

**Envelope Printer** from Sorcerer Software  
version 1.2 - December 1996

Envelope Printer is a small Windows program designed to allow you to rapidly print addresses using the Windows 3.1 or Windows 95 operating environment/system. The program will store names and addresses as well as a return address. You can then print the addresses on #10 or #6 envelopes in either the landscape mode, as is common with Hewlett Packard inkjet printers, or in the portrait mode, as is commonly done with Canon inkjet printers. To date this program has been successfully tested with several families of printers. In addition, the program includes a "Custom" option that allows you to set your own margins. Thus, Envelope Printer can be configured to use with any printer - ink jet, laser, or dot matrix - and in landscape or portrait mode.

This program is shareware. As such, you are welcome to try it free of charge for a period of 30 days. If you find this program useful to you, and you wish to continue using it, you are expected to pay a registration fee of \$15 to Sorcerer Software. In return for your registration fee you will receive the latest version of the program plus access to technical help, if needed. You will receive the full registered version of the program, which does not contain any of the annoying registration or "nag" screens. It also includes the capability of maintaining a database of return addresses. Any corrections, additions, or other new features will also be included.

The developer of this program and its agents make no warranty as to the reliability or safety of this computer program. As with any program, use of the Envelope Printer may entail risks to the data on your program. Prudence suggests that you back up critical data on your computer before using this or any computer program for the first time in the event an unforeseen adverse event visits your computer upon the use of this program, unlikely as that may be.

Envelope Printer is a simple and intuitive program. However, help is always available by pressing the F1 key or clicking on the "Help" menu item and then on the "Contents" item.

An "Install" utility has been included to allow installation of the program from the DOS prompt. Simply type "install c" and the files will be copied to directory "ENV" on the computer's C drive.

You may register your own copy of Envelope Printer by clicking on the "Help" menu item, and then on the "Registration" item.

Any suggestions, observations, or criticisms of this program would be most welcome, and bug reports are always appreciated.
