LAN Licensing

If you want to run The American Heritage Dictionary on a network, call WordStar for licensing information.

Setup Under PC Tools for Windows

If you check "Start Up Automatically" in Setup, Setup will add a program item for American Heritage Dictionary to your Startup folder. If your Startup folder is in a different desktop than the one Setup is on, PC Tools will create a new Startup folder in the current desktop instead of using the original one. To work around this problem, start Setup from the desktop that contains your active Startup folder or move The American Heritage Dictionary program item to the correct folder after Setup is complete.

If you use Setup to reinstall or remove The American Heritage Dictionary, you should also ensure that you run Setup from the desktop that contains the Startup and American Heritage Dictionary folders.

Using AHD with Norton Desktop for Windows

If you use Norton Desktop for Windows, be sure you have the following entry in the [Quick Access] section of the NDW.INI file:

FakeProgman=1

This allows Setup to insert icons in the program group it creates.

Problems Creating Program Groups

Some shell programs do not support program groups. If Setup fails to create program group items, try installing with a shell that supports program groups, or try using one of the generic display drivers provided with Windows 3.1.

Display Problems

If you have problems displaying definitions or fonts, make sure you have the latest Windows 3.1 display drivers for your display card. If you do not have the specific driver for your card, use the generic display drivers provided with Windows 3.1 for VGA or Super VGA.
