Use for drop caps or to suggest an old-document-style script. Modeled after the handwritten letters of Thomas Jefferson Rusk and other Texas heroes. Works well with page-layout, illustration software, etc. PostScript Type 1 version (TrueType also available). Install as usual.

This shareware offering has a single weight with upper and lower cases, numerals, punctuation, and some diacriticals. Users who pay the \$10 shareware fee will receive a copy of Texas Hero<sup>™</sup> with a much-expanded character set — in fact, more than 40 extra alternate characters, ligatures, and common words. I'll also send along a trial font or two and news of any additional utilities or other products I might by then have available.
