1.3 Installation

The installation is done with the AmigaInternational Installer. It ↔ is not part of this package but can be found for example on Aminet.

To use CDCat you need at least:

- OS 2.0, 2 MB RAM and a 020 processor

-

MUI

3.3 or higher

- XPK, if you want your catalogs to be packed automatically

To get most out of CDCat you should use it on an Amiga with some harddisk space and enough RAM (8 MB)

CDCat supports

PowerPC
boards with phase5's PPC system.

NOTE: CDCat will crash on an MC68000 processor. But you wouldn't have enough speed for good working anyway.

1.4 About MUI

This application uses

MUI - MagicUserInterface

MUI is a system to generate and maintain graphical user interfaces. With the aid of a preferences program, the user of an application has the ability to customize the outfit according to his personal taste.

1.5 Introduction

CDCat is THE revolutionary disk cataloging system on the Amiga, you can use it to catalog all kinds of CDROMs (and especially Aminet CDs), but also to catalog PD disks, harddisks and directories, for example with lots of pictures.

CDCat remembers the contents of the devices by writing the filenames together with the tree structure and (when scanning Aminet CDs) additionally archive size, age and description into the catalog. One catalog may contain any number of

devices.

These catalogs than can be searched for certain file names or watched treewise with the browser function, like in directory utils (e.g DirOpus, RO etc.) but with the difference that they don't have to be inserted in any drive.

You can also search devices or directories directly without creating a scancatalog first. So it provides an additional feature for finding files on your harddisk.

CDCat offers you 15 free user-configurable buttons to process files you have found ←

It is for example possible to extract archives, show readmes or pictures etc. You may configure them with any AmigaDOS command you like.

CDCat also uses a special scanmode for AminetCDs which scans the CD's contents in about 5 seconds and supports archive size, age and description. This is possibly by making use of the INDEX files present on the CD. So CDCat totally replaces the standard Aminet CD search tool.

As a special feature, all scancatalogs can be packed automatically if the XPK system is installed on your Amiga.

Release 3 now features a lot of new stuff such as a catalog manager, PowerPC support, search for directory names, filter functions etc.

1.6 Features

Features:

- catalogs CDRoms, harddisks, PD disks etc.
- light speed Aminet mode which scans Aminet CDs in 3-5 sec and catalogs archive size, age and description, too.
- fast and flexible search routines (85% inline assembler!!)

·

PowerPC

search routines for users of PowerUp boards.

- Devices or directories can be searched directly without creating a scancatalog. So it is also useful for just finding lost files on your harddisk.
- Browser function which can be used to view the contents of a device treewise without it to be inserted.
- Manager to reorganize catalog data. You may resort devices, copy them into other catalogs etc...
- 15 free configurable user buttons that can be configured individually to unpack archives, view readmes or pictures etc...

- Aminet descriptions can be searched, too
- Search for directory names is possible now, too
- Memolist: Here you can store filenames (also permanently) you don't want to process immediately, maybe because the CD they are on is not inserted.
- Catalogs can automatically be XPK packed, if you have installed the XPK system
- You can specify the directories which should be searched
- Every cataloged device may get a DiskID
- MUI gui

1.7 Registration

CDCat is Shareware, the demo version has some restrictions:

- It cannot handle more than 5 catalogs
- A catalog may only contain 1 device
- You cannot search more than 1 catalog
- You cannot save the prefs file
- You cannot save your personal button configuration
- The PowerPC search routine is a little restricted

You can receive the full version by registering and paying the registration fee.

1.8 Upgrading to CDCat Release 3

Upgrades for users of older CDCat versions

A lot of things have changed since the last release v2.2, many new and big features have been added, such as the PowerPC support or the catalog manager, features that have been requested by many users.

I have put a big effort in developing this version, but as the number of Amiga users probably hasn't increased, I cannot just give it away as a usual update.

So if you are totally satisfied with the features version v2.2 offers you and not interested in further development, just keep on using it.

But if you think that the new features are worth it and you want to support the development of CDCat, please order your upgrade to CDCat Release 3.

This upgrade is available for 20 DM / 10 Euro / 15 US\$.

There are also possibilities of cross upgrades

- if you are a registered user of one of my programs DArc, AFiloFaxPro, AmigaTrainer or Cheater
- if you are a registered user of a similar tool like CDCat that is much worse, of course... ;-)) and you can send me the original disk of this program as verification of your license. Cross upgrades are possible from:

The following tooltypes may be used to configure CDCat:

If you want to launch CDCat from shell, the same keywords can be used as Shell parameters:

1.14 Basic organisation

The contents (filenames) of CDs or disks are put into scan ↔
catalogs on harddisk.

A catalog is always one file on hd, no matter how many devices it contains.

All catalogs CDCat should recognize have to be located in the same path. This path can be specified in the prefs window.

On program startup all catalogs found in this path are added to a catalog list. From this list you can select catalogs to search or watch their contents with the browser function. New catalogs can be added in CDCat.

There are two scan modes to scan CDs / devices:

1. Normal mode: The dirs and files are scanned one after another and put into the catalog.
2. Aminet mode: CDCat uses the INDEX file on Aminet CDs and converts them into an Aminet catalog. This strongly reduces scan time and allows additional information (archive size, age and desc) to be cataloged.

Since both modes differ in their information structure, a catalog can only contain devices scanned in the same mode.

Both in the window where found files are listed and on the browser page you can process files with 15 free user configurable buttons. It is possible to unpack archives, view files, pictures etc. These buttons can freely be configured in the

button configuration
part.

1.15 Scanning devices

If you want to catalog a CD or any other device, you can either ↔
append it
to an existing catalog or you create a new catalog first.

Screenshot of the scan page

Description of the control elements:

Devices: Here all mounted devices are shown, select one for being scanned.

There is an additional entry called "SELECT", choose this to select the directory to be scanned via file requester in normal mode.

In Aminet mode a new window will open where you can specify an Aminet Index (for example from a CD you do have but whose Index you found on another CD) to be read. You also have to enter the name of the CD (with ending ':') as this cannot be read out of the Index file.

Update: Although the device list is usually updated automatically, this button can be used to update it manually.

Catalogs: Here all catalogs found in the specified path are listed. The sorting mode can be changed in the prefs window.

The left column shows the catalog type, "N" means normal type, "A" aminet type, "?" no type yet (empty).

Below the list you can change the name of the catalog by typing a new one.

Add: Adds a new catalog called "New_catalog".

Del: Removes the catalog from the list AND from harddisk.
Deleted catalogs will never come back...

Info: Shows the contents of the catalog.

Settings:

.filter infos: (normal mode only) If this is selected, .info files will not be cataloged.

append: Select this to append the data to the selected catalog. Otherwise the catalog will be overwritten.

Aminet mode: Switches to Aminet mode (for Aminet CDs only, of course). CDCat will now look for an Index file on the CD and convert it into CDCat data. This dramatically speeds up scanning and allows ↵ additional cataloging of file size, age and description. So you will get real "Aminet feeling".

DiskID: You may assign an identification code (max. 6 chars) to every device you scan. In Aminet mode you have to supply a DiskID as this is the only way to recognize the CD later. The best way is just to give them their CD number (for example '21' or 'Set1C').

Control:

Scan: Starts scanning the selected device into the selected catalog with the selected scan mode. While scanning is in progress, CDCat will display progress information. Pressing 'Cancel' will abort scanning, the part already scanned however will still be usable.

If you have installed the XPK package, CDCat is able to automatically pack your catalogs. See

Prefs
for further information.

1.16 Finding files in catalogs

On the find page you can search one or more catalogs for filename ↵ patterns.

But you can also search devices (harddisks, directories etc.) directly

without a catalog.

Catalog search:

=====

Screenshot of the find page (catalog search)

Catalogs: This list displays all available catalogs, select the ones you want to search. Depending on your MUI settings you might have to press <Shift> to select more than one catalog.

All: Selects all catalogs

None: Deselects all catalogs

Norm: Selects all normal catalogs

Aminet: Selects all Aminet catalogs

Info: Displays information about the selected catalog

Directory search:

=====

Screenshot of the find page (directory search)

Add: Adds a new directory to the list of dirs being searched

Del: Removes the selected directory from the list.

Patterns: You can specify up to 4 AmigaDOS search patterns CDCat will look for in the catalogs. All common wildcards (#?,?,...) can be used. If you have selected "Auto wildcard" from menu (default setting can be selected in the prefs window), CDCat will automatically append "#?" at the beginning and the end of the patterns before searching (you will not notice this!). So every file that contains the given pattern will be found.

NOTE PPC USERS:

If you are using the PowerPC plugin, you must not use AmigaDOS search patterns. Just enter a string, and all files/dirs containing this string will be found!

Search descriptions: Select this if you also want Aminet descriptions to be checked for the patterns in Aminet catalogs.

Only search dir: Select this to search only directories that contain the given dirmatch string, other dirs will be skipped. Useful if you roughly know where the file must be located as this will bring you a strong speed increase.

Files: Select whether files matching the pattern should be found

Dirs: Select whether directories matching the pattern should be found

Control:

Search: Starts searching the selected catalogs for the given patterns. This procedure can only be aborted after a whole catalog was searched completely.

Packed catalogs are unpacked automatically.

Open window: Opens the window where the found files are displayed.

1.17 Viewing CDs treewise

With the Brwoser features you can view the contents of devices in catalogs treewise just like in a directory util (e.g. DirOpus) but without them having to be inserted. From here you can also process files with the 15 free user-configurable buttons.

Screenshot of the Browser page

In the list on the upper left all catalogs are displayed, if one is selected you can choose a device to view from the list below. To view it, just double-click on it or press "Load". Packed catalogs are unpacked automatically.

In the DiskID field you can change the device's DiskID.

In the file list you can move like in a directory util:

- Double-clicking on a directory will display it
- Clicking on the directory name field above the list or "PD" will show the parent directory

With the two arrows in the upper right corner you can view the next or previous directory when browsing through Aminet CDs.

You can also process the files with the 15 user buttons.

1.18 The catalog manager

The catalog manager allows you to reorganize your catalogs by moving devices within a catalog, copy them to other catalogs or just to delete devices from catalogs. You can also change the name of a disk and its diskid.

Screenshot of the Manager page

Scancatalogs: Select a catalog to display its contents in the disk list (middle list).

Disks: Displays all disks the current catalog contains. They can be resorted via drag and drop:

- To change the order of the disks in the catalog, just drag an entry and drop it at the position you desire.
- To copy a disk into another catalog, you have to drop it over the clipboard, it will then be copied into an internal buffer.

You will be asked, whether to move or copy the disk. This means:

- Move: Copies the disk into the clipboard and REMOVES it from the catalog ←
- Copy: Copies the disk into the clipboard while it will still remain in the catalog

Now, select the other catalog and drag&drop the entry from the clipboard into the disk list at the position you want it to be.

Control:
=====

Remove: Deletes the selected disk from the catalog. There is no way to get it back! If you are not sure if you really want to delete it, move it to the clipboard instead. Then it is removed from the catalog but the data still exists.

Diskname: You may change the name of a disk here. Note that only names ending with ":" (device) or "/" (directory) are valid.

Diskid: Changes the DiskID of the selected disk.

Clipboard:
=====

Internal clipboard to store disk data. You can have several entries on the clipboard. As these will be lost when CDCat quits, it checks whether there are still entries on the clipboard and will give you a security request in this case.

Remove: Removes a catalog from the clipboard.

1.19 Viewing found filenames

In this window the result of the search is displayed. Here you can process the found files with the 15 free configurable buttons. This way you can unpack archives, display readmes etc. directly out of CDCat.

Screenshot of this window

In the pattern list all search patterns and the Memolist entry are listed.

Depending on your settings old patterns may also be displayed.

Select an entry to be displayed in the file list.

File list sort mode can be selected via menu, default sort mode in
Prefs

In the menu you can also select which columns should be displayed and which should ↔
not.

You can select one or more entries from the file list and process them
with one of the user buttons. (For further details see
button configuration
All/None selects/deselects all entries.

Other buttons:

Search again: From here you can search for the same pattern again in the selected
catalogs. You can also select whether to remove the entries found ↔
the
last time from the file list.

Delete pattern: Removes the selected pattern from the pattern list. If the
memolist is selected, after a security request all entries
can be removed from the memolist.

Delete all: Removes all patterns from the pattern list without changing
the memolist.

Search text: Searches all found files and descriptions for a given text string.

Search again: Searches again for the given text string.

Print: A new window is opened where you can make settings for
printing the list of found files.

· Dest: Where to print the files to (file or "PRT:")

· Print...: Select whether to print all files or only the
selected ones.

On printing CDCat uses the same column ordering as in the
file list. (See
Prefs
for details)

Go back: Closes the window and returns to the find page.

Filter (available from menu)

=====

Allows you to select which entries will be displayed in the file list.

Filter active: Select whether filter is active

1.20 The memolist

If you have found one or more interesting files you cannot process immediately, maybe because the wrong CD is inserted, you can store them on the memolist.

Its contents are saved in a file on hd, so it won't be lost when you quit CDCat and is accessible when it is restarted.

If you don't need a file on your memolist anymore, it can be removed again.

1.21 PPC notes

Important notes about the ppc support:

- To take advantage of the new PowerPC features, the PPC plugin (separate file called "CDCatPPC.elf") has to be available.

It should be in the "ppc/" dir, otherwise you can set its location with the PPCPLUGIN

Tooltype

- CDCat doesn't require any PowerPC software extensions such WarpUp, it runs with Phase5's development standard
- If PPC routines are available (plugin found and working together with CDCat) the window title will contain the word "PPC".
- There is a special page in the prefs window for PPC settings, you can check the current state and disable the PPC routines for speed comparison.
- If you are using the PPC search routines, you don't need to care about AmigaDOS patterns and the AutoWildcard features.

Just type in a search string, and every file/dir containing this string will be found.

1.22 Settings for CDCat

You can call the prefs window with the menu item "Prefs/CDCat".

It is divided into three pages:

1. Misc
Misc settings for CDCat
2. Scan/Find
Settings for the scan and find part
3. Search results
Settings for displaying found files
4. PowerPC plugin
Settings for the PowerPC plugin

Buttons:

Save: Save the prefs file. Its location may be changed with a

1.23 Misc settings

Here you can make miscellaneous settings:

Catalog path: Path were all your catalogs are located.

Aminet Index: When using Aminet scanmode, CDCat will convert the Index on the Aminet CD into a CDCat format. Here you can specify the path of the Index file on the CD, relative to the root dir (with leading ':'). (Default: '~':Aminet/info/index/local')

Output CON: If sell commands are launched out of CDCat, their output can be directed into a shell window, this can be configured here. (Default: 'CON:0/20/640/180/CDCat Ausgabe/AUTO/WAIT/CLOSE')

Default page: Here you can select the page of the main window which should be displayed when CDCat is started.

Catalog sorting:

General: Select the general sorting mode:

- alphabetical only: catalogs will only be sorted alphabetically, no matter which type the catalogs are of.
- Aminet first: All Aminet catalogs will be listed above the normal catalogs.
- Normal first: All normal catalogs will be listed above the Aminet catalogs.

Inside: If you select 'Aminet first' or 'Normal first' there will be two blocks of catalogs (Aminet and normal catalogs). Here you can select the sorting mode for within these blocks.

- alphabetical only: blocks will only be sorted alphabetically
- numbers up/down: CDCat will look for any numbers in the catalog name and will then - if the first 4 chars of two catalog names are equal - sort by the found number.

XPK

Since catalogs might become very huge, especially when cataloging CDs, CDCat is able to pack your catalogs automatically with the XPK system. They will also be unpacked automatically when they are used.

advantages: · smaller catalogs

disadvantages: · searching catalogs takes a little longer as the catalog has to be unpacked everytime it is accessed. This also depends on the selected pack method.

Here you can select a pack method and the pack rate. The higher the pack rate, the smaller the catalogs will be but the longer it will take to unpack the catalogs.

Choose "Don't pack" if you don't want your catalogs to be packed.

Tip: Use "NUKE" as it is very efficient, packs with acceptable speed and unpacks very quickly, what is very important. Remember that catalogs have to be packed once but unpacked very often.

I would recommend NUKE.50.

Press "Pack" to (re)pack all catalogs with the selected pack method and rate. This will take some time and can only be aborted if an error occurs.

1.24 Settings for scanning and searching

Security request (scanning):

To avoid unwanted actions, CDCat can warn you in certain situations:

Overwrite catalog: You will be warned if you are going to overwrite a catalog.

No DiskID in normal mode: CDCat will always ask you for a DiskID if no one is specified in normal mode.

Scan AminetCD in normal mode: You will be warned if you are scanning an Aminet CD in normal mode.

Abort scanning: If you want to abort scanning, a security request appears first.

Search: Here you can make some settings for searching catalogs.

Auto wildcard (#?...#?): Here you can specify the default setting for the 'Auto wildcard' menu item on the find page

.
If you select 'Auto wildcard' there CDCat will automatically append '#?' at the beginning and the end of every search pattern (you won't notice it). This will make sure that every file containing the specified pattern will be found.

Delete patterns automatically: CDCat can clear the patterns field on the find page automatically after the search is finished.

Delete old patterns automatically: Select this if you want that patterns once searched for are removed from the pattern list when you search for new patterns.

Note that the memolist is not affected by this setting.

Search descriptions: Here you can specify the default setting for the 'search descriptions' checkmark on the find page

.

Find files: Default value for whether looking for files matching the given pattern.

Find dirs: Default value for whether looking for directories matching the given pattern.

1.25 Settings for watching found files

Here you can make settings for displaying the search results.

You can set the coloumn order for the list where the found files are shown. (change this by drag&drop-ing the entries into the desired order)

It is also possible to select a sorting mode for the found entries:

- Normal: Entries are displayed in normal order (as they appear in the different catalogs)
- DiskID: Entries are sorted alphabetically by their DiskID
- Filename: Entries are sorted alphabetically by their filename

With Up / Down you can (de)select reverse order.

1.26 PowerPC Setup

If you own a PPC board, CDCat offers you the possibility to search catalogs with your PowerPC. There is an external plugin file called 'CDCatPPC.elf' which comes along with this distribtion.

It should be placed whithin the "ppc/" directory, otherwise you can set its location with the PPCPLUGIN
Tooltype

This preferences page shows information about the plugin:

1. Filename of the plugin under which CDCat tried to load it
2. The version string of the plugin if loading succeeded

or - alternatively: "No plugin available", if the plugin was not found or is an incompatible version

1.27 Basic information about the 15 user buttons

When you are watching the found filenames or using the browser, there are 15 free user configurable buttons allowing you to immediately process the found files (extract archives, view texts/pictures etc.)

There are two different types of commands assignable to the buttons:

1. internal commands: these are implemented into CDCat
2. external: here external AmigaDOS commands will we run with parameters (the selected file for example).

Example: 'c:lha e %file ram:' => Unpacks the file to ram:

1. Internal commands

Internal commands are implemented in CDCat which will perform all necessary action. Currently there are two internal commands:

- INFO: If the file can be found (CD must be inserted), some information about the file will be displayed in a requester.
- REMEMBER: This command has got two functions:
 1. If you are watching usual files that were found, you can add the selected files to the memolist.
 2. If you are already watching the memolist, you use this button to remove the selected files from memolist.

2. External commands

External commands are AmigaDOS commands that are called out of CDCat. To make sure that they will find the right file to process, the command call may contain arguments that are replaced by the corrects string (the filename for example) before the command is called.

The following arguments can be used:

- %file: Will be replaced by the complete filename including the file's path. (for example "Aminet21:Aminet/disk/cdrom/CDCat10.lha")
- %fname: Will be replaced by the filename without path (e.g. "CDCat10.lha")
- %path: Will be replaced by the path of the file (e.g. "Aminet21:Aminet/disk/cdrom/")
- %preq: A path requester will appear asking you for a path name to replace %preq by. Useful for selecting e.g. extraction destination.
- %readme: If the selected file is an Aminet archive, %readme will be replaced the name of its .readme file (including path). (e.g. "Aminet21:Aminet/disk/cdrom/CDCat10.readme"). In connection with a text viewer (e.g. Multiview) thsi can be used to view the archive readmes directly out of CDCat.

Attention: Arguments will not be surrounded by quotes automatically. But this ***** may be done by adding quotes to the argument string yourself.



1.28 Configuring the 15 user buttons

You can call this window with the menu item 'prefs/buttons', here  your personal button configuration can be edited.

All 15 buttons are shown, click on the one you want to edit, it will be made. Now you can make the following settings:

Button text: text to be displayed in the button.

Type: Select whether an internal (INFO/REMEMBER) or an external command (AmigaDOS command) should be called.

Command: Command line that will be executed when the button is pressed. Depending on the 'Type' setting, this will either be one of the two internal commands or the command line for the external AmigaDOS commands (see button basics for details).

Popup button: Opens a list that will - depending on the button type - either show a list of the internal commands or a list of all possible arguments.

Output (for external commands only): Select where the output of the called program will be shown.

- None: Output will not be shown
- CLI: Output will be shown in a console window that can be configured in the prefs window.
- File: Output will be written into the specified file.

Output file: File where the output (with output setting "file") will be written to.

Extended settings: (type=external only)

Match pattern: Select this in order to only process files that match the specified pattern.

Matchstring: Pattern the files have to match (e.g. '#?.lha' for lha archives)

Change dir: Before executing the command CDCat is able to change the current dir to the drawer where the selected file is located in.

File must exist: If you select this CDCat will check whether the file can be found or not. This, however, is done without any requesters appearing ('Insert volume xy..').

Security request: Before executing the command, CDCat may show a security request.

Abort without user parameters: If you are using the '%path' argument it might happen that the requester is aborted. In this case the whole execution can either be aborted or continued with an empty string replacing '%path'.

Control:

Copy: Select the source button you want to copy, press 'Copy' and then select the destination button or abort with <space>.

Swap: Select the first button, press 'Swap' and then select the second button. The buttons will now be exchanged.

Erase: Erases the selected button after a security request.

Save: Saves the current settings and uses them in CDCat.

Use: Uses the current settings in CDCat without saving them.

Cancel: Return to CDCat using the old settings.

1.29 Tips for your MUI configuration

If you are a registered MUI user, you can change the appearance of CDCat and save it.

Special tips and hints for MUI & CDCat:

- The list with the search results and the Browser list are using the 'small' font instead of the normal one.
- For the other lists and buttons you shouldn't use a big font, too.

1.30 Using the DArc converter

To provide an easy way for DArc users to rearrange with CDCat, old DArc scanfiles can be converted into CDCat catalogs (normal format).

Using the converter is really simple:

Just select an old DArc scanfile and enter a name for the CDCat catalog. The converter will append .cat to the catalog name if you forget to do this.

Then press start and wait until the catalog is converted.

The new catalog can now be used with CDCat.
