

Kudo Browser Interface

To select any of the help lessons, click with the mouse when you see the $^{ extsf{hm}}$ cursor.

Kudo allows you to view your image thumbnails in three ways: Gallery, Small Gallery, and List views. This is a typical Kudo Image Browser window. The catalog selected is being displayed in the Gallery View. (*Please note: the Kudo Window displayed below is an example and may not reflect your onscreen images.*)

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Using Kudo Browser

To select any of the help lessons, click with the mouse when you see the \square cursor.

The Kudo Image Browsers are catalogs of images in various distinct categories. Each category is a separate catalog. Kudo catalogs the image files using thumbnails. Think of a thumbnail as a miniature photo of the image file. It looks like the file, but it's a replica that takes up very little memory. Kudo uses the thumbnail in its catalog and leaves the image file, untouched, in its original form and location. With these compact thumbnails, Kudo catalogs the image files in a convenient, accessible way.

The thumbnails provide a visual reference for each image file. Kudo adds information, such as the original file's name, location, size and file type, to complete the catalog.

File Menu

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The File menu contains commands for accessing and printing the images.

This option will close the currently open browser file, but will keep the browser program on. To close a browser file and turn the browser program off simultaneaously, use the Exit option in the file menu.

This option will give you the standard Windows Open Dialog box. From this box you may open other browser files with the .KDB extension on them.

Use the standard Printer Setup and Print commands to print part or all of your catalog. The Print feature always prints the current selection of thumbnails. For example, to print all thumbnails in a catalog, choose Image-Find All to find everything, then choose File-Print.

To print thumbnails with file name and size only, select the Gallery View prior to printing your catalog. Printing a catalog in Small Gallery View prints the maximum number of thumbnails per page. To print thumbnails with complete information, including file location, select List View and then print the catalog. Printing a catalog in the Gallery View, Small Gallery View and List View buttons allow you to toggle between views. Switch between views by clicking on the view button you prefer. List View provides more text information on images, but prints fewer thumbnails on each page.

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Printer Setup gives options to select available printers and change their options.

- 1. Select a printer and port.
- 2. Click on Setup to open the Setup window and choose the print quality, paper orientation and size.
- 3. From the Setup window, click on Options to choose additional printer specific options.
- 4. Click on OK on each window to accept the changes.

The Exit command closes the open catalog and then closes Kudo.

Copy Thumbnail copies the selected thumbnail in the currently active catalog. To retrieve the object from the clipboard, choose Edit-Paste from the menu of the target application.

The View menu allows you to choose from three viewing options.

The Small Gallery View uses the same layout as Gallery, but with much smaller images, allowing the user to view more images at once. Click on the Info button to view detail about the selected thumbnail.

The Small Gallery View, Gallery View and List View buttons allow you to toggle between views. Switch between views by clicking on the view button you prefer.

The Gallery View uses a grid style layout showing several

thumbnails and their file type at once. Click on the Info button to view detail about the selected thumbnail.

The Gallery View, Small Gallery View and List View buttons allow you to toggle between views. Switch between views by clicking on the view button you prefer.

List View uses a vertical layout with fewer thumbnails in the window, but with more information about each file. The list view shows the thumbnails in a vertical column. This program does not provide additional information in the notes section, therefore the second vertical column in the list view will always be empty.

The List View, Gallery View and Small Gallery View buttons allow you to toggle between views. Switch between views by clicking on the view button you prefer.

The Image menu provides you options on finding, previewing and getting information for your selected thumbnail.

Kudo maintains a link between the thumbnail image in the catalog and the original file. Use the Preview option to preview the original image file in a full-sized window.

- 1. Select the thumbnail you wish to preview.
- 2. Choose Image-Display Original.
- 3. Kudo will find the original image file and display it in a full-sized window.
- 4. Double-click on the Control menu box (the hyphen-shaped box in the upper left corner of the window) to exit the preview window.

To preview other image files, simply click on their thumbnails while the Image Preview window is open. On some systems Kudo may need help finding the original image. If you see the dialog box (shown below) enter in the correct letter of your CD-ROM drive and click on OK. Kudo will now be able to find the original images.

Get info gives you quick access to a thumbnail's information. This option tells you the file name, volume, size, date created, location and any notes attached to the thumbnail.

Note: Only the name and size will be distinct for each.

To display a thumbnail's information:

- 1. Select a thumbnail.
- 2. Choose Image-Get Info.
- 3. Kudo will display the information in the floating window, Image Information.
- 4. Double-click on the control menu box (the hyphenshaped box in the upper left hand corner of the window) to exit the floating window.

Note: if you edit the information in this dialog box, it will not be saved because it is being read from the CD-ROM.

Use the Find feature to search the catalog for thumbnails with specific characteristics. Kudo searches the catalog and displays the thumbnails that were identified in the search. All other thumbnails are hidden from view.

When you select the Find button (or choose Image-Find), Kudo displays the Find Image dialog box.

- 1. Use the first combo box to tell Kudo which thumbnail characteristic it should search. You can search by name, size, date modified, notes or location. *Note: Only searching by name or size will produce a distinct find.*
- 2. Use the next combo box menu to tell Kudo how to search the catalog. The selections in this combo box will become available after you make a selection in the

first combo box.

- 3. Use the edit text box to tell Kudo for what words or information to search. Wild card characters such as * or ? are not necessary.
- 4. Click on Find.

Find All searches for and displays all thumbnails in the active catalog. This feature is also used to restore all thumbnails after a Find operation. Find All is equivalent to executing a Find Everything using the Find button.

Sort Menu

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The Sort menu allows you to sort thumbnails according to the certain criteria. Note: Only sorting by name and size will produce a unique sort; all other characteristics are identical for all.

Sorts by eight character file name.

Sorts by size of the actual image file (bytes).

Alphabetically groups thumbnails by their image type (extension).

Sorts by date the image file was last modified.

Sorts by image file's location pathname.

Sorts by first word in the Notes Box.

Window Menu

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The Window menu allows you to manipulate the currently displayed window.

Arranges open windows so that the title bar of each window is visible.

Arranges open windows side by side so that all of them are visible.

Arranges into rows all program-item icons for a selected group.

Closes all open catalogs.

Lists the names of currently open browsers.

Help Menu

Find Button

Use the Find feature to search the catalog for thumbnails with specific characteristics. Kudo searches the catalog and displays the thumbnails that were identified in the search. All other thumbnails are hidden from view.

When you click on the Find button (or choose Image-Find), Kudo displays the Find Image dialog box.

- 1. Use the first combo box to tell Kudo the thumbnail characteristic it should search. You can search by name, size, date modified, notes or location. *Note: Images in a catalog will only have a distinct name and size. All other characteristics are the same for all images.*
- 2. Use the next combo box menu to tell Kudo how to search the catalog. The selections in this combo box will become available after you make a selection in the first combo box.
- 3. Use the edit text box to tell Kudo for what words or information to search. Wild card characters such as * or ? are not necessary.
- 4. Click on Find. Note: When you exit from the catalog and reopen it, all images in the catalog will be found.

Info Button

The Info button gives you quick access to a thumbnail's information. This option tells you the file name, volume, size, date, location of file and any notes attached to the thumbnail.

Note: The date, volume and notes will contain the same information for all images.

To display a thumbnail's information:

- 1. Select a thumbnail by clicking on it.
- 2. Click on the Info button.
- 3. Kudo will display the information in a floating window, Image Information.
- 4. To close the window, double-click on the control menu box (the hyphen-shaped box in the upper left corner of the window).

Note: if you edit the information in this dialog box, it will not be saved because it is being read from the CD-ROM.

Riffle Feature

The Riffle feature displays the selected catalog's thumbnails one at a time in the lower right corner of the main window.

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Control the Riffle speed and direction by holding down the left mouse button and dragging the control bar from the center to the left or right of the Riffle Control. Kudo will advance through the catalog until you release the control or until it reaches either end of the catalog.

When the mouse button is released or the control bar is returned to the center position, Kudo stops near the thumbnail that you chose and displays the surrounding thumbnails. Your reactions may be slower than Kudo's Riffle feature, so when you release the Riffle control, you may have to select a thumbnail that is a few frames ahead of the one you wanted.

Status Bar

The Status Bar displays the number of thumbnails currently displayed out of the total number of thumbnails contained in the active catalog.

For example, the active catalog contains 100 thumbnails. After executing the Find feature, only 35 thumbnails met the search criteria. The catalog window will only display the 35 found thumbnails and the Status Bar will display "35 of 100 found."

To restore the catalog to the full 100 displayable thumbnails, use either the Find All option from the Image Menu or find "Everything" using the Find button.

Sorting

When you open a catalog, Kudo lists the thumbnails according to when they were added to the catalog. Use the Sort menu to list the thumbnails by file name or size. You can sort the catalog using the same criteria found in the Find feature.

Sort and Find use the same criteria but they affect the catalog differently. With Find, you use the criteria to determine which thumbnails Kudo should display and which it should hide from view. With Sort, you re-arrange the thumbnails that are displayed.

When you close and re-open the catalog, Kudo shows all the thumbnails in their original order.

To sort your catalog:

- 1. Select a sorting criteria from the Sort menu (name or size).
- 2. Kudo will automatically re-arrange the thumbnails and display them in their new order.

Note: Only sorting by name or size will produce a unique sort.

Drag and Drop

There are three methods for placing an image from a Kudo Catalog into a document:

- 1. Drag and Drop; or
- 2. Copy and Paste; or
- 3. You can also, of course, note the file name and location and then insert the image from within the target application.

Kudo takes advantage of Windows technology (DDE and OLE 2.0) which allows you to Drag and Drop images onto all popular graphics applications. When you Drag and Drop from your Kudo catalog to an open document, Kudo will find the original image file and place it in the document of selected desktop publishing and other page layout applications, with pinpoint accuracy.

To Drag and Drop a thumbnail to an open document:

- 1. Select the thumbnail.
- 2. Hold down the mouse button and drag it to the open document.

To Copy and Paste a thumbnail, refer to Copy Thumbnail.

Drag and Drop can be used from Kudo Image Browser onto the following applications:

- All graphics applications that support Drag and Drop from the File Manager. This includes virtually al leading applications.
- All graphics, desktop publishing, and multimedia applications that are OLE 2.0 clients. OLE 2.0 clients provide pinpoint accuracy when dropping onto a page layout.
- Kudo includes Place Modules for the following applications that are not OLE 2.0 clients, but could benefit from Drag and Drop with pinpoint accuracy:

QuarkXPress version 3.12. 3.2 and 3.3 Aldus PageMaker version 4.2 and 5.0 Microsoft Word version 2.0* Word Perfect 6.0

*Note: For Microsoft Word users, Word will indicate that you can drop the image only when the cursor is over the Word application toolbar or that status bar (along the bottom of the window). When the image is dropped, it will be inserted at the exact location of the Word "I-beam" (insertion point). Release the mouse button and Kudo will find the image and place it into the document.

How to use Expert's Help System

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To select any of the help lessons, click with the mouse when you see the 🖽 cursor.

Expert help uses a visual system for providing you with information on the different screens and features of this program.

To obtain help on any topic, click on the **Help** menu from anywhere in the program or on the

icon. Doing so will bring up the appropriate help topic for the current screen that you are on.

X Most of the major screens and dialog boxes in this program are reproduced in miniature form in this help file. As you pass the mouse cursor over the image, the arrow-pointer will change shape to that of a hand

🖶 indicating that you can click on that area. (This is called a "hotspot.") For information on any field, button, hotspot, or feature, simply click on the area you are interested in and a pop-up description will appear or it will jump you to that specific topic. Ocassionally, you will see the Expert "X" (

(In some portions of the help file preceded by "click here;" it will be a jump to another topic or location in the help file. X

- The pop-up or jump description may consist of up to 3 parts. They include:
- 1. Definition and/or general information about the item you have selected.
- 2. Action to take. Any instructions or options available for the topic.
- 3. A link (usually in green) to a related topic. If further information is available for the item you have selected, the link will take you to the new topic of interest.

× Another way of quickly accessing information for a particular topic is through the use of the glossary buttons located in the non-scrolling region at the top of every help screen. Clicking on each letter will provide you with a guick alphabetized index listing in a pop-up box.

Thumbnail

A thumbnail is a small picture of your original file. Thumbnails allow you to preview your image before selecting it. Select a thumbnail by clicking on it.

Double-clicking on a thumbnail will open the paint program you have associated with the image extension. If no association exists, nothing will happen.

Image Information

This area displays the file name and size of the original image.

Frequently Asked Questions

- Q: How do I save the text entered under the List View note field?
- A: This program was designed to view thumbnail images rather than to create new ones. If the program allowed for the creation of new browsers, then the note field would save notes or information entered in the field.
- Q: How come when I double-click on an image nothing happens?
- A: Verify that the selected image is being associated with a BMP or PCX extension or any other compatible paint program.
- Q: How can I easily edit the image?
- A: If you double-click on an image's thumbnail it will be opened in Paintbrush or any other paint program associated with a BMP or PCX extension.
- Q: What do I do when I get the error message file not found?
- A: To preview other image files, simply click on their thumbnails while the Image Preview window is open. On some systems Kudo may need help finding the original image. If you see the dialog box (shown below) enter in the correct letter of your CD-ROM drive and click on OK. Kudo will now be able to find the original images.
