Try them together or add more interest by mixing in other types of leaf textures. For example, a purple coral bells like Dolce Blackcurrant would look amazing with J apanese painted fern, brunnera, and Burgundy Glow ajuga. And best of all, they'll look as great in early spring together as they do in early fall.
