How good does your computer need to be for Microsoft® Encarta Interactive World Atlas 2001 to work?

- You must have a multimedia PC with Pentium 133 MHz or higher processor
- If your PC's operating system is Windows 95 Windows 98, you need 24 MB of RAM (memory). If you have Windows NT or Windows ME, you need 32 MB of RAM. If you have Windows 2000 Professional, you need 64 MB of RAM
- 100 MB of hard disk space is required for installation
- Internet Explorer 5.5 software (which is included on the cd). Up to 45 MB of hard-disk space and an additional 25 MB is needed during installation. You must have Internet access to use Internet functions
- A local bus video with 1 MB or more of video memory is necessary
- World Atlas 2001 requires an MPC-level 2 compliant quad speed CD-ROM or DVD-ROM drive or faster
- World Atlas 2001 requires a Super VGA, 256 colour monitor supporting 640x480 or higher resolution
- Microsoft® Mouse, Microsoft® Intellimouse or a compatible pointing device is required
- A 16-bit sound card with speakers or headphones is recommended
- To use Encarta Researcher, you need up to 10 MB of hard-disk space
- A 14.4K or High-baud modem and a Web browser are required to use Encarta Web Links
- To use the World Atlas Copy to Hard Drive feature, you need up to 1.4 GB of additional hard-disk space

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
