

## Syngenta genetic trait for corn gets OK

Syngenta Seeds, Minnetonka, has been granted U.S. Department of Agriculture clearance to place a new genetic trait in its corn seeds, the company said Wednesday. Dubbed the Agrisure Viptera trait, Syngenta said it controls 14 common corn borers, cutworms and other pests. It also reduces the development of molds and mycotoxins. Corn seeds incorporating the new trait will be sold starting in 2011, but will be featured in test plots this summer, Syngenta said.
