One day his working father came home and said that he would be packing up to travel the ocean with a neighboring friend in his yacht. Noel knew that his mother wanted to go so he assured her that he would be okay by telling her that he would live with a friend. Noel only said that knowing that would be the only way for his Mom to feel comfortable leaving him behind, so his mother made the decision to travel alongside her husband leaving thirteen year old Noel to stay with a friend. She left feeling that her son would be safe, so she thought. That was not the case

From that point on Noel struggled. His first thirteen years in a family household and now living a teenage life without parents, without a home, and stuck in what became a bad environment and a world of gang life.

Fortunately a lady friend of his was trying to get into acting and she talked him into joining an acting class with her. Noel, a class clown made the teacher and students laugh with his improvised humor. It turned out that he had a natural talent to act and was spotted by a local producer who hired Noel for his first project. That project was a scene in a Taco Bell commercial at the age of 15.

That was just the beginning for Noel Guglielmi, simply known as "Noel G". Since then Noel has appeared in more than a dozen movies and countless television shows and several commercials.

A few of the movies that Noel has appeared in that helped him grow as an actor have been in big box office hits including "Training Day" with Academy Award Winner Denzel Washington and his role in "Bruce Almighty" (the monkey scene) alongside actor and comedian Jim Carey.

Various roles that made Noel very popular amongst teen audiences have been his role as Hector in "The Fast and The Furious" with actors Vin Diesel (Boiler Room, Triple X, Chronicles of Riddick) and Paul Walker (Varsity Blues, Joy Ride), also Malibu's Most Wanted, S.W.A.T. and a starring role in "Party Animalz" that was independently released.

This past year has been exceptionally busy for the actor. Noel has various films to be released in 2005 including "Splinter", starring actors Edward James Olmos, Maria Conchita Alonso and Emilio Rivera and "The Virgin of Juarez", directed by Kevin James Dobson, written by Michael Fallon, featuring actors Esai Moreles, Jacob Vargas and Minnie Driver.

Noel will also appear in "Treasure of the Seven Mummies" featuring Danny Trejo, rap artist Noreaga, and actor Billy Wirth. Noel's first filming production schedule in 2005 begins with his role as "Flaco" in the upcoming film "Harsh Times". This film writer David Ayer (Fast & Furious, Dark Blue, S.W.A.T.) and who's 2001 Training Day explored the grimy streets of Los Angeles. The film will also star actors Queen Latifah, Rosalyn Sanchez, Christian Bale, Freddy Rodriguez, and Eva Longoria.

Noel is also featured in various popular video games. He lends his voice and character to the recently released "Grand Theft Auto, San Andreas". Noel is also featured in "The Shield", "The Fast & The Furious" and "187 Ride or Die" the new upcoming PlayStation, X-Box and PC combat-racing video game also starring Larenz Tate.

Television keeps calling as well with Noel's recent Toyota commercial and a Discover Card commercial with actor, comedian Ellen De Generes.

Adding to his television credit, Noel G. is popular amongst the television show called "Cruzin TV", where he hosts from various car show events and showcases street car culture. This urban lifestyle show also interviews current top music artists and highlights fashion. The show airs regionally on southern California's KJLA /LATV to a weekly 2.7 million audience. The show became the #1 rated in just the first three weeks of airing.

The New Year is already looking good. With various movies to be released, video games and various television appearances Noel G. is well on his way in this challenging entertainment industry. He plans to be producing his own movies about Latino lifestyle "from the streets" and get it "right" because the entertainment industry tends to misrepresent our culture and lifestyle, states Noel.

Having come such a long way already he hopes to still make his mark in Hollywood, nonetheless Noel Guglielmi is prepared and ready for whatever happens next.
