<u>Install</u> <u>Rules</u>

Installation

For this program to run properly you must:

1. Make a directory Rlzrun10 under your Windows directory

2. Copy the file RLZRUN10.RTS into that directory.

RLZRUN10.RTS is a runtime system similar to VBRUN100.DLL

If you already have a copy of RLZRUN10.RTS you do not have to install it again.

Next copy this help file and the Wgolf.exe into any directory.

Now all you need do is use the Windows Program Manager's File menu and choose NEW from that menu. Fill in the dialog box with the name you want to call the program and where you located it.

You are now ready to play Golf solitaire for Windows.

<u>Rules</u> Intro

How To Play

The object of Golf Solitaire is to clear the tableau (thats the 7 columns of cards) of all cards by adding them one at a time to the talon.

Cards can only be added to the talon if:

- 1. They are uncovered.
- 2. They are in sequence with the top card of the talon.

For example if the top card of the talon was a 2 you could play a 3 or an ace (aces are equal to one). The suit does not matter. If you played the 3 then you could play a 4 or a 2. If you had played the ace only a 2 could be played.

When a king is the top card on the talon you can NOT play any card on top of it, you must draw the next card from the hand. You do this by clicking the deck in the hand box.

You only get to go thru the hand once.

When you are done choose Score from the menu Score is the number of cards left in the tableau. Like golf the lower the score the better.
