**Goal:** All students will demonstrate an improvement in reading practical passages and in writing in the content and style domain.

Priority 2: Math

**Goal:** All students will demonstrate an improvement in Data Analysis and Probability through open response application.

**Priority 3: Wellness** 

**Goal:** Mountain Home Junior High will provide support for students in making healthy lifestyle choices implementing systems to aid in decreasing the average BMI on routine annual student screening and increasing collaboration between all segments of the school community in support of positive lifestyle choices.

### Priority 1: To improve literacy skills

- 1. LITERACY BENCHMARK DATA, Grade(s) 8: In 2012, 89.8% of combined students scored proficient or advanced and 83.97% of TAGG (Targeted Achievement Gap Group) scored proficient or advanced. ESEA Subgroups performed as listed: 84.77% of economically disadvantaged students scored proficient or advanced; n<10% of English Learner students scored proficient or advanced; proficient or advanced; n<10% of African American students scored proficient or advanced; and n<10% of Hispanic students scored proficient or advanced.
- 2. Literacy BENCHMARK DATA, Grade 8: In 2011, 89% of combined students scored proficient or advanced showing weaknesses in open response, literary and practical reading; 89% of Caucasian students scored proficient or advanced showing weaknesses in open response, literary and practical reading; 83% of economically disadvantaged students scored proficient or advanced showing weaknesses in open response, literary and practical reading; 31% of special education students scored proficient or advanced showing weaknesses in open response, literary and practical reading. Literacy BENCHMARK DATA, Grade 8: In 2010, 87% of combined students scored proficient or advanced showing weaknesses in open response, literary and practical reading; 87% of Caucasian students scored proficient or advanced showing weaknesses in open response, literary and practical reading; 81% of economically disadvantaged students scored proficient or advanced showing weaknesses in open response, literary and practical reading; 25% of special education students scored proficient or advanced showing weaknesses in open response, literary and practical reading.

# Supporting Data:

- 3. LITERACY NEEDS ASSESSMENT: Leadership teams reviewed and analyzed the results from the 2012 grade 8 Benchmark exam. The results for both the combined population and each of the subpopulations were reviewed and analyzed to determine the main areas of weakness. Also, the three most recent years of summative data as well as attendance rates were studied. Studying the trend data allowed identification of specific areas of need, and allowed alignment of classroom instruction with the curriculum, professional development, and assessments. Our 2012 supporting data statements show the discrepancies in achievement among our populations. Based on our data analysis we came to the conclusion that the following areas reflect our greatest need within the Math priority: Open Response: Writing- Content and Style Domains.
- 4. The expected AMO (annual measurable objective) for percentage proficient of our students

in grade 8 2012 Literacy was 89.67~% for all students; we exceeded this with 89.8~% of our students proficient. Our TAGG (Targeted Achievement Gap Group) expected AMO was 89.67~%. Our TAGG exceeded this benchmark with 83.97~% of our students proficient. The expected AMO for percentage of all students who made growth in 2012 literacy was 88.56~%; we missed this benchmark by 0.55~% with 90.38~% of our students making growth. Our TAGG missed their benchmark of 85.2~% by 0.48~% with 84.72~% of our students making growth.

### Goal

All students will demonstrate an improvement in reading practical passages and in writing in the content and style domain.

## Benchmark

It is expected that Mountain Home Junior High will exceed the 2013 AMO (Annual Measurable Objective) Literacy proficiency benchmark of 90.61% for all students and 84.80% for TAGG (Targeted Achievement Gap Group - students with disabilities, English learners, and economically disadvantaged students.) Also, the percentage of students meeting the growth AMO percentage in literacy will exceed the 2013 AMO of 91.76% for all students and 86.54% for TAGG.

- 5. MATH NEEDS ASSESSMENT: Leadership teams reviewed and analyzed the results from the 2012 grade 8 Benchmark exams. The results for both the combined population and each of the subpopulations were reviewed and analyzed to determine the main areas of weakness. Also, the three most recent years of summative data as well as attendance rates were studied. Studying the trend data allowed identification of specific areas of need, and allowed alignment of classroom instruction with the curriculum, professional development, and assessments. Our 2012 supporting data statements show the discrepancies in achievement among our populations. Based on our data analysis we came to the conclusion that the following areas reflect our greatest need within the Math priority: Open Response: Measurement.
- 6. The expected AMO (annual measurable objective) for percentage proficient of our students in grade 8 2012 Math was 85.21 % for all students; we exceeded this with 85.25 % of our students proficient. Our TAGG (Targeted Achievement Gap Group) expected AMO was 85.21 %. Our TAGG exceeded this benchmark with 77.07 % of our students proficient. The expected AMO for percentage of all students who made growth in 2012 literacy was 88.56 %; we exceeded this benchmark by 4.37 % with 86.6 % of our students making growth. Our TAGG missed their benchmark of 73.91 % by 5.26 % with 79.17 % of our students making growth.

Goal

All students will demonstrate an improvement in Data Analysis and Probability through open response application.

Benchmark

It is expected that Mountain Home Junior High will exceed the 2013 AMO (Annual Measurable Objective) Math proficiency benchmark of 86.55% for all students and 78.63% for TAGG (Targeted Achievement Gap Group - students with disabilities, English learners, and economically disadvantaged students.) Also, the percentage of students meeting the growth AMO percentage in Math will exceed the 2013 AMO of 83.84% for all students and 76.28% for TAGG.
