Coleus duo low-maintenance pair for spring-to-frost color

Just when I've settled on a favorite coleus, another catches my eye. This spring, two recent introductions are most tempting - bold 'Redhead' and zingy 'Wasabi.'

'Redhead' creates a 2-foot mound of velvety, scalloped leaves. 'Wasabi' forms an equally large mound of serrated, lime-green foliage.

Both were bred for sun, but they also do well in shade.

Each is showy enough to carry a container alone. But when their pots are paired, these coleus make a dynamic duo.

Zinnias and rudbeckias are other complementary partners in sun, in garden beds and containers. Impatiens will add additional color in shade.

A moist, well-draining soil is best. Pinch the growing tips to shape, if necessary.
