Windows Start Program 1.2

Windows Start Program is a handy little utility that can be used to further customize your Windows start up. I thought of it when I saw someone's AUTOEXEC.BAT file that would run his virus scanner on Thursdays. That didn't do me much good as I use Norton Anti-virus for Windows, and so I wrote Start to fill the bill inside Windows. It then expanded to include the ability to start as many as seven program on any day or days of the week. It should be pretty self explanatory to use, but here are some things to note:

- in order to run properly (or at all for that matter), Start needs to have BWCC.DLL placed in a directory along your path. The WIndows directory will do nicely. This is the file that give you those nice, fancy buttons and controls from Borland. I included a copy with the ZIP file. If you already have it, use the most updated version.

- Start will work best for you if you place it in your start up group in Windows 3.1. Any Windows 3.0 users should upgrade to 3.1, but short of that, they can enter Start's path along the 'Run=' line in win.ini. Start will work only in Windows 3.0 if you have the file 'COMMDLG.DLL'. This comes with Windows 3.1, and I think it is available from Microsoft. I personally have Start as the only icon in my startup group and let it do all the work.

- You can set the timer from 1 to 10 seconds to delay Start before it executes. This allows you access to the programs features, as well as to chose programs that you may or may not want to run. You can use the 'Stop Timer' button to take all the time you need to configure Start.

- This version now has the ability to recognize if you have run a program once in a day already. If I run my anti-virus program once, I don't want to have to do it again if I reboot, so I set it to run only once per day. This option is available in the 'Configure' dialog box. You can also choose to run a program minimized.

- Start creates a somewhat lengthy STARTPRG.INI file in your Windows directory. I am working on storing the data a bit more efficiently. You can edit that file as desired.

- Start is not minimizable, but it does have an icon courtesy of PROGMAN.EXE from Windows.

- Use the configure dialog box to set up your programs as you like. The browse button will find programs for you using the Windows Common Dialogs. Extensions for programs can be configured, but please note that this string must be specifically configured as '*.xxx' separated by semi-colons. I will work on making it possible to run programs based on their associated extension, but right now this doesn't want to work. You can supply parameters for any program that will accept them in the parameters edit box.

I am distributing this program as shareware. Take a look at, use it, and if you like it and want to keep using it, please send me one dollar. That's really not much at all. I hate looking at a shareware program that is cool but is way over priced. This one is not. I haven't included any form of cripple-ware or any registration routines. I am relying on your integrity. I won't get into the definition of shareware or lay any big guilt trips on you, but don't use shareware if you don't pay for it. It's only fair. I don't provide any support or manuals or anything. That would be a bit ridiculous for this program, don't you think? Sending in money gives you peace of mind, though. Pretty nice thing to have. Plus, I might just write that specific little utility you wished someone would write if I get a reasonable amount of support.

This program may be distributed by any Shareware reseller as long as only a reasonable charge

is asked for the distribution disks. STARTPRG.ZIP itself or any of it's components may not be sold for any price. It may be freely distributed as long as it is not altered in any way and this Write file and the executable file are included with it.

I distribute this program 'as is' with no guarantees of performance or compatibility with anything at any time. I won't be held liable for anything that gets broken because of this program. Use it at your own risk. (Pretty official, huh?).
