EasyGuide

1.1 EasyGuide Documentation

EasyGuide v1.0

EasyGuide is a utility for developers to make AmigaGuide development easier. You can create word-wrapped guide files in text editors or nice looking headings. The source code is included so you may modify the styles of the headings or create your own macros. 1.2 Usage

Using EasyGuide Introduction EasyGuide allows you to add new "@" commands in your guide file. They are not really AmigaGuide commands as you need to compile your original file with EasyGuide to create the final Guide file. EasyGuide strips out these new commands, and modifying the final output file with whatever the commands were designed for. To use EasyGuide you simply perform: easyguide myfile.src myfile.guide which would take the myfile.src and compile it into an AmigaGuide file. EasyGuide Macros Word Wrapping While AmigaGuide v40 has improved things significantly, most users do not have access to this version. Therefore word wrapping in documents was left to the "@WORDWRAP" macro that required a paragraph to be one single line. This makes editing in text editors without wordwrap rather dificult, especially if a paragraph has links within it making margin calculations dificult. What EasyGuide does is create two commands, "@BEGINWRAP" and "@ENDWRAP" (sans the quotes). Placing "@BEGINWRAP" will cause all lines following to be joined together into a single line. "@ENDWRAP" will stop this effect. To form a paragraph separation between a "@BEGINWRAP" and an "@ENDWRAP", press return twice. EasyGuide will prompt you if you have a "@BEGINWRAP" without an "@ENDWRAP" (or vise-versa). Note though that a requirement for this working is to have the "@WORDWRAP" command at the top of your guide file. Headings While AmigaGuide offers macro capabilities it involved too much typing :) To make life easier, you just use one of the three provided headings listed (and shown) below. To use a heading place the command on the first line (EG: "@HEADING") then on the second line, place the string you wish to be emphasized. For example (sans the quotes): "@MYHEADINGMACRO" This is the heading text Macro Headings

"@HEADING", which looks like:

This is a heading

"@SUBHEADING", which looks like:

This is a subheading

and "@SUBITEM", which looks like:

This is a subitem

The styles may be modified in the source, easyguide.c. Also, new macros may be easily created.

1.3 Source

How to modify the source code

The source code contains one routine, main(), and a global macro definition at the top of the file. There are comments scattered all over the file that make it relatively painless. When you are finished, simply compile the code. A makefile is provided for SAS users. If you add a macro, do not forget to increase the NUMMACROS define. The macro structure has a few important fields: struct usrMacro{ char identify[MAXSIZE]; char beginstring[MAXSIZE]; char endstring[MAXSIZE]; char underline[2]; char extra: } identify is the name of the macro. beginstring is the string of amigaguide commands that preceed the header. endstring is the string of amigaguide commands that follow the header. underline is the character to underline headers with. A null string signifies no underlining. extra is a number only used if underlining is to be done. The underlining will only know the length of the header string, if you have added spaces or characters in the beginstring then place the number of these in here. Otherwise, use 0.

The file eg_dog.src is the EasyGuide source file for this guide file. You may view it without compilation but no special macros will be expanced. Run the buildguide script to compile the document into easyrexx.guide (this document).
