## 1.3 SLIPCall Users Guide

Introduction

-----

This manual is a description of SLIPCall, a dialer for AmiTCP.

To use SLIPCall you will need an installed AmiTCP version 3.0b or later.

SLIPCall requires Holger Kruse's ppp.device version 1.30 or later to be able to make a PPP connection. (Can be found on Aminet)

SLIPCall requires Workbench 2.0 or higher to run. It uses many 2.04 features and has been designed to be as user-friendly possible.

SLIPCall requires 'bgui.library' version 40.3 or higher to run. This library is (C) Jan van den Baard and is included in the distribution archive.

## 1.5 SLIPCall Users Guide

### Installation

-----

Use the appropriate installation icon in the 'Install' drawer. Installation uses Commodore's installer utility and should be a doddle.

If you will be running PPP, you must install Holger Kruse's ppp.device version 1.30 or later. You don't have to follow his instructions though, just copy the ppp.device to DEVS:Networks/ppp.device. SLIPCall handles the rest.

SLIPCall normally requires 'PROGDIR:config' directory to save it's configuration files in. If this directory doesn't exist, SLIPCall is unable to read and save it's default configuration file.

If you wish SLIPCall to use another configuration file than it's default, you can use the 'CONFIG' command line switch (from the Shell) or the 'CONFIG' tooltype from the Workbench.

When you start SLIPCall for the first time you should set your preferences before using it further.

## 1.6 SLIPCall Users Guide

Usage

From Workbench:

Just click the icon twice, as usual.

From Shell:

Just enter SLIPCall and press enter.

There's some command line arguments/ToolTypes you can set, though:

CX\_PRIORITY (-127 - 128, default is 0)

Commodity priority

CX\_POPUP (YES or NO, default is YES)

Open window at startup?

CX\_POPKEY (any keycombination, default is ctrl alt s)

Commodity hotkey

ACTION (DIAL, RESUME, POLL, CHECK or NONE, default is NONE)

What do you want me to do right after startup?

DIAL will try to establish a connection, and wait for you to hangup.

RESUME will try to resume a lost connection

POLL will try to establish a connection, execute your mail commands, hangup and quit.

CHECK will just try to open your serial device, close it and quit. For script usage. When using this option, the mainwindow

---



will not open, and the requesters are disabled. The information is written to the logfile though.

WINDOW (YES or NO, default is NO)

Opens a simple window, showing modem output.

REQUESTER (YES or NO, default is YES)

If set to NO, the message requesters won't show up.

CONFIG (Any filename, default is PROGDIR:config/SLIPCall.config)

Use custom settings file.

TERMLOG (Any filename, default is none)

Output file all data read by the modem. Will be saved even if the terminal window isn't open.

Your IP address if you have a static account. Set to 0.0.0.0 if you have a dynamic account. (0.0.0.0)

MTU:

Max Transfer Unit. Ask your provider what this should be set to.  
1500 mostly is a good value. (1500)

Protocol:

The protocol you want to use. SLIP, CSLIP or PPP. (CSLIP)

SLIPCall features a nice ARexx interface, letting you use it in complex scripts, or similar.

When executing an ARexx command, the REQUESTER keyword is always set to NO until command returns.

The portname always is 'RXSLIP.1'.

The ARexx commands SLIPCall understands are following:

#### DIAL

Act as you clicked the Dial button.

Returns 0 if successful, 5 if already connected and 10 if the dialup fails for any reason.

#### RESUME

Act as you clicked the Resume button.

Returns 0 if successful, 5 if already connected and 10 if the resume fails for any reason.

#### HANGUP

Act as you clicked the Hang up button.

Always returns 0.

#### POPUP

Opens the hidden window. Acts as you pressed the commodity hotkey.

Always returns 0.

#### HIDE

Hides the window. Acts as you clicked the Hide button.

Returns 0 if successful and 10 if the settings window is open.

#### QUIT FORCE/S

Quit SLIPCall. If you're connected, a requester will pop up and ask you to confirm, unless you specified the FORCE switch.

Returns 0 if successful and 10 if the user canceled when confirming.

#### LOAD CONFIG/K/A

Loads a settings file. The CONFIG keyword is required, and you must specify the absolute path to the file.

Ex: LOAD CONFIG PROGDIR:config/SLIPCall.config

Returns 0 if successful, and 5 if connected.

---

## CHECK

Tries to open the serial device. If successful, the device is immediately closed again. The result is saved to the logfile.

Returns 0 if successful, 20 otherwise.

### Troubleshooting

-----

\* I'm having problem with the modem initializing or dialing.  
Nothing happens!

- 1) Do you have a carriage return (\r (backslash & r)) after the init string, and in the Dial suffix string?
- 2) Do you have the ATD command in your Dial prefix string?

\* My modem disconnects just before AmiTCP is started.

Do you have the DTR check on the modem disabled? (AT&D0)  
If not, do it in your modem init or dial prefix.

\* SLIPCall won't login as it should, and yes, my script seems ok!

- 1) Do you have a carriage return (\r (backslash & r)) at the End of the strings you are sending in the script?
- 2) Did you check your modem init? Maybe the default AT&F0 won't work with your modem.

\* SLIPCall established a connection, but I can't contact any machine on the net.

Check your serial preferences in Workbench. You should set it to RTS/CTS, 8 databits, No parity and 1 stopbit.

\* I'm having problem when using PPP.

- 1) Do you have ppp.device in DEVS:Networks/ ?
- 2) Check the file 'AmiTCP:db/interfaces' to see if it contains the line 'ppp0 DEV=DEVS:Networks/ppp.device UNIT=0 IPTYPE=33 NOARP P2P'

\* SLIPCall doesn't hangup when it should.

- 1) Check your Hangup string. Maybe you have to add some delay between the '+++' and your hangup command.



- 2) Make sure you haven't disabled the escape sequence on the modem.  
(i.e. the +++ characters, Register S2)

If you have, you should add 'S2=43' to your initstring in SLIPCall.
