Getting Started

Each <u>SoftwareVAULT</u> collection contains thousands of programs and resources of every size and variety. To help you find your way through this sea of software, we have included the <u>SoftwareVAULT Librarian</u> program. This is a program that will

- 1 Let you sort through thousands of programs and resources in the SoftwareVAULT collections.
- 2 Help you find programs of interest.
- 3 Help you transfer these programs or resources to your hard drive so that you can use them.

Please note that to use SoftwareVAULT files you MUST transfer them to your hard drive!

The files on the CD-Rom are compressed and must be "UNZIPPED" to your hard drive so they can be accessed. (Don't worry, the Librarian does this automatically for you.)

(We "ZIP" our files up so that we can include more software on each SoftwareVAULT collection, giving you more value for your dollar.)

Tutorial... A lesson in fun

How To Use the Files on This CD-Rom.

You can use any of the thousands of programs and resources on a <u>SoftwareVAULT</u> Collection with just a few easy steps...

Step 1

Find and select a program or resource you'd like to use. You can either "browse" through various file "Groups" using the "Contents" menu item or "Find" specific subjects using the "Search" menu item. You'll discover long lists of files, each followed by a one sentence description of what that file does. Once you find one that looks interesting, double-click on it with your mouse. A "File Operations" box will appear.

Step 2

Select to "<u>Unzip</u>" the file to your hard drive. There are four different options on the "File Operations" box. You can either view extended information about the file, browse the contents of the "<u>zip</u>" file, copy the file to your hard drive, or <u>unzip</u> the file to your hard drive. If you are curious, you can view the extended information on the file you have selected. Not all files have extended information, so don't be surprised if it's the same as the one-sentence description. Unless you're a veteran SoftwareVAULT user, browsing the file contents and copying the file to your hard disk might be confusing. (Note for veteran users: "Browse file contents" serves as a handy <u>GIF</u> viewer for <u>GIF</u> files.) OTHERWISE, THE MENU OPTION YOU ALWAYS NEED TO SELECT IS "<u>UNZIP</u> TO HARD DRIVE". Selecting "<u>Unzip</u> to hard drive" will properly decompress the file and transfer it to your computer.

Step 3


Select the drive and name a directory in which to put your file. Once you've chosen to unzip the file to your hard disk, a directory selection menu will appear on your screen. Choose the directory you would like to hold the file. IT'S USUALLY A GOOD IDEA TO CREATE A NEW DIRECTORY FOR A ZIP FILE. Don't worry. The SoftwareVAULT <u>Librarian</u> can do this automatically. Simply make up a new directory name and type it in the "Dir Name" box. Note that the directory you type in will be created in "Directory" path specified under the "Dir Name" box. To change the path, click through the "Directories" selection box until you find a path that matches where you want to create your new directory. Make a note of where you create your directory so you can find it once the <u>Librarian</u> is finished! Finally, the <u>Librarian</u> will ask you if you want to "create the directory", and when it does, answer "Yes".

Step 4

Use your file. Exit the Librarian and go to the directory you created to hold your file. You will discover that your one ZIP file has probably decompressed into a collection of smaller files. To start the program, look for the file with a ".exe" on the end of it's name. This is the main executable for the program. Running it should start the program!

File Operations

This is the file operations window that appears when you double click on a file name in the <u>browser</u> window. Click on the area of the window that you are interested in.



Copy a File

To copy a file, do the following....

- When in the File <u>Browser</u> window, double click on the file you are interested in. This will cause the File Operation <u>Dialog</u> to appear.
- From the File Operation Dialog, click on "Copy To Hard Drive". This is the third item on the list of things to do.
- Selecting this option will display a "File Save As" window. Here, you will need to choose the directory where the file(s) will be copied.



If you are Copying more than one file to your hard drive, we recommend that you put each file in a different directory. If you don't, some files with common names may overwrite each other.

UnZip a File

To <u>unzip</u> a file, do the following

- When in the File <u>Browser</u> window, double click on the file you are interested in. This will cause the File Operation <u>Dialog</u> to appear.
- From the File Operation Dialog, click on "Unzip To Hard Drive". This is the fourth item on the list of things to do.
- Selecting this option will display a "File Save As" window. Here, you will need to choose the directory where the file(s) will be unzipped.



If you are unzipping more than one file to your hard drive, we recommend that you put each file in a different directory. If you don't, some files with common names may overwrite each other.

View a Picture

To view a GIF or other picture, do the following....

- When in the File <u>Browser</u> window, double click on the file you are interested in. Make sure that the <u>extension</u> of the file is ".GIF", ".<u>BMP</u>" or ".PCX". This will cause the File Operation <u>Dialog</u> to Appear.
- From the File Operation Dialog, click on "Examine File Contents". This is the second item on the list of things to do.



Loading a GIF picture for viewing may take a few moments. See the "Tutorial" section of this help file for more details on using the File Operations box. Or, press the "Show Me" button below.

Graphics Viewer

The Software <u>Librarian</u> allows you to view <u>GIF</u> (digitized pictures found in <u>Category</u> #16 of most collections) directly off the <u>SoftwareVAULT</u> CD-Rom. Select "Browse File Contents" from the "File Operations" box to view a <u>GIF</u> picture.



Loading a GIF picture for viewing may take a few moments. See the "Tutorial" section of this help file for more details on using the File Operations box. Or, press the "Show Me" button below.

Menus

From the menus listed below, you can do most anything in the <u>SoftwareVAULT Librarian</u>. The menus will assist you in navigating the <u>Librarian</u> and performing all functions.

File Menu

From the File Menu you can perform many utility functions including changing CD-Rom's, Setting up your printer, printing catalogs or setting up a BBS import of any <u>SoftwareVAULT</u> collection.

Change CD-Rom

Select "Change CD-Rom" to use other Software VAULT Collections. When you select "Change CD-Rom", be sure to place the CD-Rom you would like to use in your CD-Rom drive.



If you are running the Librarian directly from your CD, this option is disabled.

Exit

Select "Exit" to leave the SoftwareVAULT Librarian.

Contents Menu

The Contents Menu allows you to explore <u>SoftwareVAULT</u> in two different ways with either Group <u>Browser</u> or Browse-Copy Files. It also contains Hottest Hits and Statistics.

Group Browser

Brings up an array of buttons. Each button highlights a certain topic of software. Click on a button to explore the categories contained in that group. Clicking on a specific <u>category</u> will bring up a complete list of all the programs and resources contained in that <u>category</u>. Note: If there is only one <u>category</u> in that group, the files list for that <u>category</u> will immediately appear. See the Tutorial section of this help file to see how to use these programs.

Browse-Copy Files

If you don't want to sort through <u>groups</u> of software categories, you can explore the entire category list. Clicking on a specific category will bring up a complete list of all the programs and resources contained in that category. See the Tutorial section of this help file to see how to use these programs.

Hottest Hits

Each SoftwareVAULT collection contains an assortment of the very best <u>shareware</u> programs on the market today. "Hottest Hits" Info contains complete reviews of these outstanding programs.

Statistics

Statistics provides a statistical breakdown on the makeup of this SoftwareVAULT Collection. It displays File <u>Areas</u>, Total number of files in each area and the total number of File Bytes used by each area.

File Operations Box

There are four different options on the File Operations box. You can either view extended information about the file, browse the contents of the <code>zip</code> file, copy the file to your hard drive, or <code>unzip</code> the file to your hard drive. If you are curious, you can view the long description of the file you have selected. Not all files have extended information, so don't be surprised if it's the same as the one-sentence description. Unless you're a veteran SoftwareVAULT user, browsing the file contents and copying the file to your hard disk might be confusing. (Note for veteran users: Browse file contents serves as a handy <code>GIF</code> viewer for <code>GIF</code> files.) OTHERWISE, THE MENU OPTION YOU ALWAYS NEED TO SELECT IS <code>UNZIP</code> TO HARD DRIVE. Selecting <code>Unzip</code> to hard drive will properly decompress the file and transfer it to your computer. For a complete explanation of the file transfer process, see the Tutorial section of this help file.

Search Menu

The <u>SoftwareVAULT Librarian</u> allows you to search for files that interest you in several different ways:

Choose Category

Executes the Librarian's Browse-Copy function for a specific category.

Find Filename

Allows you to find files based on their title. Type a title into the <u>Find File</u> box and click on the OK button. The Librarian will assemble a list of the files with titles similar to the one you specified. See the Tutorial section of this help file to see how to use these programs.

Find Text

Allows you to run a keyword search to find files on certain subjects. Type a keyword into the Find Text box. The Librarian will sort through the descriptions of all the files on the disc and will assemble a list of files with subjects related to your keyword. See the Tutorial section of this help file to see how to use these programs.

Text Menu

The text files contain information on how the <u>SoftwareVAULT</u> collections are assembled and how you can register <u>shareware</u> programs requiring registration. You will also find information about <u>Digital Impact</u>, the copyrights on the <u>Librarian</u>, warranties and Technical Support. There is also information about the virus precautions we take and the utilities we use.

All CD's Menu

Selecting <u>All CD's</u> allows you call up a master files listing for all of the other <u>SoftwareVAULT</u> collections. The master listing is topically organized by group, using the same twelve <u>groups</u> found in the Group <u>Browser</u>. Note the number next to each file name. Each number corresponds to a collection in the <u>SoftwareVAULT</u> series.

If you would like to examine a listed file use the Change CD-Rom function found under the File menu to switch to the appropriate collection and then the Find Filename function in the Search menu to retrieve the file.



All CD's use Windows Write to view the lists of files. Windows Write is capable of searching lists for keywords as well as printing them out.

Windows Menu

The Windows menu item allows you to arrange your <u>Librarian</u> screens in various ways.

Cascade

Select <u>Cascade</u> to evenly spread your Windows across the screen.

Tile

Select <u>Tile</u> to squarely arrange your Windows side-by-side.

Arrange Icons

Select Arrange Icons to neatly arrange the icons for minimized Windows.

Close All

Select Close All to close every open window except for the main Window.

Help Menu

Selecting help opens this help file. If you are having difficulty understanding how to use this help file, click on the "Help" menu item above. Or, if you're really in a hurry, click on the <u>Speedbar</u> button.



Speedbar

The <u>SoftwareVAULT Librarian</u> is equipped with a <u>speedbar</u>. This is a group of pushbuttons that makes using the <u>Librarian</u> quick and easy.



This button will clear all windows and activate the Group <u>Browser</u>. This is the series of large picture buttons in the center of the main screen.



This button will activate the search by <u>category</u> function. A list showing all categories available will pop-up and you will be allowed to select a <u>category</u> to browse.



This button displays the Find Text window. This is where you enter any text that you want to find, and the Librarian will find all files with this text in their description.



Clicking your mouse on this button will close the Librarian and return you to the Windows Program Manager. This has the same effect as selecting "Exit" from the File Menu.



Clicking this button will get you Help in a hurry.

Keyboard

Alt-F - Activates the File menu.

Alt-C - Activates the Contents menu.

Alt-S - Activates the Search menu.

Alt-T - Activates the Text menu.

Alt-A - Activates the All CD's menu.

Alt-W - Activates the Windows menu.

Alt-H - Activates the Help menu.

Active File

This area displays the actual name of the file that you want extra information on, to see the contents of, or to copy / <u>unzip</u> to your hard drive.

Browse File Contents

If the file you are interested in is a $\underline{\text{Zip}}$ file, the file will be unzipped in memory and the contents of the file will be displayed in a list.

If the file is a graphics file (with a .GIF extension), the Librarian's graphics viewer will display the picture.

Cancel Button

Clicking on this button will cancel your request and return you to the prior window.

Copy To Hard Drive

Selecting this option will display a "File Save As" window. Here, you will need to choose the directory where the file(s) will be copied.



If you are Copying more than one file to your hard drive, we recommend that you put each file in a different directory. If you don't, some files with common names may overwrite each other.

Extended Information

In many cases, there is additional information about each file. Clicking on this option will display this information.

Ok Button

Clicking on this button will process your request.

System Button

This is a small menu that will allow you to move the window with the keyboard arrows, close the window or call the Windows Task Manager.

Title Bar

This displays the name that the window is called. It is common to the Microsoft Windows Operating System.

Unzip To Hard Drive

Selecting this option will display a "File Save As" window. This is where you choose the directory to <u>unzip</u> the file(s).



If you are unzipping more than one file to your hard drive, we recommend that you put each file in a different directory. If you don't, some files with common names may overwrite each other.

All CD's

This is a reference to a history file of all CD-Rom collections from the SoftwareVAULT.

Areas

An Area is a sub-directory on the CD-Rom that contains all files of a simular nature, i.e. "Games". We also use the word "Category" interchangeably with "Area".

Arrange Icons

As windows are minimized, they are represented on your desktop by little pictures... also known as icons. This command puts them all neatly in a row.

BMP

BMP stands for Bit MaPped graphic. This is a common graphics type used by Windows programs. A .BMP graphic can also be used for Windows wallpaper.

Browser

This is the large list box that allows you to see a listing of the files in a given Area or Category.

ByteOne byte equals one character.

Cascade

An arrangement of windows on a screen that looks much like a deck of cards sideways. You can see the top window in full, and you can also see the title bar of each winodw behind the top one.

Category

An Category refers to a group of files on the CD-Rom that contain files of a similar nature, i.e. "Games". We also use the word interchangeably with "Area".

Close All

This means to close (not minimize) all windows except the main window. This command is fast and absolute.

Dialog

A window that asks you a question requiring a response, or giving you an information message.

Digital ImpactThe company that produces the SoftwareVAULT collections of CD-Roms.

Extension

The part of the filename that comes after the period. For example, if the file was called "MYNAME.EEE", the "EEE" would be the extension.

Find File

Using the File File dialog from the Search Menu, you may enter any filename (or part of a filename) for the Librarian to search for.

GIF

Graphics Interchange Format. This is a picture format created by Compuserve and is very popular.

Groups

A Group may contain references to one or more Areas or Categories. If a Group button on the main window is "grayed out", it means that there are no files or Areas that apply to that collection.

Librarian

This is the Files Manager designed for and used by the SoftwareVAULT collections.

PCX

An image file common to PC Paintbrush published by Zsoft. This application comes with the Microsoft Windows Operating System and can be found in the Accessories group on most computers that use the Microsoft Windows Operating System.

Shareware

Shareware software is a unique marketing approach which allows you to purchase software directly from the author. This eliminates costly marketing, promotion, and packaging; allowing you to obtain quality software at a fraction of the commercial cost. You are encouraged to examine a program, copy it, and pass it on to friends. If you find the software program useful, you are asked to register with the software author. This usually means paying a registration fee directly to the shareware author. In return for this registration fee, you receive the right to continue to use the software and added benefits such as full documentation, technical support, and future updates of the program. This is the Try-Before-You-Buy concept.

SoftwareVAULT

The name of a series of CD-Roms produced by Digital Impact. These CD-Roms contain Shareware files and programs, Public Domain files and programs, and Pictures or Clip Art that is Free.

Speedbar

A bar containing buttons or picture buttons. This bar is usually across the top of an application program and is also called a toolbar. It's purpose is to provide a fast access to common functions.

Tile

An arrangement of windows that looks like the wall tile in a shower. Each winodw has its own square.... or tile.

Unzip

The process of removing (uncompressing) files from their envelope. This is the opposite of Zipping (or compressing) the files.

Zip

A process of compressing many files into one file. This process saves space and insures that files stay together.
