## PostScript Code for FileName, Time, Date and Draft Stamps

This document uses Times and Helvetica font

Much of the work done in this file comes from a Word 4.0 document in Article 58981 of comp.sys.mac ("Document name hack for Microsoft Word 4.0 and LaserWriter 6.0" by Walter Smith at Apple [wrs@apple.com]) which was sent to me from many locations.

From his file: " 20 June 1990. This information is hereby placed in the public domain.

The document name is derived from **/jobname**, which is of the form

## Rusername; Document: documentname.

We search for the rightmost colon in the jobname and print everything to its right."

Walter Smith's code has been modified with a few simplemanipulations. Word 4.0's time, date and page number variables [wp\$date, wp\$time and wp\$fpage] have been added so that these print with the full jobname on one line at the bottom right hand corner of the document.

Each bit of Postscript is surrounded by a **gsave**/**grestore** so that they can be independently cut or pasted into headers or footers. Code placed into a header will be overprinted. Code placed into a footer will overprint.

Placement is independent of the page definition as I wanted [usually] to print at the bottom right hand corner but the .pic. or .para. commands could be used to tie the code into the "next" printed block within a Word document.
