## **Requirements:**

BananaPC is a 32-bit software program that has been tested on the following platforms:

- Windows NT
- Windows NT with the Windows 95 Shell Beta release
- Windows 95 Beta release
- NOTE: Use of this program under Windows 95 or Windows NT with the Windows 95 Shell is restricted to only when the TaskBar is located on the bottom of the display. Because BananaPC requires the top of the display, moving the TaskBar to the sides or top of the display will cause a contention for that space between BananaPC and Windows. The result of this contention will be that your system will appear to hang and will need to be shut down in order to regain control.

BananaPC was written as a Windows NT Program. It will run under Windows 95, but some of the Banana Menu utilities may not work from initially. For instance, the **MS-DOS Prompt** menu item will need to be changed from *cmd.exe* to *command.com* in order to work.

## **Memory Requirements:**

Unknown.

The author is certain that this program will work with your memory, no matter what kind you have.

## Why does this program exist anyway?

BananaPC is a NagWare Windows Shell-enhancement that performs the following functions:

- Single-click launch of utilities and applets
- Displays system time
- Eyes that follow cursor while in BananaPC window
- Task menu displays running applications and can: Hide or show running applications Quickly and easily switch between running applications

BananaPC is not a replacement shell for any version of Windows. It was designed to overcome some of the shortcomings of Windows by providing a more usable interface that works with the current and future Windows shells. BananaPC greatly enhances the functionality of Windows NT, while providing some conveniences for Windows 95 users and users of the Windows 95 shell on NT.

## Installing BananaPC

The NagWare version of BananaPC is comprised of 3 files:

- BANANAPC.EXE
- BANANAPC.HLP
- BANANAPC.MNU

These files are distributed together as BANANAPC.ZIP. Simply unZip BANANAPC.ZIP into the directory where BananaPC will reside. As BananaPC is used, it will create an eighth file (BANANAPC.INI) in the same directory as the executable.

## **UnInstalling BananaPC**

To remove all traces of this program from your system, delete the following files from the BananaPC directory:

- BANANAPC.EXE
- BANANAPC.HLP
- BANANAPC.MNU
- BANANAPC.INI

## Configuration

BananaPC configuration is quite simple. There are only two things that can be configured.

## Banana Menu Items

The Banana Menu is the first menu item on the BananaPC Program - it looks kinda-sorta like a banana. In the Banana Menu are various useful utilities and applets that can be brought up quickly when using various applications.

## **BananaPC**

Configuring BananaPC allows you to setup the program to your own tastes. It involves various display settings for the BananaPC display, as well as settings for the BananaPC clock.

## **Display Configuration**

## Always on Top

Keeps the BananaPC program above all other programs. BananaPC will automatically resize any part of a window that it might obscure so that the window is displayed properly.

## Use 3D Display

Gives the BananaPC that Windows 95 3D look.

#### Use Icons in Menu

Not currently implemented. If enough people register this program, I may find it feasible to implement this feature. For now, the work involved outweighs the benefits.

## **New Shell Configuration**

#### Adjust for TaskBar

Causes BananaPC to locate the TaskBar (only in Windows 95 or new NT Shell) and adjust any application windows that might be obscured by the TaskBar. If this option is turned on, BananaPC will insure that the TaskBar is not obscured by any of your windows. If you want that extra real-estate at the bottom of the screen, turn this option off, and disable the TaskBar Always on Top option.

Note The new NT Shell is still so new that I am unable to find the TaskBar window. If anyone knows how to do this, let me know. In the meantime, BananaPC will compensate for only one row of TaskBar icons. If you resize the NT TaskBar, BananaPC will not be able to detect the new size. The TaskBar compensation routine works fine with Windows 95.

## **Clock Configuration**

Use 12 Hour Format

Fairly self-explanatory. If you are not using a 12 hour time format (default) then you are using a 24 hour time format.

# Configuring Banana Menu

NOTE: It is recommended that only frequently used utilities and applets be placed into the Banana Menu. The only limitation on the number of items is the size of your display. If BananaPC is run in Always on Top mode, the Banana Menu is available to bring up these utilities when running virtually any application.

The Banana Menu is not meant to replace the Program Manager or TaskBar. However, it provides simple single-click access to whatever programs are in it. This is very useful when running an application maximized and a utility is needed. Rather than minimize the current app and go find the utility, simply pull down the Banana Menu and launch the utility from there.

To add items to the Banana Menu, either select the **Edit | Configure Banana Menu** menu option, or drag and drop the desired file anywhere on the BananaPC window bar.

Editing items and deleting items is accomplished via the **Edit | Configure Banana Menu** menu option and is fairly straightforward (i.e. works as expected).

# Kanana Menu

## Banana Menu

Add / Remove / Edit utilities and applets in Banana Menu.

## **Stuff Menu**

## Close

Close and exit the BananaPC Program.

NOTE: Please insure that there are no hidden programs when this option is selected. If you hide an application and then close BananaPC, running BananaPC again will not allow the application to be unhidden because the new instance of BananaPC will not be able to locate the hidden application. The only recourse in this kind of a situation is to reboot or logout and when Windows comes back up, everything should be back to normal.

## Logout

Closes any open apps and logs you out of the system. There are no warnings displayed, it just happens.

# Help Menu

**Register** Registration information about BananaPC. Use this option to input your Registration ID once you have registered to disable the Nag screens.

**Help** Displays this text.

# 🗏 Task Menu

Shows a list of all running applications. The current app is denoted by the circle bullet beside it in the menu.

Use this menu to toggle between applications or hide (remove from view) an application.

NOTE: Do not hide applications and then exit BananaPC without first un-hiding the applications.

# **Other Features**

 $\underline{\text{Eyes}}$  Eyes follow cursor around when in BananaPC window.

<u>Clock</u> Displays current time on BananaPC window.

## Eyes

The Eyes will follow the mouse whenever it is within the BananaPC window.

If enough people register this program, I may make the eyes track the mouse as it moves around the desktop. In initial tests however, the eyes dont move all that much when tracking the mouse around the desktop since the BananaPC is always at the top of the screen. You can see this by pulling down any BananaPC menu and while keeping the button down, move the mouse out of the menu and around the display. The eyes will track the mouse under these conditions.

# Clock

The BananaPC maintains a clock on its display so you will always know what time it is.
