## Cause and Effect Guidelines and Annotations

A cause and effect paper

- $\mathbf{Y}$  clearly describes the event or situation to be explained
- gives the causes or effects of the event or situation
- $\Psi$  uses evidence to support each cause or effect
- $\Psi$  organizes the causes and effects in a logical way

## Annotations

- ¥ The paper clearly describes the event or situation to be explained. Readers know that the paper will explain how the clock affects a student's daily life.
- ¥ The paper gives four effects of the clock on Susan's school day. One effect is how Susan dresses and what she eats in the morning. Other effects are on Susan's schedule at school, her use of the computer after school, and her dreams.
- ¥ Evidence supports each effect. Evidence includes descriptive details and explanations.
- ¥ The paper is organized by chronological order. The first effect is in the morning; the last is at night.
