All together the prize is valued at about \$2,500.

"I sent them a bunch of pictures of how my yard looked at the end of February and the dimensions of it," Hicks said.

Then, on Wednesday, May 2, the Burpee installation team of Renee Rinn and Scott Mozingo showed up and began constructing Hicks' new garden.

"They showed up at 8 a.m. and they have been hard at work," Hicks said.

As Hicks is an avid gardener, she had a few tips for fellow gardeners. "Rise early, be water wise and try to grow plants that are good for New Mexico," she said. "Plants that can take the heat and not suck up too much water."
