INSTALLATION

If you received NoiseKiller on diskette:

- 1. Insert the NoiseKiller diskette into a drive. Select **File|Run** from the Program Manager or File Manager. Run the NoiseKiller Install program (INSTALL.EXE).
- 2. Choose the directory and press the **Install** button. NoiseKiller will be installed in the directory choosen.

If you received NoiseKiller in a zip file (NK12U3.ZIP):

- 1. Unzip the zip file into either a *temporary directory* or onto a *diskette*. Select **File|Run** from the Program Manager or File Manager. Run the NoiseKiller Install program (INSTALL.EXE).
- 2. Choose the directory and press the **Install** button. NoiseKiller will be installed in the directory choosen.
- 3. If you used a temporary directory you should copy that directory onto a diskette in case you need to reinstall NoiseKiller in the future. You will then be able to delete the temporary directory.

UNINSTALLATION

- 1. Delete NoiseKiller icons and group in the Program Manager
- 2. Delete the installation directory in the File Manager
