### **Keyword**

The keyword is a single word used to reference the program you want to run. It is mainly used for the command line, but can also be used on the main DateDesist window to select the program you want to run. To start DateDesist, and automatically run a program, you use the following command line.

DateDesist.exe <Keyword>

<Keyword> is the keyword you have assigned to the program your trying to run.

# **Description**

The description is just that, a description. On the main DateDesist window, you can use the description to select the program you want to run.

#### **Date**

This is the date that DateDesist will set on your PC as it launches the program. If you want it to appear as though you started the program on April 1<sup>st</sup>, 1997 then this field should read 04-01-1997.

# **Executable**

This is the executable program that you want DateDesist to run. For example, if you wanted to change the date for the Windows calculator, this field should read C:\Windows\Calc.exe. You can select the file by clicking on the button next to this field.

#### **Hold Time**

This is the number of seconds that you want DateDesist to *hold* after changing the date and running the program. In other words, the date will remain set to your specification for the number of seconds specified by Hold Time.

# **Auto Close**

If Auto Close is set to Yes, then DateDesist will automatically close after it has run your program and waited out the Hold time. If Auto Close is set to *No*, then the DateDesist window will remain on the screen until you close it.
