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# Introduction



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## What is Smartdate?

SmartDate is a diary/calendar/wallplanner application for Microsoft Windows 3.1.

Instead of running as a separate application which you have to start up, minimize and maximize and so on, SmartDate actually draws the calendar on the Windows Desktop and all operations are performed there. You never need to scabble around looking for your calendar application, and by holding down the right mouse button on the control menu of any Window (in the top left corner) or on the desktop you will jump straight to Smartdate, and when you let go of the right mouse button your previous window layout will be automatically restored.

You can also use SmartDate a lot like a wallplanner, and can mark individual important dates with different colors, perhaps to indicate vacations and so on.

There is also a central area where you can load a bitmap of your choice (in the registered version) to customize your desktop, perhaps with a pretty girl or pictures of the family.

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# The Menu Options



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## Configuring SmartDate

You can change the fonts, colors and alarm sounds that SmartDate uses, and you can also put any bitmap of your own choice in the central "panel", or even have the central pictures chosen randomly for variety.

To access the menu for changing SmartDate's configuration, simply position the mouse-pointer over any part of the desktop calendar, hold down the left mouse button and click with the right mouse button and the menu will appear.

## The Menu Options

### Font

Allows you to select the font to use for the calendar from all those available on your system. Whilst you can change the point-size to enlarge the sample shown in the dialog box, SmartDate calculates the correct size of font to use to correctly fit the calendar on the screen, and will ignore your selection.

### Colors

#### Background Color

Allows you to select any color for the background of the calendar.

#### Today Date Color

Specifies the color to use for "today". Note that this overrides any other color selection setting for this day.

#### Color Group 0 ..... Color Group 7

Defines the color of each "color group". Each date can be assigned to a particular color group, and the date will display in the color defined for that group. If you subsequently redefine the color for that group all the dates in the group will also change color. The default color group for a date is group 0 unless subsequently changed by the user.

### Alarm Sounds

#### Alarm Type 1 Wav ... Alarm Type 8 Wav

Defines the \*.WAV file that will accompany reminders set with the corresponding Alarm Type. A Standard file-navigation box is presented from which to select the \*.WAV files. If your system cannot play \*.WAV files then a simple beep will accompany any reminder.

### Central Bitmap

#### Select Image...

This option allows you to choose any bitmap (\*.BMP) to put in the centre of the calendar. A normal file-selection dialog is presented, and you can choose any image that your video card is capable of displaying. There is also the option to select images "randomly" from the same directory, and you can also specify how often (in minutes) the image is randomly changed. Pictures of the family or pretty girls might be appropriate here. The registered version remembers your selection from run to run, the

shareware version does not.

Note that SmartDate makes no attempt to resize the image to fit. If the image is smaller than the central area, it will be centralized. If it is larger then that prtion that exceeds the right and lower boundaries of the central area will be clipped.

If you need to resize or otherwise manipulate graphics for the central area, an extremely good product is Paint-Shop Pro, from JASC. Inc.. Pain-Shop Pro is available from all ggod shareware sources.

### **Reset Color Palette**

If you have a 256 color video subsystem, and there are two applications both trying to display a different set of 256 colors, something has to give. Windows attempts to mediate between the different applications that are running as best it can, but the poor old desktop always comes last in priority for choosing colors. Using this option can force SmartDate to realize the desktop palette and correctly display the colors in the selected bitmap. You will soon know if you need to use this option! See also the notes about conflicting colors under the section on choosing the calendar paper texture.

### **Clear**

Resets the central image to the built-in logo.

### **Paper Texture**

#### **Select Bitmap...**

Allows you to choose a bitmap to be repeatedly tiled across the background of each month of the calendar before the dates are overlayed, and tiled across any spare space in the central area.

Some bitmaps work very well as a background, usually those that are more of a "pattern" than an actual image. Images with strong geometrical repetitions may or may not work well, as the repetitions may not always align perfectly as each month is built individually. The best thing to do is experiment!

Note also that color conflicts can again arise on palette-based (usually 256 color) displays. Priority is always given to the central image, and if the "Paper Texture" image has colors which are not components of the central image then those colors will not always appear correctly.

### **Plain**

Resets the calendar paper to a plain image without a bitmap, and colors it according to the specification of the "Background Color" in the "Colors" section of the menu.

### **Exit**

Terminates SmartDate and replaces your Windows Desktop with whatever was there before (wallpaper or pattern etc.).

### **Quick Explanation**

Presents a dialog box which explains in simple terms the operation of the mouse with SmartDate. There is a fuller explanation in the section

Jumps to this Help File.

## **About**

Displays a standard "About" box.

## **Order Form**

Jumps to an order form giving details of how to order (more) copies of SmartDate and giving local addresses and phone numbers.

# Using the Mouse



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Understanding the action of the mouse is crucial to effective use of SmartDate. There are three main operations:-

## Accessing the menu

To access the menu you have to be able to see a portion of the Windows desktop, with the SmartDate calendar on it. You then need to position the mouse pointer anywhere on the calendar, hold down the left mouse button, and click with the right mouse button. This can take a bit of getting used to and is worth practising.

## Looking at the calendar and individual days

To see the complete calendar, either

- 1 Position the mouse-pointer over any visible portion of the calendar and press and hold down the right mouse button, or
- 2 Position the mouse-pointer over the control-menu of any window, and press and hold down the right mouse button. (The control menu is the dash to the left of the caption bar of the window, where the name of the window normally is).

All the windows currently on-screen will vanish, enabling you to see the complete calendar. The current day's events will appear in a window in the centre of the screen, and you can use the left mouse button to scroll up and down the list as usual. To move to another date simply click on the date you require with the left mouse button. Note that you must keep the right mouse button depressed during these operations.

When you release the right mouse button all the windows that were previously on-screen will re-appear just as before.

## Updating a particular day's entries

To update the entries for a particular day simply click on the day in question with the left mouse button, while holding down the SHIFT key. You may need to move some windows out of the way first to be able to see the day you require.

A dialog box will then appear from where you can make the entries you require. Use of the dialog box is further explained in the section:-

# Making Calendar Entries



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## Accessing the Update Dialog

To access the Update Dialog simply click on the day in question with the left mouse button, while holding down the SHIFT key. You may need to move some windows out of the way first to be able to see the day you require.

## The Update Dialog

The dialog box that is presented consists of two main sections. The top section has a listbox containing a slot for every fifteen minutes where you can add entries and specify reminders and alarms. The bottom section is a freeform entry box in which you can add notes particular to that day. Just below that is a drop-down list box which displays the color of each color-group, from where you can select the color you want the date to display in on the calendar.

## Updating an interval

To add an entry for a particular interval, select that interval in the list box, and press the "Update Interval" button. The subsequent dialog box has the following options:-

### Text

Type in the text you wish to appear in the list, and on the reminder that will appear at or after the specified time if you decide to have an alarm on this entry.

### Issue as command

If you check this box then rather than a reminder appearing, the text will be assumed to be a command to be executed. You could use this for example to automate logons to an E-Mail service, or perhaps to automate backups.

Note that the command will only be issued if you select an Alarm Type (see below), although the associated Wave file will not play.

### Ignore if late

If you check this box then the alarm or command will only be issued if SmartDate is actually active during the relevant quarter hour period. If the box is not checked then any "missed" alarms or commands during the period when SmartDate wasn't running or the PC was switched off will be issued when SmartDate next starts.

### Alarm

If left at <None> no reminder will be issued. Selecting any of the other 8 Alarm Type options will cause a reminder dialog to appear at the appropriate time, accompanied by the WAV file defined from the main menu for that Alarm Type.

Note that the WAV file doesn't sound if the "Issue as command" option is selected.

### Repeat "n" times, once every ????

You can also specify that SmartDate add additional repeating entries based on your selections in these controls. You can add a maximum of 999 entries automatically this way, perhaps for example to enter a meeting always arranged for 16.00 on a Thursday afternoon.

### **Clearing an interval**

Simply select the interval you want to clear and press the "Clear Interval" button. If the entry was in fact part of a repeated group you will be given the option to clear all the repeated entries as well.

### **Adding freeform notes**

Simply type into the freeform text box.

### **Selecting the date color**

Simply select the color you want from the drop-down list box.



# Starting SmartDate Automatically



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You can cause SmartDate to run automatically every time you start Windows by simply putting an icon for it in the StartUp group in Program manager.

One simple way of achieving this is by using "drag and drop" from the file manager. Follow these steps:-

- 1 Open the Program Manager, and open up the Startup group by double-clicking on it.
- 2 Start the Windows File Manager
- 3 Arrange Program Manager and File Manager so that you can see both on your screen.
- 4 In File Manager, navigate to the directory SmartDate is in (probably C:\SMARTDTE or similar) and locate the SMARTDTE.EXE file.
- 5 Position the mouse-pointer over the SMARTDTE.EXE file, depress and hold down the left mouse-button, drag the mouse to the Open Startup group in Program manager, and release the left mouse button.

You might like to print out these instructions before you try. You can do so by selecting the "Print Topic" entry from the "File" menu above.

# Networking SmartDate



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**Please note that to run SmartDate across a network (other than for evaluation purposes) you need a licence for the number of PC's that will be using SmartDate. A single copy licence does not entitle you to run SmartDate on more than one PC on a Network.**

**We can offer extremely attractive prices for multi-copy licences. Please contact us for details.**

This version of Smartdate does not have any built-in network awareness, and problems will arise if you try to execute it from more than a single PC from a shared location.

SmartDate keeps its Calendar File (SMARTDTE.SCF) in the same location as the program was executed from. If multiple users execute the program from the same location they will use the same Calendar File, and this will cause data corruption and lost updates.

To prevent this, and share a single copy of the program, you can pass as a parameter the path where you want the Calendar File to reside when you execute SmartDate. Note that this option is only available in the registered version.

If you choose to signify an alternative location for the Calendar File you can either copy a valid Calendar File to that location, or you will get two error messages as SmartDate attempts to read a non-existent Calendar File and it's backup, after which SmartDate will automatically create a new, empty Calendar File.

**Please contact us if you are interested in the Networking Version of SmartDate which allows data to be displayed simultaneously from both a common calendar, shared by all but updated by only one, and individual user calendars. This can make SmartDate the ideal tool to replace those holiday lists, meeting diaries and wallplanners that litter the modern office.**

# Backup



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Backing up your data is crucial. If you have a problem and call us for help we may well ask you to restore your calendar file to the last good backup you have.

**If you haven't got a backup we are unlikely to be able to help you!**

Your calendar data is held in a file called SMARTDTE.SCF which will be in the same directory as the program. Please back it up regularly. If you don't adopt a regular backup routine perhaps now would be a good time to start.

# Shareware



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This product is Shareware. Shareware is a form of software distribution, not free software. If you have not already registered this product, you have the right to evaluate it for a period of 30 days from the date you initially install it. If you find that it suits your needs and you wish to continue to use it after the 30 day period you are required to register it by paying the registration fee to Oakley Data Services. There are significant advantages to registering your copy, not least the continued availability of good quality software at reasonable prices.

You also have the right, and in fact you are actively encouraged, to distribute copies of the Shareware version of this product. 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## Registering

Registration of a single copy of SmartDate allows you to use it on a single PC, and to make back-up copies for security purposes. It does not permit installation on more than 1 PC at the same time, or use on multiple workstations connected to a network.

### Please let us know which version you currently have

If you register by phone, please let us know which version of the program you currently have (shown as R1.0 or similar on the program caption). # Upgrade Policy and Getting Support



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## Upgrade Policy

The code (.EXE file) for the registered and unregistered versions of the program are identical, and it is the presence of a file SMTDTE1X.DLL that is supplied with the registered version that causes the program to behave in a registered fashion. The presence of the DLL will also cause any further versions of SmartDate that still bear the 1.x release number to behave as registered versions, wherever you obtain them from. Versions that bear the 1.x release number will generally be for minor enhancements and bug-fixes. Any release containing major new functionality will bear the release number 2.x, and an upgrade fee will probably be chargeable.

We will make new versions of SmartDate available via the usual sources, online on services such as CompuServe, CIX and the Internet and via disk vendors, cover disks and CD's.

The prime location for new releases is our support section on CompuServe, section 4 of the UKSHARE forum. The latest versions of all our products are available in Library 4.

If you do acquire a newer version of SmartDate simply ensure that the SMTDTE1X.DLL file you got when you registered is either in the directory that the SmartDate program is in, or is in your WINDOWS directory.
