1.2 Introduction

Introduction

RECENT is a mouse driven graphic interface for parsing AmiNet RECENT files. Interactivly select files to "get" from AmiNet. The result is a unix-able script to "cd" around AmiNet and "mget" the files as well as its .readme file.

The reason for getting the .readme files; The SHORT description in the AmiNet RECENT file is truncated to 40 characters, and it seems most uploaders use longer SHORT descriptions.

If you have and use the AmiNote program (written by me) it will look for the existence of the .readme file and pull the untruncated SHORT description from it. Then add it to the archive file as an AmigaDOS "filenote". Then optionaly Copy or Move the files to a bbs file directory or AmiNet Mirror.

RECENT is written in ARexx, then crunched using The ReXXmAsHeR v0.4g.

1.3 Install / Setup

Install / Setup

- 1. Copy RECENT wherever you want.
- 2. Copy the library file included in this archive libs/ directory to your LIBS: assigned directory.

libs/apig.library (v3.3 included in archive)

2a. You must also have the following libraries in your LIBS: assigned
directory;

asl.library (supplied with WB2+) rexxsyslib.library (supplied with WB2+) rexxsupport.library (supplied with WB2+)

You must have RexxMast already running before you run RECENT. You can either drop RexxMast in your WBStartup drawer, or add it to your user-startup.

RECENT requires Amiga OS 2.0+.

It has been tested and found to work on my Amiga 2000 with OS 2.05 and 3.1.

1.4 Program Use

RECENT is started from a CLI or Shell. There are no command line $\,\leftrightarrow\,$ args.

Or by double-clicking the "Run_RECENT" icon.

1.6 About

Displays program completion date, author name address and email phone number.

The keyboard shortcut is Right-Amiga-A.

1.7 Quit

Close any open files and exit program.

The keyboard shortcut is Right-Amiga-Q. (or click the Close gadget)

1.8 .readme toggle

If you want to get the .readme files turn this menu option ON, indicated by a check mark next to it.

If you do not want to get the .readme files turn this menu option OFF.

You can turn this option on or off at any time, even in the middle of processing a RECENT file.

The keyboard shortcut is Right-Amiga-R.

1.9 Save Preferences

Selecting this menu option will save the current settings, including user interface options AmiNet RECENT path/filename, output file path and base-name, and .readme menu toggle state. And the RECENT program window position on your Workbench screen.

These will be saved to files named "ENV:DFD/RECENT.prefs" and "ENVARC:DFD/RECENT.prefs".

The keyboard shortcut is Right-Amiga-S.

1.11 RECENT File

This is the path and filename of your AmiNet RECENT file. Click the gadget and a requester will pop up to choose the RECENT path and filename.

The default is <current dir>RECENT

1.12 OUTPUT File

This is the path and base filename of the script file RECENT will generate. The "base" filename will be appended with an underscore and todays date. If your basename is "DHO:Work/Myfile" then the OUTPUT file will be "DHO:Work/Myfile_18May" (or whatever -todays- date is).

The default is RAM: AmiNet_<date>

1.13 Information

Pops up a requester displaying how many files you have chosen and how many aproximate Kilobytes they add up to.

1.14 Yes - I want this file.

Clicking the "Yes" gadget tells RECENT that you want to "get" the file that is currently displayed on the top line.

1.15 No - I don't want this file.

Clicking the "No" gadget tells RECENT that you do not want to " \hookleftarrow get" the file that is currently displayed on the top line.

1.16 Do It!

When you click this gadget RECENT will go into action and start processing the AmiNet RECENT file.

While processing this gadget reads "Abort". Clicking this gadget will close all open files and stop. You can do a "Quick Abort" by clicking the window Close gadget.

1.17 < Go back 1

Clicking this gadget will take you back one file listing. This only works on listings you said "No" to.

1.18 RECENT History

v1.3 - 15-Dec-95

Cleaned up the code some more. (a byte saved is a byte earned) Now lets you know if it can't save the preference file(s). Tried to address a problem that the "one person" I know of that uses this program reported; he said it choked on a "OK" file entry. I tried and tried to get it to "not work" for me, but couldn't... so didn't change anything.

The biggest reason I am releasing this version is because v1.2 never made it to AmiNet - as MOST my uploads don't! I think they must have a realy big "bit bucket" they send most uploads to

Updated the install script to check if your apig.library is older than the one supplied in this archive - if so, then copy the new one to your LIBS: directory.

v1.2 - 03-Aug-95

Fixed a bug that would exit program if you clicked "Yes" on a blank line.

Fixed file requesters so they remember their paths. I thought they were before, but I guess not.

Cleaned up the code a little more for size and speed.

Added gadget to "Go back 1" file listing.

Added "Info" gadget and requester.

Added get ".readme" menu toggle.

Added "Continue" when re-loading a previously Aborted RECENT file. Now will "Append" to output file if it already exists instead of overwriting it.

Changed preferences files from "ENV:" to "ENV:DFD/" and now also to "ENVARC:DFD/". ALL my programs now save to these DFD paths.

v1.1 - 18-May-95

Cleaned up some of the code to make it smaller and faster. Crunched it with The ${\tt ReXXmAsHeR}$.

v1.0 - 25-Apr-95

RECENT 6/6

First public release. Actually only a few friends got this one. It was compiled with RexxPlus and was so BLOATED it was embarassing. I didn't want to distribute it that way. Added GUI. (I wrote a shell based version several years ago but never released it publicly.)
