1.4 Just What IS this for??

Have you ever collected a bunch of archives, and had them stored on your Hard drive... only to forget what each one was over time??? Or seen the neat file listings on BBS's, and wish you could generate them on your own computer??

Well, that's exactly what this little program does. It searches through a list of archives, and extracts the file_id.diz information. It then places this information into an AmiExpress style BBS listing.

If you run a BBS, you may use this program, also to generate BBS listings for your system.

1.5 Program Usage

NAME

Dizaster - a utility to create file lists from FILE_ID.DIZ

SYNOPSIS

Just run from WB....

REQUIREMENTS:

AREXX running
Rexxreqtools.library

It currently looks for File_ID's in the following known archives:
LHA, LZH, LZX, DMS, EXE, ZIP, GIF, and text (txt, nfo, doc... etc)

However, it relies on third party executables to do this, and assumes that you have the following in your path somewhere:

LHA, LZX, DMSdescript, EXEdescript, Unzip, TxtExtract, and GIFdesc

In future releases, I will be adding more archive types, and removing the need for the third party ID extractors.

- Added size and date info to the lister output using the Datatypes.library.

- Minor optimizations
- Added ability to APPEND ID'd to an existing list.
No more need to rescan a whole list, just to add one file. :)

0.3 16/04/96 private release

- Removed the STUPID need for datatypes.library... Dumb idea to begin with.... now uses the LIST command output.
- Fixed broken openfile routine
- Named this thing Dizaster.... 'cuz that's what it's been this past week, trying to get it to work.
