"By providing support and customized accommodations at the workplace, we can help prevent and reduce worker injury."

The award is part of Safety Recognition Day, an annual program that recognizes individuals and organizations that have actively promoted safety and loss prevention for the City of Portland's employees and citizens in 2010. The city presented the award to The Standard's Dan McMillan, vice president of Insurance Services, and Steve Cooper, vocational case manager, during a ceremony held Feb. 9, 2011, at Portland City Hall.

"We're honored to be recognized by the city for our commitment to providing employers with new and innovative ways to keep employees healthy and at work," McMillan said.

The city also recognized other local companies for promoting safety and loss prevention for the City of Portland employees and citizens in categories such as Industrial Ergonomics, Life Saver and Creative Outstanding Safety Committee Chairperson.
