Overview

Crypto for Windows 95/NT is a small, easy to use, file encryption utility. Simply drag and drop files to quickly protect your sensitive documents, and then enter an encryption key to encode and decode the files you want to protect from prying eyes.

Drag and Drop Files

Files can be quickly selected for encryption and decoding by simply dragging them to the desired file list windows.

Purchasing

Crypto for Windows 95/NT is a fully functioning program. It is **not** time-limited or crippled in any way.

Crypto for Windows 95/NT is distributed as shareware. You may evaluate it free of charge for 30 days. After 30 days if you continue to use Crypto for Windows 95/NT you are required to register it. If after evaluating Crypto for 30 days you decide not to register it you are required to remove it from your computer.

Registration entitles you to unlimited free updates and support via E-Mail or telephone.

Desktop Locations

Crypto's location on the desktop is saved when the program is exited. Whenever you start Crypto it will reappear on the desktop where you last placed it. Crypto property sheet locations are also stored and reused the next time they are opened.

Taskbar Tray

Crypto for Windows 95/NT can be optionally configured to place its program icon in the Taskbar Icon Notification Tray. This option provides a simple means of keeping the taskbar button region clear for other running programs.

Installing Crypto

Installation

To install Crypto for Windows 95/NT on your computer simply create a new, empty folder and place the files; CRYPTO.EXE, CRYPTO.HLP and CRYPTO.CNT there.

CRYPTO.EXE	- The Crypto Application
CRYPTO.HLP	- The Windows 95/NT Help File
CRYPTO.CNT	- The Help Contents File

If you installed Crypto for Windows 95/NT using the SETUP.EXE program and selected the default installation setting Crypto for Windows 95/NT will be installed in the **C:\Program Files\Software by Design** folder.

To integrate Crypto for Windows 95/NT with the MS Windows Explorer select the **Help | Setup** menu item to open the [Crypto Explorer Setup](#) property sheet while Crypto is running.

Note If you have an earlier version of Crypto for Windows 95/NT installed on your computer, simply replace the CRYPTO.EXE and CRYPTO.HLP files with the newer versions. Crypto stores configuration information in the MS Windows 95/NT [System Registry](#).

Note The CRYPTO.INI file is no longer used and can be deleted. The various application settings specified in the [Crypto Options](#) property sheet as well as the main window's size and location on the desktop are now stored in the MS Windows 95/NT System Registry.

Note Some earlier versions of Crypto for Windows 95/NT included a CRYPTO.WRI documentation file. This file has been replaced by the CRYPTO.HLP file and can now be deleted.

Warning If you rename the CRYPTO.EXE file you must also rename the HLP file using the same basename. For example if you change the Crypto application file name to NewName.exe, rename the help file to NewName.hlp. The HLP file *must* reside in the same folder as the Crypto application file itself.

Configuring Crypto

Crypto Options

Select the **File | Options** menu item to display the Crypto Options property sheet. This window will allow you to change the various Crypto program settings listed below.

Place Icon in the Taskbar Tray

Check this item to display a small Crypto program icon in the Taskbar Icon Notification Tray. If this item is selected and the Crypto window is minimized a button will not be added to the Taskbar, to restore the Crypto window on the desktop press the small icon in the taskbar tray instead. This option is available to keep the taskbar free for other running programs.

Note When this option is selected, clicking on the Close box in the upper-right hand corner of the window title bar will minimize Crypto instead of closing the application. To quit Crypto use the **File | Exit** menu command or the **Ctrl+Q** keyboard shortcut.

Minimize Program Icon at Startup

Check this item to minimize the main window on the Taskbar or Icon tray when Crypto for Windows 95/NT is first started.

Confirm Program Exit

Check this item to confirm quitting Crypto for Windows 95/NT. When this option is selected you will be prompted to confirm your intention to exit Crypto and return to the MS Explorer desktop. This item is useful if you run Crypto from the tray and wish to avoid accidental exits when you right-click on the Crypto tray icon.

Remove the Original File After Conversion

Check this item to remove the original file after the conversion operation completes successfully. If this item is not checked the original file will remain after encrypting or decoding operations are completed.

Use NSA File Erasure Method

Check this item to thoroughly erase the original unencrypted version of the files you encrypt. If this item is not checked the original file will simply be rewritten with all blanks and then erased. If this option is selected after a file has been encrypted the original file will be overwritten six times using an alternating 0xFF / 0x00 write sequence as specified by the National Security Agency. This method assures that the original file will not be readable by sophisticated file resurrection utilities. If this option is selected it will take slightly longer to encrypt large files due to the extra disk activity required.

Log All Operations to Disk

Check this option to create a log file of all file encryption and decoding activity. The file created will be named CRYPTO.LOG and will reside in the same folder as the Crypto program itself. Each time you use Crypto additional file operations will be appended to this file. The Crypto log file is a normal ASCII file and can be viewed by any text editor or word processor that can display ASCII text.

Duplicate Files

Check this item to skip warnings when adding duplicate files in the list windows. Crypto will cancel the addition of duplicate files without prompting you if this option is selected.

Temporary Files

Check this item to skip warnings when selecting files that have a TMP file extension. Crypto will cancel the addition of temporary files without prompting you if this option is selected.

File Not Found

Check this item to skip warnings about files listed for encoding or decoding that no longer exist on the disk in the folder specified.

Directory Warnings

Check this item to skip warnings when attempting to encrypt or decode folders.

Wrong Format

Check this item to skip warnings when adding file selections that have either already been encrypted or do not need to be decoded.

Missing Extensions

Check this item to skip warnings when attempting to add files for encryption or decoding that do not include a file extension.

Invalid Password

Check this item to skip warnings when files listed for decoding do not have the encryption password key you've specified.

Locked Files

Check this item to skip warnings when attempting to add files for encryption or decoding that are write-protected on disk.

Sounds with Warning Dialog Boxes

Check this box to play a short beep sound when Crypto displays a warning dialog box or an error occurs.

OK

Press this button when you have completed your selection of Crypto program options. When you press this button the Crypto Options property sheet will be closed and your settings will be saved.

Cancel

Press this button to close the Crypto Options property sheet without making any changes. If you have made any changes to the option settings, and then press this button your changes will not be used, and your previous settings will remain in use.

Help

Press this button to open the Crypto Help Window and go directly to the Configuring Crypto topic.

Note The options you have selected will be saved when you press the **OK** button. The desktop location of the Crypto Options window itself will also be stored. Your settings will be saved in the MS Windows 95/NT System Registry.

Crypto Explorer Setup

Crypto Setup

Select the **Help | Setup** menu item to display the Crypto Setup property sheet. This window will allow you to integrate Crypto for Windows 95/NT with the Microsoft Windows 95/NT Explorer. Use this command to create and remove MS Explorer shortcuts.

Create a Start Menu Item

Check this item to create a Crypto Start Menu entry. The Crypto for Windows 95/NT program will be located in the Software by Design folder on the Programs menu. This item will be disabled (grayed) if a Crypto item already exists in the Software by Design folder.

Remove this Start Menu Item

Check this item to remove the Crypto entry located in the Software by Design folder on the Programs menu. This item will be disabled (grayed) if a Crypto item does not already exist in the Software by Design folder.

Create a Desktop Icon

Check this item to create a Crypto for Windows 95/NT program icon on the Explorer desktop. This item will be disabled (grayed) if a Crypto desktop icon already exists.

Remove Icon from the Desktop

Check this item to remove the Crypto for Windows 95/NT program icon from the Explorer desktop. This item will be disabled (grayed) if a Crypto desktop icon does not already exist.

Create a Startup Folder Item

Check this item to automatically run Crypto for Windows 95/NT whenever Microsoft Windows is started. This option creates a Crypto program icon in the MS Windows Explorer Startup folder. This item will be disabled (grayed) if a Crypto startup item already exists in the Startup folder.

Remove the Startup Folder Item

Check this item to remove Crypto from the MS Windows Explorer Startup folder. This item will be disabled (grayed) if a Crypto startup item does not already exist in the Startup folder.

OK

Press this button when you have completed your selection of MS Explorer shortcuts. When you press this button the Crypto Setup property sheet will be closed and the MS Explorer shortcuts you have selected will be created or removed.

Cancel

Press this button to close the Crypto Explorer Setup property sheet without creating or removing any MS Explorer shortcuts.

Help

Press this button to open the Crypto Help window and go directly to the Crypto Explorer Setup topic.

File Menu

File Menu Commands

The File menu provides commands to work with the document files used by Crypto. A short description of each item follows:

Properties

Opens and displays a small window describing the file properties for a selected file. The **Alt+Enter** shortcut can be used for this command. You can also double-click your mouse on a file name listed in either of the file windows to quickly display file properties.

Access

Displays a dialog box that allows you to change the Crypto program access password. This password will be required to run the Crypto program itself. The password selected here is not used to encrypt and decode files. If you assign a program access password you will be prompted for it the next time you start Crypto. When Crypto for Windows 95/NT is installed for the first time no access password is used. To set a password leave the first entry box empty and assign a password in the second entry box and then retype it to verify your selection. To remove a password enter the current password in the first entry box and leave the remaining two fields blank.

Options

Opens the [Crypto Options](#) property sheet and allows you to change Crypto program settings. Use this command to configure the Crypto program.

Exit

Closes the Crypto program and returns control to the Explorer desktop. The **Ctrl+Q** shortcut can be used for this command.

Tip Commonly used File commands can be invoked using [shortcut keys](#) or buttons on the [toolbar ribbon](#).

Encrypt Menu

Encrypt Menu Commands

The Encrypt menu provides commands used to edit the contents of the Crypto file encryption list. A short description of each item follows:

Encrypt Files

Encrypts the files currently displayed in the file encryption list. You will be prompted to assign an encryption password and then asked to retype it to verify. **The Ctrl+E** shortcut can be used for this command.

Add Files

Opens the MS Windows Explorer File Browser and allows you to select files to be added to the encryption file list. Multiple files can be specified by Ctrl-Clicking and Shift-Clicking the mouse on items in the file list.

Tip You can also drag and drop files directly onto the encryption list to quickly add files for encryption.

Remove File

Removes the currently selected file from the encryption list. You will be prompted to confirm file deletions.

Clear Encryption List

Clears the entire file encryption list. You will be prompted to confirm this command before the file encryption list is cleared.

Tip Commonly used Encryption commands can be invoked using shortcut keys or buttons on the toolbar ribbon.

Decode Menu

Decode Menu Commands

The Decode menu provides commands used to edit the contents of the Crypto file decoding list. A short description of each item follows:

Decode Files

Decodes the files currently displayed in the file decoding list. You will be prompted to enter the encryption password you originally assigned to these files when they were encrypted. The **Ctrl+D** shortcut can be used for this command.

Add Files

Opens the MS Windows Explorer File Browser and allows you to select files to be added to the decoding file list. Multiple files can be specified by Ctrl-Clicking and Shift-Clicking the mouse on items in the file list.

Tip You can also drag and drop files directly in the decoding list to quickly add files for decoding.

Remove File

Removes the currently selected file from the decoding list. You will be prompted to confirm file deletions.

Clear Decoding List

Clears the entire file decoding list. You will be prompted to confirm this command before the file decoding list is cleared.

Tip Commonly used Decoding commands can be invoked using shortcut keys or buttons on the toolbar ribbon.

View Menu

View Menu Commands

The View menu provides commands used to change Crypto display options. A short description of each item follows:

Tool Bar

Use this command to turn the toolbar ribbon on and off. If this item is checked the Crypto toolbar ribbon will be displayed below the menu bar. To hide the toolbar ribbon uncheck this item. Most commonly used Crypto menu commands have a toolbar button. If the toolbar ribbon is turned off you will have to use the normal Crypto menu commands.

Status Region

Use this command to turn the status region on and off. If this item is checked the Crypto status region will be displayed at the bottom of the Crypto window. To hide the status region uncheck this item. The status region displays current program status and will also display a brief description of each menu command as the mouse is moved through these items.

Font

This item displays the standard MS Windows Font selection dialog. Use this window to select the font face, size and style to be used when displaying files in the encryption and decoding lists. The font information you select will be saved and used whenever Crypto is launched.

Minimize on Use

Minimizes the Crypto window to a button or icon on the taskbar during file encryption and decoding operations. If this item is checked the Crypto window will be minimized during file operations.

Always on Top

Use this command to keep the Crypto window top most on the desktop. When this item is checked the Crypto window will float above all other non-topmost windows on the desktop. This item is useful if you normally run Crypto with a small window that would be easily obscured by other applications. The **Ctrl+T** shortcut can be used for this command.

Tip Commonly used View commands can be invoked using shortcut keys or buttons on the toolbar ribbon.

Help Menu

Help Menu Commands

The Help menu provides commands used to get help with Crypto operations. A short description of each item follows:

Contents

Opens the Crypto Help window and displays the Table of Contents. The **F1** shortcut can be used for this command.

Search

Opens Crypto Help and displays the Search window. You can use this window to search for specific Crypto help topics.

How to Use Help

Opens a Help window that explains how to use the MS Windows 95/NT Help program.

Register

Displays the Crypto Shareware Registration Wizard. This wizard allows you to register Crypto for Windows 95/NT for authorized use.

Setup

Displays the Crypto Explorer Setup property sheet. This window provides options to integrate Crypto with the MS Windows Explorer. Use this window to create MS Explorer Start Menu items and desktop icons.

Web Site

Opens your web browser application and goes directly to the Software Design web site on the Internet.

About Crypto

Displays the Crypto splash box. This window contains program information, the current version of Crypto you are running and a program copyright notice. Click the mouse anywhere in this window to close it.

Tip Commonly used Help commands can be invoked using shortcut keys or buttons on the toolbar ribbon.

Toolbar Buttons

Tool Ribbon Buttons

Most commonly used Crypto menu commands can also be quickly invoked by pressing a button on the toolbar ribbon displayed at the top of the main window. These buttons work exactly the same way as the corresponding menu items that they duplicate. The Toolbar selection on the View menu must be selected to display the toolbar ribbon.



Encrypt – Encrypt files



Add – Add files to the encryption list



Remove – Remove files from the encryption list



Decode – Decode files



Add – Add files to the decoding list



Remove – Remove files from the decoding list



Properties - Show file properties



Topmost – Make the Crypto window topmost



Font – Select a font for file lists



Options - Open the Crypto Options dialog



Help - Open this Help file



About - Show the Crypto splash box

Tip A small popup tip window will appear when the mouse pointer is placed over a button. A short description of what each button does can be viewed using this method.

Shortcut Keys

Shortcuts

Shortcut keys allow you to quickly invoke Crypto menu commands without first displaying the menu and then selecting an item from it. The most commonly used Crypto commands can be invoked using the following shortcut keys.

Alt+Enter	Display file properties
Ctrl+Q	Exit Crypto, and return to the desktop
Ctrl+D	Decode the current file list
Ctrl+E	Encrypt the current file list
Ctrl+T	Make Crypto topmost
F1	Display this Help file

Tip The **Ins**, **Del** and **Clear** keys can also be used to quickly add and remove files from the currently selected file list window.

System Registry

Crypto for Windows 95/NT System Registry Key

Crypto for Windows 95/NT stores configuration settings in the MS Windows 95/NT System Registry. These settings are updated automatically while Crypto is running. There is no need to edit these settings manually.

If you insist upon editing these settings, you do so at your own risk. Crypto automatically updates registry entries when it exits. If you wish to edit these settings make sure Crypto is not running while you edit them. If Crypto is currently running your editing changes will be overwritten when Crypto exits.

Crypto for Windows 95/NT stores configuration settings in the following system registry key:

Warning There is no need to edit these settings manually. Crypto will automatically maintain these settings for you. If you do edit these, you do so at your own risk.

Removing Crypto

Removing Crypto for Windows 95/NT

If you find that Crypto for Windows 95/NT does not meet your data encryption needs you can remove it from your computer system by simply deleting the following files from your hard drive.

All of these files will be located in the folder that you originally installed Crypto in.

The default location for all Crypto for Windows 95/NT program files is the **C:\Program Files\Software by Design** folder. Unless you specified a different folder when you ran SETUP.EXE you will find the Crypto files here.

Crypto.exe	Crypto application program.
Crypto.cnt	Crypto Help Topics File
Crypto.hlp	Crypto Help File

If you have opened and used the Crypto for Windows 95/NT Help files your system may contain the following two (2) files. These files are created by the standard MS Windows 95/NT Help program WinHlp32.exe. These files may also be safely removed.

Crypto.gid MS Windows Help settings file. This file contains the Crypto Help window size and desktop location as well as any bookmarks you may have created.

Crypto.fts MS Windows Help word database. This file is created when you build a custom word list for Crypto Help files. This file is used to search for words and phrases in the Crypto Help files.

Crypto for Windows 95/NT does not use any custom DLL files or system drivers. If you delete the files mentioned above from your system's hard drive you will have completely removed Crypto from your computer system.

Note If you have installed Crypto shortcuts on the MS Explorer Start Menu use the **Help | Setup** command to remove the shortcuts you created before you delete the Crypto files mentioned above.

What is Shareware

The concept of "Shareware"...

Shareware, also known as user supported software and other names, is a concept not understood by everyone. The author of Shareware retains all rights to the software under the copyright laws while still allowing free distribution. This gives the user the chance to freely obtain and try out software to see if it fits their needs. Shareware should not be confused with Public Domain software even though they are often obtained from the same sources.

If you continue to use Shareware after trying it out, you are expected to register your use with the author and pay a registration fee. What you get in return depends on the author, but may include a printed manual, free updates, telephone support, etc. Only by paying for the Shareware you use do you enable the Shareware author to continue to support his software and create new programs. Considering that the Shareware registration fees are almost always far less than the purchase price of comparable commercial software it's obvious that Shareware is a good deal for everyone.

There are real advantages to you in the Shareware system. You get to try out software to make sure it is compatible with your hardware and that it fits your needs before you "buy" it with your registration. The author saves the expense of advertising, packaging and distribution and passes the savings on to you. Plus, most Shareware authors are much more accessible than commercial software sources so that your questions and suggestions are much more likely to be responded to.

Registering Crypto for Windows 95/NT

Registering Crypto

Crypto for Windows 95/NT is distributed as shareware. You may evaluate it free of charge for 30 days. After 30 days if you continue to use Crypto for Windows 95/NT you are required to register it. If after evaluating Crypto for 30 days you decide not to register it you are required to remove it from your computer.

Registration entitles you to unlimited free updates and telephone support.

You can register Crypto for Windows 95/NT by mailing the Order Form provided with this software. When you register Crypto for Windows 95/NT you will receive your registration code by E-Mail, or optionally you may request that your registration code be mailed to you.

The software you are currently using is a fully functioning program. There are no time limitations built into the software to restrict its continued use and no program features have been disabled. As a registered user you will however be able to disable the initial splash box that appears when Crypto for Windows 95/NT is first launched.

To register your copy of Crypto for Windows 95/NT select the **Help | Register** menu command. The Shareware Registration Wizard will be displayed when this menu command is selected. Use this window to fill in the following entry fields:

User Name

Enter the user name you originally specified when you ordered Crypto for Windows 95/NT.

Organization

Enter the name of your organization as originally specified when you ordered Crypto for Windows 95/NT. If you did not specify an organization name leave this field blank.

Registration

Enter the registration code that was provided to you. Enter your registration code exactly as provided. Do not include spaces when entering your registration code.

Note The registration code was provided to you when you purchased Crypto for Windows 95/NT. Refer to the notification letter that was mailed to you or the E-Mail message you received for your personal shareware registration code.

Show Splash Box at Startup

This box will be initially checked if you have not registered Crypto for Windows 95/NT. When you successfully register your copy of Crypto this box will automatically be unchecked for you. If you wish to see the splash box when Crypto is launched return to this Registration Wizard and check this box.

OK

Press this button after you have filled out the Shareware Registration Wizard to complete Crypto for Windows 95/NT shareware registration.

Cancel
