Batmail

Batmail is a fully featured mail-system for use in a LAN (Local Area Network) and will work under any networking system, as long as it supports MS-Windows 3.1x and up.

There are a lot of fine netmailers for sale in the world but they often come with a large price-tag attached to it. Batmail is brought to you as shareware.

This means that you can try it out to see if it meets your demands and if you do like it, you can purchase it for a reasonable fee, regardless of the number of users in the network.

BatMail Commands:



Create a new message



Read message



Delete message




Address book



<u>Test Connection</u>

The address-book



The address-book holds the names and userids of all the users in the mailsystem. The netmail-administrator should be the only one that can modify users or groups in the address-book. For all other users it is read-only.

Test Connection

This function will show the status of the current mailconnection.

If for some reason you are no longer connected to the mail-system the button will look like this:



Pressing the button will test for the following mishaps:

- No reading rights in Mail-Server Directory
- Address-book not found
- User-ID not known
- Username not known
- Mail-Server Directory unknown
- Address Book Directory unknown
- Local Mail Directory unknown
- 60 day test-period has passed

Read message command buttons

View contents of attached file



Send messagetext to printer



Copy messagetext to windows clipboard



Forward incoming message



Reply to incoming message



Resend current message (when viewing outgoing message)



Stop viewing message

Create a new message command-buttons



Send current message to mail-server



Attach a file which will be send along with the message



Bring up addressbook with users, groups and groupmembers



Stop creating a message and loose its contents



get text from clipboard into message-text

Delevery options:

Urgent: Informs recipiant that new URGENT mail

has come in.

Confirm : Will cause Batmail to notify you as soon as

the recipiant actually opens your message.

Server directory

this must be a commonly shared directory on a server which all users can access. This is the directory where Batmail puts outgoing mail and attachments. Other Batmail-clients poll this directory for new mail.

Addressbook directory

this must be a commonly shared directory on a server which all users can access. This is the directory where BatMail keeps the addressbook with the names of users, groups and group-members.

Local Mail directory

this is a local directory on a local PC where BatMail keeps his mail-files.

User-ID

This is the handle that BatMail uses to identify users in the mailsystem. When the addressbook is created by Batmail you will be prompted to add at least one user. Batmail can generate a USERID for you when you add a new user to the system. It is highly recommendable that you use this feature. However, any 8 character combination will do, as long as it is not in use by another user.

Username

This is the real name of the user and needs no further explanation.

How to register BatMail

Print Form

You register BatMail by filling out the registration form and either mail, fax or e-mail it to us.

In order to print the form you click the **Print Form** button in the **About..** form which pops-up when you leave BatMail or when you click the Menu 'Help About'-option .

Form to Clipboard

If you click the **Form to Clipboard** button the registration form will be send to the Windows Clipboard. After this you will be able to paste the registration text in your favourite word-processor and use that to fill in and print the form.

You may even paste the text into your netmailer and send it to us via the internet. If you pay by credit-card you will receive your personal BatMail copy swiftly via internet as well.

By the way...

This program is shareware. This means that you can use this program for a given time, in this case 30 days, to see if you like it. If you still use it after the trial period, the program obviously is of value to you. You are then expected to register and pay a small fee. By your support you keep the shareware principle alive which brings the world a lot of fine programs at ridiculous low prices.
