### 1.3 ScreenModes and MWB Colors Standards

ClickMeFirst ClickForColors8 ClickForColors16 ClickForScreen

ClickMeFirst is a script which will lock your first 16 colors to the MWB16 standard palette. It requires MagicWB-Demon which is available by registering MWB2.0 © Martin Huttenloher. The line contained in this script should be added to your startup-sequence and looks like the following:

There are lots of alternatives to using MagicWB-Demon. One which comes to mind is a new util called Colorado - it is available on aminet (and mirrors).

ClickForColors8 and ClickForColors16 are for MWB8 and MWB16, respectively. Click on which ever you wish (ie. Icons drawn specifically for MWB16 will not look good under MWB8).

ClickForScreen will simply open your ScreenPrefs. Slide the colors slider to match the number of colors you chose - either 8 or 16.

## 1.6 Images

Images

This drawer contains 142 two-frame animbrushes for use as toolbar images (or button bank images). Two miscellaneous animbrushes are also included: DOpus.7wide and Windows.anmb ;-)

This drawer also contains an Icons Drawer which has all of the above animbrushes saved in dual-frame icon format.

NOTE: · The icons are smaller in size, but will not remap (which speeds things up and uses less RAM). · If you do want remapping, you must use the (anim)brushes. · You can add ".noremap" to the end of an (anim)brush's filename to disable remapping. · The ToolBarArrow.image is a replacement for the cycle gadget in the Lister-ToolBar (the name must remain as is in order for it to work!). · RemoveSizes is no longer a required DOpus5 command, therefore the icon (and animbrush) is only left here in case you can find a better use for it ;-)

## 1.7 Installation

### Installation

All you need to do is copy this stuff where you want it. One recommendation, however would be to rename the images drawer in DOpus5: to something else and then copy the included **Images drawers** into DOpus5: (since this is where DOpus looks for icons by default).

If the brushes and pictures are not compliant with your palette then you will want to use the included goodies in the **Colors (dir)** .

You may wish to use some of the icons in the **DOpusIcons (dir)** to replace the original Directory Opus 5 icons. And the DOpus5:Icons drawer is probably a good place for the icons in the **FileTypeIcons (dir)** .
