### 1.2 Introduction

WBReboot was originally written just as a small program, intended for lazy people (like me) so they did not have to use the keyboard reset combination [Ctrl L-Amiga R-Amiga]. But after recently purchasing a tower for my A1200, I found out that the keyboard adapter would not accept the usual reset combination and so set about a solution

---

(other than the reset button on the front of the tower case).

And Here it is ... 2 Programs 1 Aim

WBReboot 1.0 is a small program that allows you to reboot your Amiga by using an option in the otherwise underused TOOLS menu.

WBReboot 1.0c is a small commodity that allows you to use other key combinations to reset your Amiga. (e.g PC-style ALT-CTRL-DEL)

WBReboot has been tested with the following configurations:-

A1200/030 40Mhz, 16Mb Fast RAM, FPU/MMU, Workbench/Kickstart 3.0

Standard A1200 with Workbench/Kickstart 3.1

A600/030 33Mhz, 2Mb Chip/8Mb Fast RAM, FPU/MMU, Workbench/Kickstart 2.05

### 1.3 Requirements

- Workbench/Kickstart 2.05 (v37) or higher

not necessary but otherwise defeats the purpose of WBReboot:-

- No Way of using the Usual Keyboard Reset Combination

Workbench 1.3 is NOT SUPPORTED

Workbench 3.5 is untested but should be supported

## 1.5 Installation

WBReboot 1.10 comes with an automatic installation script .

Automatic installation  
=====

For an automatic installation simply double-click on the supplied "Install" icon. The Amiga Installer must be available on your harddisk

Manual installation  
=====

Simply copy the WBReboot executables from the BIN/ drawer to your WBStartup drawer. A selection of Icons in various formats are also included.

## 1.6 WB Usage

Workbench usage  
-----

If you want to start WBReboot1.0/1.0c from Workbench then simply click the icon, or if it has been installed in WBStartup it will be started automatically after every reboot.

After WBReboot1.0 has been run a new option will be present on the TOOLS menu of workbench. Simply select this and your Amiga will be rebooted.

After WBReboot1.0c has been run, simply press ALT-CTRL-DEL to reboot your Amiga.

\*\* WARNING \*\* Wait until ALL disk activity has finished otherwise drives may be damaged. I am NOT responsible for loss of data/damage to hardware caused by the use of this program.
