Well firstly I want to thank you for looking at this pack as it's my first attempt at supplying the Amiga community with any form of software at all, so please forgive me if things seem a bit simple. ↔

Back in the olden days a program called 'Arq' was given to the Amiga world that provided us something we hadn't seen before, animated requester things. "That's nice", I thought "But I want to make my own animations for it". I waited and waited.... Then waited a bit more. As my Amiga grew older, got kitted out with new clothes and began to look more tarty, this wonderful program started to look a bit out dated. So eventually off it went. Then there was 'MRQ', that looked nicer but just kept on crashing my system so I just got rid of that one. ↔

Enter ReqAttack.... Now that's more like it.

This, as you may have gathered by the REALLY brief Brief

page (Yes twice), this is  
a collection of Buttons and Anims for ReqAttack v1.80+. You will need v1.80+ due ←  
to the  
"Child" feature (It'll make sense if you use it).

Over the months I have gathered up tons (In bytes) of Glow icons and many ←  
other forms  
of Glow type images and a few weeks ago decided, since I hadn't seen any "Glows" ←  
for the  
ReqAttack package, to get a set of Anims on the go.

Then, only a few days after decided to do this, a set of "MI" Anims arrived on ←  
the AmiNet.  
Typical I thought, so I downloaded the archive to have a look and to my surprise ←  
it wasn't  
as adventurous as I first presumed it would -or could- be. There was just a few ←  
Anims that  
couldn't possibly cover the many requesters that are thrown our way in every day ( ←  
And not  
so everyay) use, and I hate having 'part' one thing an 'part' another. So back I ←  
went to  
continue building this pack out of the building blocks I had acquired. Ooh, while ←  
I remember,  
will you let me know if there are any spelling mistakes that slip through the net? ←  
Cheers.

Now you might be thinking, "Oh, he's just got a load of Glow icons and ←  
converted them  
info RAAAnims (ReqAttack Anims for those that don't know). Well to start with I did ←  
. But  
then things started to get a bit out of hand. Instead of simply having a 2 frame ←  
anim which  
consisted of "No glow, Glow, No Glow, Glow..." I changed them to all no Glow.... ←  
Then PART  
of the image to Glow again (The bit that seemed important to the Anim/Requester), ←  
these  
looked nice, so I kept them. This package is basically some of my 2 frame anims, ←  
now don't  
go off thinking "Boring". They look nice and my multi frame ones are on the go but ←  
they take  
ages as I work full time and work most nights too.

Finally, In this package there are 2 types of anims, with and without borders. ←  
I use the  
ones without borders but you might prefer the borders. I need you lot out there in ←  
the world  
to tell me which ones you use because when I (eventually) upload more 2 frame ←  
anims and the  
multi frame anims the archive will get bigger and I would like to drop the ←  
bordered anims  
but that's up to you.

- ReqAttackPrefs v1.80+ to use/edit/configure the prefs file

- RAAnimbrush.datatype and RABrush.datatype to view the images without using ReqAttack ↔
- Directory Opus 5.5+ to use the file type (<http://www.gpsoft.com.au>)
- 'r' in your path to use the file type (<http://uk.aminet.net/pub/aminet/util/cli/r.lha>) ↔

- Copy the following files and directories from the FuzzyGlowAttack directory into your "ReqAttack" directory (Not the actual "FuzzyGlowAttack" directory). ↔



- GlowAttack.guide
- ReadMe.txt
- GlowAttack (dir)
- GlowAttackExtras (dir)

Now close this guide and load the one you have just copied into "ReqAttack" and head onto the "usage" page. (Really, it makes a difference).

Now you've followed the instalation procedure and loaded this guide from the "ReqAttack" directory (You have done that haven't you?) you can use the images.

In the "GlowAttack" directory there are 2 styles of anims available, they are Bordered and Non Bordered

The following buttons on this page copy the files into the right place so you can use them if, like me, you'd prefer to do it manually don't click.

- Now decide if you want [Big](#) or [Small](#) (Big buttons are shown in the examples above)

If you want to configure Reqttack yourself you may skip the next part

- You can now backup YOUR prefs file just in case you don't like mine by clicking [Here](#) (It will be copied to the "GlowAttackExtras" directory)
- Now copy my prefs to `ENVARC:` and if you don't want to have to reboot `ENV:`
- \* You might still have to reboot if you have caches turned on in ReqAttack \*
