Introduction

Application Dock is a toolbar that sits along the right side of your screen to provide quick access to many of your programs. The toolbar stays visible all of the time, and simply clicking on it once brings it to the top, where you can double-click on an icon to bring up the program associated with it. Application Dock was not designed to be a replacement for a shell like Program Manager, but rather to supplement it. Although it certainly could be used for this purpose with no problems what so ever.

Written in Visual Basic, this program was inspired by a much simpler version by John Morley. The major limitation with his program was that it required Visual Basic to recompile the program every time any menu item was changed. My version of the program adds an INI file to store the names of all the programs and icons. In case you don't recognize the resemblance, this program was also inspired by the Application Dock used on the NeXT computer.

How To Use Application Dock

Application Dock comes in two ZIP files. The first contains the program, documentation, and icon files, while the second ZIP contains only the VBRUN100.DLL Visual Basic runtime module. To install Application Dock on your computer, simply put all of the files into a directory of your choosing. If you downloaded only the first ZIP file, then you will need a copy of VBRUN100.DLL in your Windows directory to run this program. If you downloaded both ZIP files, then unzip the second file into your Windows directory.

To run one of the programs, simply double click on its icon. If you double click on the Windows icon at the top of the bar you will bring up an information dialog box. Here you will have the option of continuing, or exiting Application Dock, along with two other buttons. The first button, disaabled in the shreware version, updates the icon dock instantly. The second brings up the APPDOCK.INI file in the editor specified in the APPDOCK.INI file. As shipped in the shareware version, the default is that notepad be brought up. Another benefit of the registered version is that you also receive an interactive editor just for the APPDOCK.INI file that includes browsers for both programs and icons.

Customizing Application Dock

The APPDOCK.INI file contains all of the settings that Application Dock uses when it starts up. You can edit this file with notepad or any other text editor to change any of the settings. With the registered version you can also use the special editor for the APPDOCK.INI Here are the items in the INI file, their valid settings, and their explanations.

The first number represents the horizontal position on the screen. You may need to change this depending on what your video configuration is. The default setting is appropriate to put the dock in the upper right hand corner of the screen. The suggested setting for an 800x600 display is also shown in the INI file.

The next setting is the height of the screen. With the shareware version this is not very important, as the icon dock has only 6 icons available, but this will allow the program to calculate the maximum number of icons that can be displayed on the screen. Again, the default value is appropriate for a VGA (640x480) display.

Next is the editor to run from the About dialog box. The default is notepad.exe, and when run, the program will also triy to pass on the path of the APPDOCK.INI file as well.

Finally comes the program settings section. This contains all of the information for programs in the application dock. The first number is merely an index to make sure there are enough items in the list for the program. Do not change this. Next comes the name of the program file. (no path) After the program in the startup path for the program. This is not required, so if you can run this program from any directory, then you can leave this file blank. The next field shows the name and path of the icon for that position in the dock. If not path is specified before the name of the icon (as is the default), then the program looks in the current directory for the icon file. If it cannot find it, it then displays an invalid file/path dialog and exits the program. If you do not want any icon displayed, then simply leave the field blank. Lastly comes the startup mode specified by a number, the various legal values displayed below:

- 1 start the program in a normal window in the foreground
- 2 start the program minimized in the foreground
- 3 start the program maximized and in the foreground
- 4 start the program in a normal window, but in the background
- 7 load the program as an icon in the background

Future Enhancements

I am currently working on the next version of Application Dock as you read this, and here are some of the features I plan to add in the future. Some of these features depend on how many registrations I receive. For example, to add help/documentation via the Windows Help System, I will need to buy a copy of the Windows Help Compiler from Microsoft. Don't see something you would like in the program? Send me a suggestion and I will try and put it in.

Support for multiple INI files.

The ability to get icons directly from application files.

An optional 2 column Application Dock.

Auto detection of Video Mode and resolution to eliminate need for location settings in APPDOCK.INI.

An optional prompt for a data file before running a program.

MUCH Better Keyboard support.

On Line Help/Documentation via Windows Help

The Registered Version of Application Dock

Application Dock is a Shareware program. This means that it is not free. You are allowed a reasonable period to evaluate Application Dock to see if it meets your needs. If you continue to use the program after this evaluation period, you are expected to register.

Registration offers a number of benefits. First, and foremost, it allows me to continue to support the program with additions, corrections, and enhancements. Without revenue from registration, the program cannot evolve or become more useful. If you would like to see the program grow, your support in the form of registration will help.

The registered version of Application Dock (v1.5 or later) you will receive adds many features to the shareware version. You can have up to 16 icons on the screen with 800×600 , or up to 12 icons in VGA mode. You also get rid of the annoying dialog box that pops up when you run the program. Additionally you get the APPDOCK.INI interactive editor and the automatic update feature for the dock.

Along with the registered version of the program on disk you also get a printed manual and notification of future updates. All of this is along with my eternal gratitude and a chance to contribute to the starving student fund.
