Financial Reports- Ann Harned

Ms. Ann Harned, Business Manager, referred Board members to page IIA for the Statement of Changes in Fund Balance for the month ending December 31, 2013. We ended the month with total fund balances of \$11,529,164.29.

Ms. Harned went over the page on Statement of Revenues, Expenditures and Changes in Fund Balance (IIA1) for the month ended December 31, 2013. The total current expenditures and outgoing transfers were \$3,673,089.44.

Ms. Harned went over the Statement of Changes in Activity Funds and the Summary of Bond Issue Activity.

BOARD ACTION

Agreement between MHPS and the City of Mountain Home- Dr. Myers

Dr. Myers explained the background on the previous agreement to use the city's baseball fields. He went on to explain how we didn't have an agreement last year and how there needs to be a current agreement in place. He recommended that Mountain Home Public Schools enter into an agreement with the City of Mountain Home, for a year lease retroactive to the 2012 expiration date of the prior agreement, at a cost of \$6,600 per year.

Ms. House made the motion, seconded by Mr. Schmeski, to enter into an agreement with the City of Mountain Home for a year lease retroactive to the 2012 expiration date of the prior agreement, at a cost of \$6,600 per year.

Motion passed unanimously.

Recommendation to accept fiber optic cable bid- Mike Walker

Mike Walker went over the history of the bid and explained what the bid included. He let the board know why the bid was higher than expected and he recommended that the board accept the bid of \$24,248.68 for fiber optic cable to include the installation, labor and materials.

Motion to accept the bid for fiber optic cable installation, labor and materials for \$24,248.68

Mr. Nelson made the motion, seconded by Mr. Bergman to accept the bid for fiber optic cable installation, labor and materials.

The motion passed unanimously.

Recommendation to accept the Resolution for Local Support Master Plan & Partnership Program – Wes Henderson

Mr. Henderson went over the background and rationale for the Resolution and Partnership Program. He answered questions from the board. He recommended that the board accept the resolution for Local Support Master Plan and Partnership Program.

Motion to accept the recommendation of the Resolution for Local Support Master Plan & Partnership Program Mr. Pendergrass made the motion, seconded by Mr. Schmeski to accept the Resolution for Local Support Master Plan and Partnership Program.

The motion passed unanimously.

Recommendation to accept the 2013-2014 school calendar revisions- Becca Camp

Ms. Camp explained the process that the PPC and CPPC went thru to create the 3 options for the staff to vote on for the calendar revisions. She went on to explain that the calendar option B was the most popular option with the staff. She answered questions from the board. She recommended that the board accept option B as the revised calendar for the remainder of the 2013-2014 school year.

Motion to accept the option B revision as the revised calendar

Mr. Schmeski made the motion, seconded by Ms. House to accept option B of the revised calendar for the remainder of the 2013-2014 school year.

The motion passed 4-2.

SUPERINTENDENT'S UPDATE AND BOARD DISCUSSION

Dr. Myers expressed his condolences to Mr. Wehymeyer and his family on the passing of his father Howard Wehmeyer. Dr. Myers spoke of Pinkston student Austin Snyder that is battling cancer and of the t-shirt fundraiser that is going on to benefit the Snyder family.

In keeping with the Governor's declaration, Mayor David Osmon proclaimed January as Mountain Home School Board Appreciation Month. Dr. Myers read the proclamation to the Board. He presented Mr. Strider with the Proclamation from Mayor Osmon. A copy of this proclamation and of the Governor's Proclamation has been made part of the official minutes.
