1.2 Archæologicons: Required For Use

If you don't know what NewIcons are and don't have the software installed then you are probably wondering why there are drawers full of little white squares. You need NewIcons (Aminet: util/wb/NewIconsV4.lha) in order to make theses icons appear. They use a retargetable palette system that stores the icon data in the tooltypes. Get NewIcons and read its docs for further explaination.

NEEDED:

- · Amiga with OS 2.xx or better
- · NewIcons system (v4 is the newest as of this writing)

RECOMMENDED:

- · WB screenmode with a lot of colors and greys
- · Turn the icon borders off and the transparency on

1.3 Archæologicons: What & Why?

DESCRIPTION:

Archæological/cultural icons for use with NewIcons. For the purposes of this icon set, archaeological artifacts include any object, indicative of a particular culture, that is either older than a few hundred years or whose parent culture has disappeared or been more or less assimilated into a larger, more modern culture. Basically, if it's the sort of thing that your traditional musty, old museum would display, then it's in.

USES:

They look nice if you leave them out on your Workbench, preferably with the NewIcons' "No Borders" and "Transparent" settings checked. Use them as appicons. Use them as dock buttons. Use them for your hard drives. Use them as frivilous decorations. Cover your Workbench with moais and pretend you are on Easter Island! Use the Egyptian pyramids and sphinx as hard drives and it will be just like a vacation in Egypt, only without the terrorists! Experience the joy of turn of the century, Indiana-Jonesesque cultural plunder in convenient digital form!

WHY DID I DO THIS:

1.5 Archæologicons: Notes

INSTALLING:

Use the program CopyNewIcon (it should be in the NewIcons distribution,) to put the NewIcon data into an existing icon.

example:

CopyNewIcon Africa/Egyptian/Pyramid DHO:disk.info

DO NOT USE ICON EDIT TO COPY A NEWICON. This will save the data in the standard format and you will lose the retargeting palette for that icon. However, if that's what you want to happen, then by all means, go ahead. Consult NewIcon's docs for further information.

COLORS:

Since these icons use the NewIcons retargetable palette system, they should work with any WB palette, but some may look ugly on a low depth WB.

If you have a low color depth WB, it would be a good idea if your palette contained a good representation of greys, as in more than three light shades.

SIZES:

Each icon is a diffrent size, depending on how much detail I could cram into it. I know this lack of uniformity might be disturbing to the more procrustean minded, but it is just something you will have to deal with.

ALTERED STATES:

When selected the icons darken with a white outline. I find that this makes them stand out nicely on any background and gives a nice feedback when clicking them. Some may be animated where aplicable.
