Welcome to Keep Goin'

This program for Windows 95 lets you log right into a dial-up internet provider without hitting the "Connect" button. This program was designed to be small and unobtrusive. Simply put it into your StartUp group, and you're done. It is small, so don't worry about it chewing up memory. It is efficient, so don't worry about it slowing down your computer.

If the program is running, you won't have to hit the "Connect" button. It also takes care of busy signals. If Windows 95 pops up with a message telling you the system was busy, Keep Goin' will take over and try again. The only problem you might experience with Keep Goin' is stopping the dialing process. If you do decide that you don't really want to connect, you should stop "Keep Goin'" by clicking on the green area. The green area should turn red. Then hit Cancel to stop the dialing process.

This program is only for Windows 95 Dial-Up networking (internet or internetworking). It does not dial for you. It is not a scripting language to help you get connected. We suggest RoboDun or Microsoft Plus scripting for that. This program simply keeps you from having to click on the "Connect" button everytime you want to dial-in.

Because of this program, you should be able to (after installing Microsoft's Plus Pack) type a URL into the Start/Run dialog box on Windows 95 and have it take you all the way to your location WITHOUT HITTING "Connect"
