

Guide To .WAV Sound Files

Here's my third batch o' WAV files. For those who didn't download WAVFLES1.ZIP or WAVFLES2.ZIP, here's some instructions: UnZip the files into your Windows Directory. Then you can assign them to different functions via the Control Panel. You do (just in case you don't know) need to have either some kind of sound board (soundblaster, etc.) or have the microsoft speaker driver installed (available here). As more get posted to BIX, I'll upload them to here.

Anyway, here's a guide to my second batch. . .

The following files should be included in **WAVFLES2.ZIP**

SNDTXT3.WRI	<i>This file. (Obviously, you have it. If you don't, tell me how you can possibly be reading it!!!)</i>
AND-NOW.WAV	<i>John Cleese from Monty Python's Flying Circus saying "And now for something completely different."</i>
FUDDHUNT.WAV	<i>"Be vewwy quiet! I'm hinting wabbits!" Guess who!</i>
KABOOM.WAV	<i>Marvin the Martian "Where's the Kaboom??!"</i>
SHORTS.WAV	<i>Bart Simpson "Eat my shorts!"</i>
MCCOY.WAV	<i>Sadly, not "He's dead, Jim." Rather, "Spock, do SOMETHING!"</i>
SCOTTY.WAV	<i>"Captain, we're losing power!"</i>
YABBA.WAV	<i>I think you can guess.</i>

In fact, I plan on downloading WAVFLES4 within a few days (Today being June 3, 1992), so, it may already be here. WAVFLES4 will DEFINATELY contain the rest of the Hogan's Heros sounds. I know I promised them in this file, but, these things happen.
