A firsthand biography focuses on

- another person
- your relationship with that person
- the meaning of that person in your life

In a firsthand biography you learn about someone's character through details. These include descriptions, dialogue, and actions.

Dialogue and conversation can reveal a lot about people. What they look like and how they act can tell you even more. In a firsthand biography you describe people who are important to you and maybe even get to know them better. Just use the strategies you've learned: observing, remembering details, exploring your memories.
