The problem occurred when setting up Lotus 2.3 on NetWare Lite. The user received the message that the LICENSE.000 file could not be found.

Also, the user needed to configure Lotus to use environment files in personal subdirectories--one for each user.

SOLUTION

Setup a subdirectory called "LOTSHARE" directly off the root. Within the LOTSHARE subdirectory create a directory called "123.v23"(for version 2.3). Then find the COUNT.EXE file. Execute COUNT.EXE and tell Lotus how many licenses there are. Lotus is a very trusting program and will allow the user to specify the number of licenses they have.

To access Lotus over a mapped drive, make sure to map the drive to the ROOT, not just the Lotus subdirectory. If a drive is mapped to a Lotus subdirectory the LOTSHARE directory will not be found and the error that the LICENSE.000 file could not be found will be returned.

It is best to put the personal subdirectories in the same subdirectory as the rest of the Lotus files. To create a personal subdirectory, first, make a directory using the name of the user. For example:

MD TOM. This will create a directory named TOM.

Then type "NEWUSER TOM." The newuser command puts four files in the personal directory.

Finally, on each of the client machines, add to the path the Lotus subdirectory and the personal subdirectory. To verify that Lotus is using the files from the personal subdirectory start Lotus and select Worksheet, Global, Default, Status. At the bottom of the window Lotus will show the path and file of the 123.CNF file it is currently using.

the same test with the NE2000 drivers everything worked fine.

SOLUTION

Switch to certified drivers.

The kit which the user received only had one serialized copy of NetWare Lite (one program diskette and one driver diskette). The user

had to go through Microwave, (800) 888-6341, to get the other serialized copy.

In addition, with few exceptions, SHARE only needs to be loaded on the server where the files are being shared. There is one application that requires SHARE to be loaded on both the server and client workstation and that is LIBRA.

The problem occurs when the network administrator has named one or more of the servers with a subset of another server name. Example:

This example is one that will have problems because the first server has a name that is a subset of the other two.

The problem has been verified by Novell Engineering. It is a problem with a C compare function.

SOLUTION

Use names that are not a subset of another server. An example of correct naming is given below:

2.	server2
3.	server3

This example contains three distinctly different names (strings) which create no problems with data corruption.

However, when CLIENT and SERVER are loaded on the fourth machine the two middle machines (nodes two and three) would drop off and the two outside machines (nodes one and four) could still see each other.

SOLUTION

After trying many options (such as swapping cable, cards, and machines), a virus scan was done and the user found the PACMAN virus was causing the problem.

The LPT1 port was not working correctly. It was necessary to switch the printer to the physical LPT2 port and it worked fine. Then put the printer, that was originally on LPT2 (and working fine), to the LPT1 port. Switching the printers fixed the problem.

The user was able to remove the NWLITE directory. The syntax was:

DATAFLEX told the user that the DFRUN startup option was not the proper way to start the program as it did not release memory when unloaded. The startup option FLEX was the proper method of executing the program, which releases the memory. After changing to FLEX instead of DFRUN, the problems went away.

In this case when the user tried to reissue the CAPTURE command, to reestablish the connection, errors "0x55" or "0x49" would be reported at the client machine. Sometimes an error message would report that the requested setup string was not defined. However, the user had not requested a setup string.

SOLUTION

The key clue to the problem is the message about the setup string. The message indicates that the resource database for the network printer is corrupted. The symptom may be caused by corruption in the printer resource, or any of the other resource databases, that reside in the C:\NWLITE\NLCNTL subdirectory.

To solve the problem first try deleting the network printer definition and redefining it. If that doesn't work delete the entire NWLITE directory (verify that C:\NWLITE is gone), then reinstall the directory. If there are other servers on the network the user accounts will be restored automatically when the server is brought back up on the network. However, the databases on the other servers may be corrupt also. Once a clean database has been created, save it with the "server system files" option.

Note: Anytime there is an increase in the /L: parameter in MS-DOS SHARE, it is important to also increase the /F: parameter. The /F: reserves the memory space for MS-DOS to keep track of the actual locks (information such as the filename and the path where it exists). The MSDOS 5.0 manual recommends that anytime there is an increase the file locks (/L:xx) by one, it is necessary to increase the (/F:xxxx) by 20, (the MS DOS SHARE defaults are /L:20, and /F:2048). Keep in mind

that this is for MS-DOS only. DR DOS has no /F: parameter, because DR DOS is self configurable.

The user had a three node NetWare Lite network, primarily using two applications (called A and B), both applications were network three-user versions. The user found that if application A was running anywhere on the network then application B would not run. Also, only one user could use application A at a time.

However, if application A was not running then the user could get all three clients to use application B. Although, application B would exhibit various symptoms; it would either start to load then hang just that machine or the server; or the monitor would have garbage on it; or the application would abort and return the user to DOS.

SOLUTION

To fix the problem increase client tasks. In this case application A used eight tasks per user, while application B used three. The fact that B had such a spectrum of symptoms is unusual. A tip off that there are insufficient tasks are the number of users and or applications running affecting the network. This problem can also manifest itself as an inability to print although the application appears to function otherwise.

To increase client tasks, do the following steps:

- 1) Bring up the NET utility.
- 2) Select "Supervise the network" option.
- 3) Select "Server configuration" option.
- 4) Select the server to be configured.
- 5) Highlight the value for client tasks (under the future column); type in the new value; press escape twice.
- 6) Answer Yes to save the change.
- 7) Reboot the machine for the change to take effect.

It didn't matter which machine had a key pressed or which network printer was being used. However, it was discovered that loading the 3c503.COM driver was producing a warning about shared memory.

SOLUTION

The first step to solving the problem is to clear up the 3c503 driver warning. The message is easy to miss because it is embedded in some other text, which appears as part of the normal loading sequence. The problem is that the 3c503 driver comes from the factory with shared memory disabled. However, NetWare Lite creates the NET.CFG file with shared memory configured at c8000. The solution is to set the 3c503 jumper to c8000, or remove the "mem" line from the NET.CFG file. Once this was done the problem disappeared.

After running STARTNET.BAT on those two machines, everything would work fine until (at some later time) when attempting to load the NET3 shell. The problem occurred after loading the shell, every time, when issuing a NetWare Lite command (anything proceeded by "NET"), the error, "Increase lastdrive statement in CONFIG.SYS or delete drive mappings", would be displayed. Changing the lastdrive statement in the CONFIG.SYS to several different drive letters did not work. Tried deleting all the mappings in the login scripts, but nothing worked.

SOLUTION

Checking the date of the NET3 shell showed it was a 9/23/88 release. By updating to a 2/6/91 release, on the machine using NetWare Lite, it fixed the problem.

After attempting many possible solutions some indications showed up that pointed to the BIOS on the machine. The user switched to another machine, and it worked fine.

The message, "DOS Extended Error 59" is a DOS error message that is caused by NetWare Lite and an error code NetWare Lite is passing to DOS. From the standpoint of NetWare Lite the message indicates that the client tried to talk to the server 15 times and failed. The connection is marked 'bad' and the error is passed to DOS.

Currently, the problem is being attributed to bad LAN cables, NIC cards, or simply the machine itself. Also, slowing the machine down seems to help sometimes.

The problem has only come up with DOS 5.0 and the DOSSHELL command being eight levels deep.

There are several different types of internal error messages used in NetWare Lite. Each error message is a four digit number. The first two digits represent the source of the message:

50xx (from the server)
49xx (from the client)

The second two digits identify the actual error that occurred. When client receives an error message from server (50xx) it translates the message into an EXTENDED DOS ERROR 59 and gives it to DOS. DOS then reports it, which is why the user was receiving the messages, while having no idea what they specifically represent.

Insufficient client tasks are an example of this type of error. If the server runs out of client tasks, then it sends an error (something like 5045) to the client that, in turn, tells DOS to give an EXTENDED ERROR 59.

After the ERROR WAIT TIME has expired the message comes up and data stops being sent to the printer. If there is no operator intervention, and 5 minutes have passed, the server will start sending where it left off.

Then, Windows was executed on the client machine, and the server/client was re-booted. The user exited to DOS on the client, and everything seemed fine. Performing the Net CAPTURE again returned the beginnings of the normal screen output:

The machine would freeze for a few seconds, and then it would display:

When the user retried the command the system returned the following message:

Obviously, while the user was in Windows the connection was not reestablished when Startnet was executed on the server. The connection did reestablish when the user tried the Net CAPTURE the first time.

There were different results if the user was in a network directory when

Windows was executed from the client. When the user tried to exit Windows, the program would not let the user out the first time. Windows also returned the "Error reading device NWLITE" message. The second time the user tried, Windows let the user out and the Net CAPTURE worked fine.

In this case, when talking about "Net CAPTURE" it means just doing a "Net CAPTURE" to see what had already been captured.

SOLUTION

When the server with the printer attached is re-booted, then the client loses its connection if it is Windows. That client must somehow reestablish connection with the server before trying to print anything.

Some ways to do it are the following:

- 1) Exit out of Windows and execute the DIR command on a network directory (physically on the server).
- 2) Perform a Net CAPTURE once Windows is exited on the client. It will return an error, but it will still reestablish the connection.

Therefore, this product cannot be used with NetWare Lite.

Note: The reason that the TSRs do not work with NetWare Lite is because NetWare Lite prints directly to the hardware. NetWare Lite does not issue interrupt 17 calls to do the printing. The TSRs used in the Chinese program traps interrupt 17, and because NetWare Lite does not use interrupt 17, there is nothing to trap.

Symptoms: The server pauses for 70 seconds or longer. Most users may think the server is hung because no foreground activity is occurring and the server is not answering requests from clients. However, the server does eventually return; the foreground activity resumes; no time is lost on the system clock; and if the client retries its request, the response is sent. The slower the user's hardware is, the more likely the user is to see this problem and the longer the pause is likely to last.

Using dedicated IPX drivers with NetWare Lite software is not officially supported by Novell. But in this case, they are the only option if the DEC Ethernet LAN cards are used.

If forced to use a dedicated IPX driver in NetWare Lite software, do the following:

1. Select the appropriate LAN driver during the installation.
2. Edit the STARTNET.BAT file so that it loads the desired IPX.COM

(then SHARE, SERVER, CLIENT) instead of Link Support Layer (LSL), <odi mlid>, and IPXODI.

3. Also if it is necessary to load IPX with a different configuration, then change the NET.CFG file created during the install to reflect that change.

If captured to LPT1, where a physical port did exist, the application printed fine. PFS first directly examines the hardware, bypassing DOS, and confirms that a port physically exists. If the port exists, then everything works fine. Lotus 123 v3.0 and v3.1 single user versions work the same way.

When the user ran the server and client (both in conventional memory), two strange NetWare mappings were automatically made to the NLCNTL directories of different servers. Then when the user tried to capture the printer ports, the system displayed errors indicating that the file server could not be found or that there was no printer by that name.

SOLUTION

Replacing the CNET card with a certified Gateway card (16bit) solved the problem.

NetWare Lite generates two kinds of messages. The messages start with either "Status Report xx: " or a number like "0x4409." Some operations, such as logging in, cause one or two mappings to be made to the hidden directory. When the operation has successfully completed, these mappings should be deleted. It is possible that a failed login, or partially completed login, left the mappings intact.

An interesting, but probably not well known, fact about Novell's certification process, Independent Manufacturer's Support Program (IMSP), is that Novell does not certify cards but certifies the drivers in specific environments. A card which is known to work with a certified dedicated IPX driver may not necessarily work with an ODI driver. Many times, Novell has seen users using an NE2000 compatible card

that was certified with a linked IPX.COM that would not work with the newest ODI NE2000.COM.

After the user replaced all the Thomas Conrad adapters with Compex adapters into 16-bit servers, the problems were solved.
