## Getting Started

When WinChime comes up for the first time, the instrument will be Tubular Bells. Click on the "Play" button. If you hear pleasant-sounding bell sounds, then your set-up is already compatible with WinChime.

(If, instead, you hear a clunky sound with little sustain, more like a Xylophone than Tubular Bells, then click on menu Options -> Configure... -> Midi -> 0-Based Patches. If this changes the sound to a more pleasing bell, then click on File -> Save as Default Settings. )

If this doesn't fix your sound problem, refer to [Troubleshooting](#).

WinChime does not automatically save program settings. If you make a configuration change that should be permanent, remember to click on File -> Save as Default Settings.

Assuming you have the correct Tubular Bell sounds, it's time to experiment! Try changing the various Wind, Pitch, Volume, Instrument, and Scale controls and see what happens.

Controls average loudness of the notes.

If the notes are not loud enough even with the volume at maximum, look for a software utility, usually called a Mixer, that comes with your sound card, with separate controls for volume for MIDI, .WAV, etc, plus an overall volume control. Proper adjustment of the MIDI and overall volume control in this utility should solve the problem.

Defines how often notes are played, on average.

Use the Timer settings of Random Play to simulate "Gusts" of wind.

Determines the average pitch of notes played.

For a particular instrument setting, some values of pitch sound better than others for a specific sound card. Experiment to find the optimum settings for your preferences.

Maps a particular MIDI instrument sound to the chime notes.

These instrument sounds vary in quality among different sound cards, but typically Tubular Bells and Vibraphone sound best as chimes.

It is possible to use other instruments besides the selections defined by WinChime. Simply enter the MIDI number for the instrument in the edit control of the Instrument combo box.

A list of instruments and their numbers is available in your sound card manual, or (in Win3.1) by going into Midi Mapper in Window's Control Panel by selecting Patch Map and Edit. (You may have to increment or decrement the instrument number by 1, because of differences in MIDI Patch Assignment tables.)

Selects among several subsets of tones for your wind chime.

### Major

The Major scale, or Ionian, is the most common in modern Western music.



### Minor

The Minor scale is the Aeolian medieval mode.



### Funky

"Funky" is one of several jazz/blues scales, with the characteristic "blue" notes of sliding pitch.



### Ritsu

Ritsu is a pentatonic scale of ancient Japan (pre 1500AD).



### Yoo

Yoo is a Japanese scale from the Edo period (1603-1868AD).





Begin playing sounds.

Start sound output. Alternate ways of starting sound include a command on the system menu, clicking on the taskbar tray icon, and using the built-in timer.

Stops all sound being produced by the application.

Stop sound output. Alternate ways of starting sound include a command on the system menu, clicking on the taskbar tray icon, and using the built-in timer.

Turns off all MIDI notes and exits the application.

This option is useful when the program is minimized for long periods of time, and reduces clutter on the taskbar.

Clicking the tray icon toggles sound output. Double-clicking opens the main WaveSong window. Right-clicking on the icon pops up a control menu.



Toggles enable of the built-in timer function, which is set up in the Options->Preferences->Timer command. When enabled, a check mark appears next to the Enable Timer menu selection.

The timer enable may also be toggled by the accelerator key control-T, or by a control on the Timer setup dialog.

Enable Fixed Length timer controls.

How long program will play before stopping.

MIDI Mapper is the recommended MIDI device.

Selects whether standard MIDI instrument patches should be numbered starting with 0 or 1.  
For the vast majority of sound cards and MIDI configurations, choose 1.

Starts open-file dialog for settings file, with default extension .wch . This (ASCII-readable) file contains control setting information for volume, wind, instrument sound, etc.

Saves current settings (wind, volume, instrument selection, etc.) as a WinChime settings file, with default extension .wch .

To save as the default settings to be loaded at application start-up, use the next menu command: Save As Default Settings.

Saves current control settings (volume, wind, instrument selection, etc) as the default settings, which will be automatically loaded upon application start-up.

Use the current settings (volume, wind, instrument selection, etc.) and generate a MIDI file, with default extension .MID. This file can be played by any Windows-compatible MIDI sequencer, or by other MIDI sequencers by appropriate mapping of patches.

# Troubleshooting

## Why don't I hear anything when I click "Play"?

- Check to see that your sound card is configured properly, with all necessary drivers installed. As a quick test, click on the object below, which will play a MIDI file using Windows' built-in MIDI file sequencer.



- Check the volume setting within WinChime, then look for a utility that comes with your sound card which controls overall sound volume and sound balance.
- Go into Windows Control Panel, and then enter Midi Mapper. If Show Setups is selected, then you should be in Base or Extended.

## Why do I hear the wrong instrument?

- Refer to the instructions above about Midi Mapper.
- Click on Patches.

In case you get a different instrument sound than expected,

- 1) experiment with the Options|0/1 Based Patches menu selections,
- 2) (Win3.1 16-bit version) CHECK THE MIDI MAPPER!

The MIDI Mapper, located in the Control Panel, MUST be set to either Basic MIDI or Extended MIDI. Also, click on Patches for an explanation on differences between Instrument number assignments found in different sound cards.

## Why does it sound strange at these settings?

For many sound cards, some MIDI instruments only sound "good" within a particular range of pitches. For example, Tubular Bells may sound fine one octave below middle-C or above, but may be an unusable growl at lower pitches.

## WinChime sounds different on my friend's computer.

Different sound cards may sound vastly different with the same MIDI settings. Even with the same sound card, some manufacturers make available updated drivers which may change the quality of MIDI sounds.

## Advanced Topics

### Shortcuts and Expert User Info...

To toggle between Play and Stop, use the right mouse button. This is especially handy when the application is minimized: just right click on the icon.

WinChime can accept a settings filename as a command-line argument. This is useful to start up WinChime from some other program like a Windows-batch utility or time-scheduler. If this filename argument is present, WinChime starts playing immediately after initialization. The command invocation looks like:

```
<path>\winchime <path>\filename.wch
```

It's possible to use ANY Midi instrument with WinChime, not just the instruments provided in the Instrument listbox. Simply click on the Instrument edit control and enter an integer between 0 and 127, corresponding to the MIDI instrument number. A table of instrument numbers is available in the Midi Mapper patch map controls. Alternatively, just experiment with different numbers!

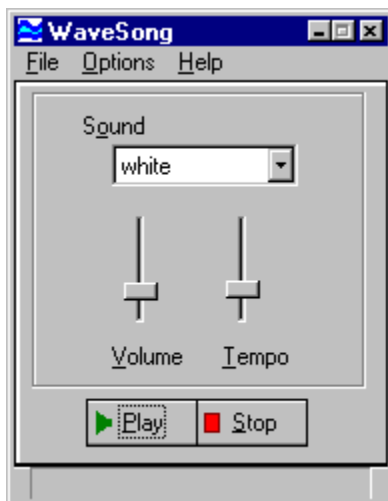

### WaveSong for Win95, WinNT4, and Windows 3.1

Relax to the sounds of thunder, crickets, waves, and rain. WaveSong is a nature-sound generator program for Windows, using the digital sound channel capabilities of your sound card and processing techniques to produce nature sounds. This program could be used to mask out unwanted environmental noise and promote relaxation and concentration. Controls for Volume and Tempo allow the listener to tailor sound output to individual preferences.

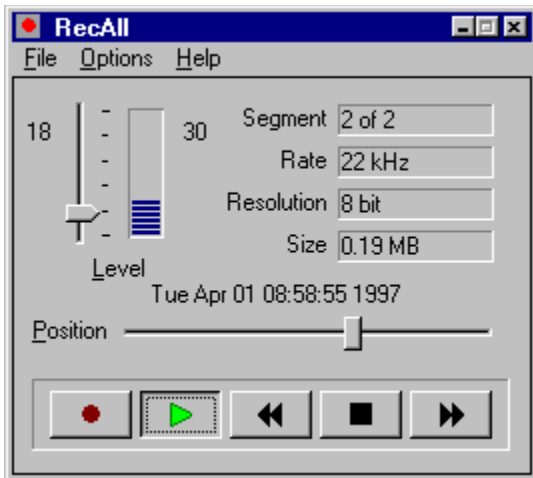


### RecAll for Win95, WinNT4, and Windows 3.1

RecAll works like a voice-activated recorder for your computer. The program runs in the background, monitoring the microphone input of your sound card. Sound above a settable threshold triggers recording of .WAV data to disk. Recordings may be time-stamped.

Suggested uses include a handy note-taker for ideas and dictation, unattended monitoring of radio scanners, and security monitoring of your work environment.





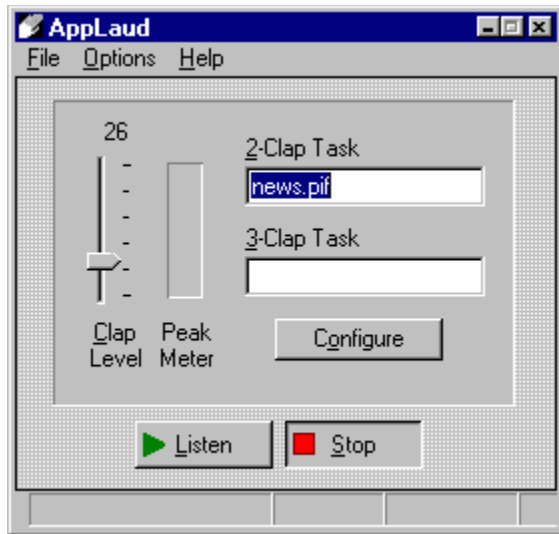
### MouSing for Win95 and Windows 3.1

Create eerie sounds by moving your mouse. This program is similar to a musical instrument called a Theremin, which responds to the musician's hand movements in the air near the instrument, but instead of detecting hand movements, we use a mouse. Movement in one direction changes pitch, and in another direction volume



### AppLaud for Windows

Impress your friends! Turn your sophisticated multimedia computer into one of those gadgets-that-turn-things-on-and-off-by-clapping-your-hands. Applaud runs in the background, monitoring your sound card microphone input and detecting the noise signature of clapping. Different programs can be launched for two-clap and three-clap signals. A special "stealth mode" is implemented for the Sound Blaster 16 and some compatible sound cards, to allow simultaneous listening and sound output. Sound card with Automatic Gain Control (AGC) microphone input strongly recommended.

## Timer Setup

Use WinChime's built-in timer to add time variation and keep sounds interesting. The Timer Setup dialog provides several powerful controls that may be used separately or in combination:

- Fixed time duration. WinChime plays for the specified number of minutes, then turns off.
- Fixed time schedule. The start and stop time for sound output can be specified.
- Random play. The user controls the average play time and average quiet time. This simulates wind "gusts".

When the Setup dialog is adjusted to the desired parameters, click on the Enable Timer menu selection, if needed, to get a check mark to appear next to this menu item.

Here are how the various settings control scheduling:

**FIXED PLAY LENGTH:** Once play is started, by clicking on the Play button or by a timer action, sound output will stop at the specified time. Output could start again if Random length is enabled and random sleep time is non-zero.

**FIXED PLAY TIME:** If a Start Time is entered, this has the effect of simulating a Play button press at the specified time. If the Stop Time is specified, this is like pressing the Stop button at the entered time. Times should be entered in "24 hour" time, so 1:30PM should be entered as 13:30, or alternatively, as 1330 .

**RANDOM PLAY:** Once play is started, by clicking on the Play button or by a Fixed Time Start timer action, sound output will continue for an average of Random Play minutes and then sleep for an average of Random Sleep minutes. This cycle will continue until the Stop button is clicked or a Fixed Time Stop timer event.

These settings may be combined. Suppose we want WinChime to start playing at 7AM (as a gentle alarm clock) and play for random intervals averaging one minute on and three minutes off. Enable the Random Play and Fixed Time Play checkboxes, and enter 1 Average Play Minutes and 3 Average Sleep Minutes. The other edit fields may be left blank.
