the Nation (.57 percent of all cases compared to .42 percent nationally). Reporting of HIV status became mandatory in the State of Louisiana in February 1993. Both injection drug use and heterosexual contact account for lower percentages of AIDS cases in this EMA than national averages: 9.7 percent of cases (versus a national average of 24 percent) are accounted for by injection drug use; heterosexual contact accounts for 4.6 percent of New Orleans' AIDS cases, compared to 7 percent nationally.

The epicenter of the nation's AIDS epidemic, the New York EMA spans eight counties with a combined area of 1,180 square miles and a population of 8.5 million. The eight-county area includes five boroughs of New York City and three suburban counties north of New York City (Tri-County region). The Mayor of New York City has designated the New York City Department of Health as the grantee and administrator of Title I funds (New York has been funded since 1991). The HIV Health and Human Services Planning Council was created by executive order of the Mayor in January 1991, and is comprised of 45 members appointed for 2-year, once-renewable terms. The Planning Council is part of the Office of the Mayor and is chaired by the Mayor's Coordinator of AIDS Policy. According to Planning Council bylaws, each borough of the City is represented, and one representative represents the Tri-County region. A total of 25 percent of Council seats are designed for people living with HIV or AIDS. In New York City, the cumulative total of 56,581 AIDS cases reported as of September 1993 represented 17 percent of the cumulative total of AIDS cases nationwide, although the City has just 3 percent (7.3 million residents) of the U.S. population. An estimated 168,709 men, women, adolescents and children in the five boroughs have HIV infection \_ one in every 50 people. New York City represents just half the total area of the EMA but claims 86 percent of its population and 96 percent of its HIV-positive people. The City is ethnically diverse: 25.2 percent African American, 24.4 percent Latino, 43.2 percent White non-Latino, and 7.2

percent Asian or other. HIV/AIDS is now the third leading cause of death in New York City and the leading cause of death among all adults ages 25-44. Though the African American and Latino populations represent less than 50 percent of the total population, they account for 67 percent of the cumulative adult cases. Roughly 52 percent of cumulative adult AIDS cases are associated with injection drug use (200,000 injection drug users live in the City, 30-40 percent of whom are HIV-infected), and 43 percent with homosexual activity. Adult males comprise 80 percent of the cumulative cases of AIDS reported in New York City, while adult women account for 18 percent. More women and injection drug users with AIDS have been identified as a result of the January 1993 expanded CDC AIDS definition. African American and Latina women account for 86 percent of the cumulative female cases reported in the City through September 1993. These increased figures among women have led to growth in the number of children and adolescents orphaned: in 1993, 5,400 children under 12 and 5,400 between 13 and 17 were left parentless by AIDS, and it is estimated that by the year 2000, 30,000 New York City youth ages 13-17 will have been orphaned by AIDS. In the Tri-County area (Putnam, Rockland, and Westchester), 2,170 cumulative adult and adolescent AIDS cases and 45 pediatric cases were diagnosed through October 1993 \_approximately 21 percent of the total number of cases reported for all of New York State, exclusive of New York City. By November 1993, African Americans and Latinos accounted for 57 percent of all confirmed adult and adolescent AIDS cases, though they comprised only 20 percent of the area population. Female AIDS cases represent 20.9 percent of all cases. Injection drug users account for 46.5 percent of the total number of cases, more than any other category of transmission. A high rate of transmission via heterosexual contact exists \_12 percent of all cases, compared to 7.3 percent in the U.S.

The Oakland EMA became eligible for Title I funding in 1992. The CEO designated Alameda County Health Care Services Agency to administer and disburse Title I funds. The Oakland EMA, which is located in the San Francisco Bay Area of Northern California, consists of Alameda and Contra Costa Counties covering a 1,458 square-mile area of urban and suburban centers and vast rural areas. The Planning Council has 27 members: 12 are African American, 11 are White, three are Latino, and one is Asian. Fifteen members are male and 12 are female. Twelve members are gay, bisexual, or lesbian and eight members have HIV. The 1990 Census data indicate the racial/ethnic composition as 60 percent White, 14 percent African American, 13 percent Latino, 12 percent Asian/Pacific Islander, 1 percent Native American, and <1 percent other. As of June 30, 1993, 4,084 cases of AIDS had been reported since 1980. Unlike the national profile of AIDS cases, in the Oakland EMA, persons over the age of 40 constitute a greater proportion of cases (42 percent vs. 33 percent). The EMA also has a higher proportion of Whites (57 vs. 51 percent) and a lower proportion of Latinos (8 vs. 17 percent) than does the U.S. as a whole. African American persons with AIDS are disproportionate to the population size: although 14 percent of the EMA's population is African American, this population claims 32 percent of the AIDS cases. Gay/bisexual transmission is the highest (68 percent), followed by injection drug use (12 percent) and gay/bisexual/IVDU (12 percent).

The Orange County government is the entity responsible for administering the Ryan White Title I grant in the Orlando EMA. The Chief Elected Official, the Orange County Chairman, has designated the Orange County Division of Health and Human Services as the administrative body for Title I funds. The HIV Planning Council has 37 members representing all categories as federally mandated, and works collaboratively with the Ryan White CARE Act Title II Consortium; nearly 50 percent of the Planning Council's members also are members of the Consortium. East Central Florida is the geographic area of the EMA, which covers 4,013 square miles and has 36 municipalities. Orange, Osceola, Seminole and Lake Counties comprise the EMA, with a population exceeding 1.3 million. AIDS was first reported in the Orlando EMA in July 1982. In the most recent 11-month period ending November 30, 1993, reports indicate that 897 cases were diagnosed. The cumulative case count as of November 30, 1993 was 2,339, with a majority of the cases in Orange County (78 percent). The largest percentage of AIDS cases diagnosed during 1993 occurred in the White population (56.7 percent), followed by Black (non-Hispanic - 24.7 percent), and Hispanic (15.9 percent). In transmission categories, the greatest percentage of cases is in

the homosexual/bisexual population (52.7 percent), followed by IVDUs (16.6 percent), blood transfusions (13.1 percent) and heterosexual contact (12.1 percent).

The Mayor of Philadelphia, the EMA's Chief Elected Official, delegates responsibility for disbursing funds and administering the Title I Ryan White CARE grant to the Acting Commissioner of City's Department of Public Health. On behalf of the Acting Commissioner, the program is managed by the AIDS Activities Coordinating Office. The HIV Health Services Planning Council is the Board of Directors of the Philadelphia AIDS Consortium. The Council is governed by the bylaws of the Consortium, which mandate that at least 20 percent of the total membership of the Council and all its standing and ad hoc committees be persons living with HIV. The Philadelphia EMA is comprised of the nation's fifth largest city and nine counties in two States, with a population of 4.9 million people. The five Pennsylvania counties are Bucks, Chester, Delaware, Montgomery and Philadelphia; the four New Jersey counties are Burlington, Camden, Gloucester and Salem. As of September 30, 1993, 7,619 cases of CDC-defined AIDS had been reported, and approximately 24,000 persons have HIV. In 1993, over 1,900 new AIDS cases were reported in Philadelphia alone \_ a nearly 150 percent increase from the previous year. The majority of people living with AIDS have been men of color who have sex with other men. The epidemic is growing most rapidly among poor and uninsured individuals, injection drug users, women, children and adolescents. These groups are most frequently members of communities of color.

Maricopa County is the Ryan White grantee in the Phoenix EMA, and the Maricopa County Department of Public Health is responsible for disbursing funds under Title I and administering the grant. The Chairman of the Maricopa County Board of Supervisors serves as the Chief Elected Official. The Phoenix EMA consists of Maricopa and Pinal Counties; Maricopa County comprises 94.8 percent of the population of the EMA and 98.5 percent of the reported cases of HIV infection in the EMA. Pinal County represents only 1 percent of the total reported AIDS

cases in Arizona.

Maricopa County designated the Maricopa County Community AIDS Partnership as the Planning Council for Title I funds in the EMA.

As of October 1, 1993, a cumulative total of 2,238 cases of AIDS had been reported in Maricopa

County, and 2,231 HIV cases. The majority (95 percent) were among males, and among Whites

(83 percent). White the most common exposure category was "men who have sex with men (68

percent), HIV-related mortality rates have been increasing among minorities and women. The

estimated total individuals living with HIV in the EMA is 7,625. Arizona has not seen the dramatic

increase in multiple drug resistant TB being experienced in areas such as New York, and the rate

of HIV infection in substance abusers is not increasing as quickly as in other major cities.

The Chief Elected Official (CEO) of the Ponce, Puerto Rico EMA has created an administrative branch within the Ponce Department of Health to oversee and administer Ryan White Title I funds.

The HIV Planning Council is composed of 28 persons representing all segments of the Ponce EMA community: physicians, community leaders, AIDS researchers, HIV positive persons, State and local representatives, Title II and Title III grantees and health educators. The Ponce EMA covers six municipalities in the southern part of Puerto Rico: Ponce, Juana Diaz, Penuelas, Guayanilla, Yauco and Villalba. Together, they have a population of 342,660 and a total of 1,594 AIDS cases reported as of November 30, 1993. Since 1987, AIDS cases in the Ponce EMA have increased from 187 to 275. From 1988 to 1991, Ponce experienced a 32 percent increase in the number of cases diagnosed.

As of November 30, 1993, IDU exposure accounted for 61.2 percent of cases, and homosexual/bisexual IDU accounted for 7.5 percent. More than two-thirds (68.7 percent) of all AIDS cases are related to IDU. Also as of November 30, 1993, heterosexual contact represented 17.2 percent of all cases.

Comprised of 31 members, the Planning Council is representative of the EMA in terms of geographic areas and also with respect to racial/ethnic composition and HIV/AIDS risk profile. Dr. Brad Gilbert, Director of Public Health for Riverside County, is the Planning Council Chair.

The Riverside/San Bernardino CA EMA is comprised of Riverside and San Bernardino Counties.

Located in the inland portion of Southern California, the EMA's 27,460 square miles includes

urban areas, rural areas, mountain regions, and deserts. The population of 2.8 million people is 63

percent Caucasian, 27 percent Latino, 6 percent African American, 4 percent Asian Pacific

Islander, and 1 percent Native American. Measures of socioeconomic status indicate that 12

percent of the population is below the poverty level.

As of March 31, 1994, 3,390 cumulative cases of AIDS had been reported within the EMA. This

represents a 42.4 percent increase from March 31, 1993, when the EMA first qualified for

assistance under Title I of the Ryan White CARE Act. It is estimated that there are currently 8,151

persons living with HIV (not CDC defined AIDS) in the two county region. Gay and bisexual men

account for 69 percent of the local AIDS cases. Injection drug use has been associated with 11

percent of the cases, which is substantially lower than the trend on the national level.

Epidemiologic, demographic, and socioeconomic data indicate that people of color and the poor are

over represented in the epidemic.

The San Diego Board of Supervisors has designated the Department of Health Services' Office of AIDS Coordination as the lead agency for the Title I Ryan White CARE Act program in San Diego. San Diego's Planning Council is a 30-member body appointed by the Board of Supervisors to administer the grant. Almost one-half of the members are persons of color, and 30 percent are HIV positive consumer representatives. The San Diego EMA is a single-county EMA approximately the size of the State of Connecticut with a population of over 2.6 million. San Diego, the sixth largest city in the nation, is the largest of 18 incorporated cities in the EMA. The population is ethnically diverse: 65 percent White; over 20 percent Latino/Hispanic; over 7 percent Asian or Pacific Islander; 6 percent African American; and close to 1 percent Native American. Cumulative AIDS case data approximate the total population demographics, with the White (76 percent) and African American (9 percent) populations experiencing a larger impact, and Latinos (13 percent), Asian/Pacific Islanders (1 percent) and Native Americans (.3 percent) having

proportionally fewer reported cases of AIDS. The number of new cases among African Americans and Native Americans has more than doubled in the past two years, and the new reported cases in the Asian/Pacific Islander community have increased by 171 percent. From 1981 through November 1993, 5,271 total AIDS cases were reported. Statistically, there are 2,051 persons living with AIDS in San Diego, although local service delivery data indicate a figure closer to 2,500. An estimated 14,963 to 15,162 persons are living with HIV infection in San Diego County. The HIV epidemic still predominantly affects gay White males (67 percent of reported cases to date). Another 20 percent of reported cases have been among gay men of color, and almost 10 percent of gay men with AIDS in San Diego have also reported using injection drugs. While the majority of people living with AIDS in San Diego are White (69 percent) and gay (75%), the epidemic is spreading to people of color, injection drug users, women and through heterosexual contact.

The AIDS Office of the San Francisco Department of Public Health administers Title I funds for the counties of San Francisco, San Mateo, and Marin, which comprise the San Francisco EMA. The EMA is a 1,016 square-mile area on the western (coastal) side of San Francisco Bay. The EMA's HIV Health Services Planning Council currently has 24 members who represent HIV service providers, affected/infected communities and other government bodies. Of the members,

seven are persons of color, six are persons with HIV, eight are women, and 16 are gay or lesbian.

All three counties have voting representatives. The Council is the coordinating and oversight body for Title I funds and also is the Title II Consortium for the City and County of San Francisco.

San Francisco remains an epicenter with the highest AIDS cases incidence rate in the nation. An estimated 33,000 people in the EMA are living with HIV/AIDS. From July 1981 to September 1993, a total of 17,750 AIDS cases were reported in San Francisco, accounting for one-fourth of all AIDS cases for the entire State, and 5 percent of all cases reported for the U.S. Gay/bisexual men are the primary population affected by the epidemic (approximately 27,156 or 81 percent of all persons with HIV). Women represent approximately 4 percent, and fewer than 100 cases are children. Of the estimated 33,721 HIV positive people within the EMA, approximately 38 percent comprise people of color (17 percent African American, 13 percent Latino, 7 percent Asian/Pacific Islander and 0.6 percent American Indian/Alaskan Native).

The Health Department of the Municipality of San Juan (MSJ) is the designated grantee of Title I

funds. The EMA includes the MSJ and 29 surrounding municipalities. The residents of the MSJ

are serviced by the San Juan Health Department while the remaining municipalities are serviced by

the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico Health Department, with the exception of the Municipality of

Bayamon which offers primary medical care through its Health Department.

The number of contractors under Title I in the EMA has increased from five agencies in 1991 to 17

in 1994. Of the 17 Title I contractors, 10 serve the homosexual/bisexual population; 16 provide

care for IDU's; 13 serve women; and 8 provide primary medical care outside San Juan.

The Planning Council has representatives from all the affected communities and most of the service

provider agencies in the EMA. Sixty percent of the Council's members belong to two important

membership categories: HIV+ individuals (21 percent) and community based and AIDS service

organizations (39 percent). Representation also includes a minimum of one member of the

mandated categories.

The Seattle-King County Department of Public Health (SKCDPH) is responsible for disbursing Title I funds in the EMA, which includes the city of Seattle and the counties of King, Snohomish, and Island. Geographically, King County is quite large with 2,134 square miles. Its population of 1.5 million accounts for nearly 30 percent of the State's residents. Snohomish County covers 2,090 square miles and has 484,000 residents. Island County covers 209 square miles and has a population of 62,700. The total EMA population represents 40 percent of the State's population and includes the metropolitan areas of Seattle and Everett. Approximately 75 percent of the States reported AIDS cases are located in the EMA. Of the reported cases, King County has 94 percent, Snohomish 5.6 percent, and Island .4 percent. Homosexual/bisexual contact accounts for the majority of cases (89 percent); injection drug use (5 percent); heterosexual contact (2.1 percent); hemophilia (1 percent); transfusion (1.3 percent); other/unknown (1.6 percent). The HIV/AIDS Planning Council currently has 30 members. The only officers of the Council are two co-chairs, one from the Health Department and one from the community.

In the St. Louis EMA, the Department of Health is the administrative Agent for Title I funds. The EMA covers a ten-county area spanning the States of Illinois and Missouri, with a total population

of 2.4 million persons residing in a 5,340 square-mile area. In Missouri, the EMA includes St. Louis City, St. Louis County, St. Charles County, Jefferson County, and Franklin County. Illinois counties included in the EMA are St. Clair, Madison, Monroe, Clinton and Jersey. St. Louis City and County in Missouri, and St. Clair and Madison Counties in Illinois form the urban core of the EMA, containing approximately 1.9 million persons, or 80 percent of the region's population. The 35-member Metropolitan St. Louis Health Services Planning Council is representative of all risk groups, racial and ethnic populations, geographical areas, and those with HIV disease. Membership in the EMA includes representatives from the Missouri Title II Consortia, the Southern Illinois Title II Consortia, and the Region's only Title III program. In the period 1988 to 1993, the prevalence of HIV throughout the St. Louis EMA increased by nearly 700 percent. CDC estimates the total HIV-positive population in the St. Louis EMA (living and deceased) to be over 8,000. The African American community has a significantly high incidence rate. Over 52 percent of all persons infected are African American though they comprise only 21 percent of the EMA'S population. Among all persons in the EMA, one in 336 is infected with HIV, while one in 109 African Americans is infected. African American women represent less than 18 percent of all women in the EMA, yet comprise 80 percent of women infected with HIV.

The individual responsible for disbursing funds and administering the Title I grant in the Tampa-St. Petersburg EMA is the chief elected official (CEO), the chairperson of the Hillsborough County Board of County Commissioners. Under the direction of the County Administrator, the Community Health and Human Services Department oversees management of the grant. In October 1992, the CEO designated the Sun Coast AIDS Network (SCAN) consortium to fulfill the planning council role as stipulated in the Ryan White CARE Act. The planning council has 30 appointed members representing all mandated categories of membership. The EMA is comprised of four counties (Hillsborough, Pinellas, Pasco and Hernando) and 23 cities, and covers more than 2,500 square miles along the west central "suncoast" of Florida. The total population exceeds 2 million, and is 83 percent white, 9 percent African American, 7 percent Hispanic, 1 percent Asian/Pacific islander, and less than 1 percent Native American.

The first diagnosed AIDS case in the Tampa-St. Petersburg EMA was reported in 1980. Between 1986 and 1990, cumulative reported cases increased 14-fold to a total of 1,166 cases. During this time, women experienced a 33-fold increase, and pediatric cases increased to 22 reported cases. By early 1993, total cumulative reported cases reached 3,264 with 71 percent white (compared to a national percentage of 52 percent), 21 percent African American, and 8 percent Hispanic (although representing about 9 percent of the total EMA population, African Americans have experienced 21 percent of the reported AIDS cases). The trend is changing in transmission categories among women with AIDS; IDU transmission continued at the high but steady rate of 39 percent of the total female AIDS cases reported between 1990 and 1993, but heterosexual contact accounted for virtually the entire proportional increase (from 39 percent to 46 percent). Together, Hillsborough and Pinellas counties claim 92 percent of the total reported AIDS cases within the entire EMA, and all pediatric cases.

The Board of County Commissioners serves as the Chief Elected Officials in the Palm Beach County EMA, administering Ryan White funding through the County Administrator, Robert Weisman. The HIV Services Planning Council was convened by the Board of County Commissioners in November 1993, and has 40 members reflecting the racial/ethnic diversity of one of the largest, fastest growing counties in the nation. It is an expansion and refinement of the Palm Beach County AIDS Consortium. While per-capita income is one of the highest in the nation, at \$19,524, the wealth of a small number of individuals living in the coastal portion of the county is countered by the extreme poverty of some of the poorest families in the nation. The western portion of Palm Beach County is

home to 24,478 children under the ages of 18 living below the Federal poverty level. The Hispanic population of Palm Beach County is by far the fastest growing segment, with a 134 percent growth rate in the last decade.

Palm Beach County reported a 40 percent increase in new AIDS cases in 1992. The prevalence of HIV infection varies by race, sex, risk group, and geographic local. Ninety-six percent of the infected population in the western portion of the county is Black, compared to 48 percent in the eastern coastal areas. Heterosexual contact (33.7 percent) is the primary mode of transmission in the western portion of the county while nationally, heterosexual contacts account for only 7 percent of transmission. According to the Palm Beach County Public Health Unit, pediatric HIV/AIDS infection is of great concern. A total of 297 pediatric HIV/AIDS cases were recorded through 1993. Palm Beach County has the most cases of seropositive pregnant women of all Florida counties. Black childbearing women are eight times more likely to be HIV positive than Whites and five times more likely than women of other races.
