Configuration:

Minimum requirements:

A PC or compatible with a 386 SX / 16 MHz; 8 Mo of RAM; a double-speed CD-ROM player (transfer at 300 Ko/s); an 8-bit sound card; VGA-type graphic resolution: 640x480 with 256 colors; Windows 3.1 and DOS 6.0.

Recommended configuration:

A PC or compatible with a 486 SX or DX; 12 Mo of RAM; a double-speed CD-ROM player (transfer at 300 Ko/s); a 16-bit sound card; SVGA-type graphic resolution: 640x480 with 32,000 or 16 million colors; Windows 95.

Installation for windows 3.1:

1. Start Microsoft Windows and open the Program Manager.
2. Insert the CD-ROM in the drive.
3. In the Program Manager, open the File menu and select Run.
4. Type in "D:\install" (if "D" is the letter assigned to your CD-ROM player) and hit Enter. A program group will be created automatically.

OR

1. Start Microsoft Windows and open the Program Manager.
2. Insert the CD-ROM in the drive.
3. In the Program Manager, open the File Manager (located in the Main Group).
4. Click on the CD-ROM icon and then double-click on "install.exe."

Installation for windows 95:

1. Insert the CD-ROM in the drive (the installation program starts automatically).
2. Follow the instructions which appear on the screen.

To start:

Follow the installation procedure described above (if you have not already done so).

Double-click on the 39-45 icon in the Program Manager..

Help:

Help is available on line in the HELP menu.

Keyboard commands:

Space bar: pause/play for the animations.

Advice:

Close all other applications before running the program.

If possible, use a resolution with 32,000 or 16 million colors.

Remarks:

For the program to function correctly, the application QuickTime (QTW version 2.11) must be installed on your hard drive. A QuickTime group will be created with two icons: QT Player and QT Viewer. Be careful not to erase the necessary DLLs or you will have to reinstall the program.
