Getting Started

Each <u>Power Bytes</u> collection contains the finest programs on a given subject. To help you evaluate this software, we have included the <u>Power Bytes Librarian</u> program. This is a program that will:

- 1 Let you test and examine programs in the <u>Power Bytes</u> collection.
- 2 Help you find programs of interest.
- 3 Help you setup these programs on your hard drive.

The files on the CD-ROM are not compressed and some may be run directly from the CD-ROM

If a program can be run directly from the CD-ROM, the "LAUNCH" button will be enabled.

If a program needs to be installed on the Hard Disk BEFORE it can be run, the "INSTALL" button will be enabled.

If there is a special text file that you should read before installing or running the program, the " MORE INFO..." button will be lit.

How To Use the Files on This CD-Rom.

You can use any of the programs and resources on a **Power Bytes** Collection with just a few easy steps:

Step 1

Find and select a program you'd like to use. As you browse the list of programs, you will notice the description changing to explain what the current item is about. Once you find something of interest, you have several options.

Step 2

There are several buttons on the left side of the window. One or more of the buttons may be enabled. If the *INSTALL* button is active, that means that you can install the program to your hard drive. If the *LAUNCH* button is not enabled, you must setup the program on the hard disk before you can run it. If the *LAUNCH* button is enabled, you can run the program directly from the CD-ROM. If the program you're interested in is designed for DOS, it may be necessary to exit Windows and run the program directly from DOS.

Step 3

Enter the drive and directory in which the file will be placed. If the directory does not exist, the <u>Power Bytes</u> Librarian will create this directory for you. In most cases, the Librarian will suggest a directory name for you. If the program is DOS, make a note of where you create your directory so you can find it once the <u>Librarian</u> is finished! If you need help running DOS programs, click <u>here</u>.

Step 4

Run the program. If the *LAUNCH* button is active, just click on it to run the program. If you had to install the program to your hard disk and it was a Windows program, a Program Manager Group and an *ICON* will have been created for you. If you selected a DOS program (like a game), after copying the files to your hard disk, exit the *Librarian* and go to the directory you created for your files. To start the program, look for the file with a ".exe" on the end of its name. This is the main executable file for your program. Execute this file. If your program is a Windows program, double-click on the new *ICON* in your new program group.

Slide Screen

This screen offers a preview of the program. A slide presentation that can be animated or controlled by you is shown on the screen. The following buttons control the presentation.



Displays the program's next screen shot.



Stops the Slide Screen presentation.



Begins a short program, showing several screen shots automatically.



Ends the Slide Screen presentation and returns you to the main window.

Text Menu

The text files contain information on how the <u>Power Bytes</u> collections are assembled and how you can register <u>shareware</u> programs requiring registration. You will also find information about <u>Digital Impact</u>, the <u>Librarian</u>, warranties and copyrights and Technical Support. There is also information about the virus precautions taken and the utilities used.

Controls

The <u>Power Bytes Librarian</u> is equipped with a set of controls that makes using the <u>Librarian</u> quick and easy.



This button displays the Text list. You will find information about <u>shareware</u>, our warranty, copyrights, the <u>Power Bytes</u> and the <u>Digital Impact</u> Story here. Read down the list one at a time if you wish. You will also find Technical Support information here. After you have finished reading the text, you will find that the book has been replaced with a picture of a CD-ROM. (see next item)



When this picture replaces the book, it means that you can click on it and you will be returned to your prior selection.



Clicking this button will get you Help in a hurry. The help system also contains a complete tutorial on how to use the <u>Librarian</u>.



Clicking your mouse on this button will close the <u>Librarian</u> and return you to the Windows Program Manager.

The <u>Librarian</u> also has a set of buttons on the left side of the screen. These buttons perform the following functions.



Clicking your mouse on this button will run the setup to install, on your hard drive, the program you selected.



Clicking your mouse on this button will run the selected program directly from the CD-Rom. This button may not be enabled on some programs.



Clicking your mouse on this button will show any special information relating to the program you selected. This button may not be enabled on some programs.



Clicking your mouse on this button will open the <u>Slide Screen</u>. This is where you can get a brief preview of the program. Several screen shots from the program give you a feel for the program before you use it.



Clicking your mouse on this button will print the information in the text window. This button will work on any selection.

Running DOS Programs

Executing a program from DOS when your computer lacks memory

How much memory do I have?

At any DOS prompt, you should be able to type **MEM** and see a report on the screen of your current RAM memory status. The most important items on this list are the **Total memory (Total)** and the **Largest executable program size**. For certain games that require more than a certain amount of free memory, the amount should be smaller than the amount indicated by the Largest executable program size.

MEMMAKER.EXE

For minor differences between the amount of memory needed and the Largest executable program size, the **MEMMAKER** program can be used to maximize the memory configuration. One important detail is whether you need to have Expanded Memory available. Some DOS programs will require it, but you can gather more low memory (640K and below) if you disable it. Run **MEMMAKER** from the DOS prompt. Select the **Express Setup** and answer **Yes** or **No** the question about needing **Expanded Memory**. After rebooting your computer once or twice, you should be able to see a report of improvements. If you decide later that you need Expanded Memory, you can repeat this process to meet your needs.

Booting with the maximum RAM

If you simply cannot free enough memory to run a specific game, such as Doom, or you only have 4M RAM and the game requires the maximum amount, you can do one of two things.

1. Boot your computer with a blank configuration.

Reboot your computer with a reset button or CTL-ALT-DEL. When the message "Starting MS-DOS..." appears, hold down a SHIFT key until a DOS prompt appears. If you see the message "HIMEM is testing extended memory", you need to reboot and try it a little earlier the next time. At the DOS prompt, you can execute the DOS commands.

2. Boot your computer with a boot diskette.

Format a diskette from the DOS prompt with the command FORMAT A: /S

Please note: Do not try to run Windows or access your CD-ROM drive. These areas rely on information that was not loaded when your computer booted. To access them, reboot your computer normally.

Executing a DOS program from Windows 95

- Method 1 Select Start from the menu bar, and shutdown. Select Restart the computer in MS-DOS mode. At the DOS prompt, enter the DOS commands.
- Method 2 Double-click My Computer, double-click drive C: (the actual drive name may vary by configuration), double-click the target directory (for example: BC), and double click on a file name with the program icon (a white box with a blue band around it).
- Method 3 Select Start from the menu bar, select program and Windows Explorer. Find the directory of the file from the left column and double-click it. Locate the executable file from the right column and double-click it.

Shareware

Shareware software is a unique marketing approach which allows you to purchase software directly from the author. This is the Try Before You Buy concept. Shareware eliminates costly marketing, promotion, and packaging; allowing you to obtain quality software at a fraction of the commercial cost. You are encouraged to examine a program, copy it, and pass it on to friends. If you find the software program useful, you are asked to register with the software author. This usually means paying a registration fee directly to the shareware author. In return for this registration fee, you receive the right to continue to use the software and other added benefits, such as full documentation, technical support, and future updates of the program.
