### Supplemental Study Scriptures:

Matthew 7:13-24 *God's warns against false instruction and the importance of being a doer and not just a hearer of the Word.*

Acts 8:35-39 *Philip must have mentioned baptism when he preached Jesus to a man from Ethiopia, because the man asked to be baptized in water. The Greek root word for baptize is "bapto", which literally means "to cover wholly with fluid, to dip." (See also Romans 6:3-4.)*

Romans 8:6-9 *Paul teaches the saints in Rome that having the Spirit is essential for their walk in Christ.*
